## BFF baffles newsmen

But the fate of our successlorn footballers, who are always tipped as favourites but end up without a trophy in the regional carnivals, took an ominous turn even before taking off as the never-disciplined pugnacious Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) officials kicked up a fuss yesterday at a press conference, calling both their patriotism and commitment into question.

BFF, the ruling body of country's football, had invited the press for a briefing at its office last evening to provide the detailed picture of the team's preparation and prospect in the Kathmandu spectacle. The newsmen were there, but

surprisingly no conference was held as the German coach of the national team Otto Pfister and chef-de mission Anjan Chowdhury Pintu failed to turn up to meet the press. The only available person at the tidy BFF office was Shah Alam Chowdhury, the manager of the 24member Bangladesh squad. But the queries of the aggrieved reporters trailed off as the

firm whether he communicated with the people concerned. raising an obvious question mark over his abilities of performing at a demanding level of managing a team. Shah Alam, however, man-

bearded man failed to even con-

aged to indistinctly utter that he had duly informed the two wanted persons about the press briefing. But no proof of his statement was immediately found as none of the two could be reached after a repeated attempt through the telephone.

Shah Alam, however, pulled up his socks finally after lurking in the lurch and went on to arrange another uncertain encounter with the press at the Mirpur Stadium today following the warm-up match between the national team and BFF President Eleven, scheduled for a 2.30 pm kick-off.

Although the BFF officials treated the press in an ominous way, they appeared hyper-active to get the blessings from their bosses. The national team had a busy night on Tuesday when they attended a dinner which the State Minister for Youth and Sports, Obaidul Quader, also attended.

Besides, the team also met the BFF president Mayor Mohammed Hanif at his office yesterday, skipping the afternoon practice session.

## Celtic click at the end



LONDON, Aug 27: Craig Burley and Morten Wieghorst scored two goals in the last three minutes as Celtic

scrambled into the first round of the UEFA Cup Tuesday after a see-sawing 6-3 victory over Tirol Innsbruck, reports AP.

Trailing 2-1 from the away leg in a second round qualifying match, the Scottish team twice drew level only for the Austrians to pull away again.

Simon Donnelly's penalty followed by Burley's first of the night gave Celtic a 4-2 lead on the night and an overall advantage of one. Then substitute Gurnot Krinner added a third for Tirol eight minutes from the end which would have put his team through on away goals.

With some 47,000 Celtic fans yelling their team on for a last effort, Burley scored again two minutes from the end and Wieghort clinched it in the final seconds.

Having made the last 16 of the Champions' Cup for the last two seasons, Grasshoppers of Zurich only just qualified for the first round of the less prestigious UEFA Cup after a 2-0 loss at Brann Bergen.

Brann's Stefan Paldan scored twice in the 41st and the 44th minute and the Norwegians launched wave after wave of attacks in the second period of a qualifying game.

But the Swiss had the cushion of a 3-0 first leg lead and held on reach Friday's first round draw which also includes seeded clubs such as England's Arsenal and Liverpool and Italy's Inter Milan.

Another Swiss club, Neuchatel Xamax, also took a 3-0 lead on the road and made it to the first round despite losing 2-1 at Norway's Viking Stavanger. First half goals by Per

Batistuta left out in the cold

BUENOS AIRES, Aug 27: Argentina's Gabriel Batistuta, who is almost universally regarded as his country's top goalscorer, has once again been left out of the national team, reports

Reuter. Batistuta, who last played for his country in January against Uruguay, was excluded from the squad named by coach Daniel Passarella on Tuesday for next month's World Cup

qualifier away to Chile. His successive exclusions have caused consternation in Argentina. Batistuta holds the record for the number of goals scored for his country, having last year overtaken Diego Maradona's previous best of 33

goals. Passarella has insisted that Batistuta is not compatible with fellow striker Hernan Crespo but many believe personal differences, similar to the ones which have kept midfielder Fernando Redondo out of the team, are to blame.

Argentina lead the South American qualifying group and will qualify if they beat Chile in Santiago on September 10. Chile, however, have a 100 per cent home record in the competition.

Belgium's Anderlecht into the first round with a 2-0 victory at Ukraine's Vorskla Poltava for a 4-0 overall triumph in the second qualifying round.

Zetterburg drove a 30th minute free kick round a defensive wall and Scifo, one of Belgium's top stars for the past 13 years, forced the ball home in a goalmouth scramble three minutes before half time. The two shutout victories

mean that Anderlecht, UEFA Cup titlist in 1983 and a twotime Cup Winners' Cup champion, also joins up with the bigger clubs. Belgium's Club Brugge, al-

ready armed with a 5-3 lead from the away leg, made it 8-3 overall by beating Slovenia's Gorica 3-0 at home.

Two Russian teams, Rotor Volgograd and Alania Vladikavkaz, each scored four goals away from home to advance to the first round.

Rotor, already 2-0 ahead from the home leg, won 4-3 at Poland's Odra Wodzislaw with two strikes by Oleg Vierietiennikov while Alania gained a 4-1 victory at Dnipro Dnipropetrovsk of Ukraine for a 6-2 aggregate triumph.

Croatia's Hajduk Split, a team likely to cause problems to the bigger clubs in the competition, won 2-0 at Sweden's Malmoe to complete a 5-2 overall triumph.

Denmark's Aarhus edged Hungary's Upjest TE 3-2 after a scoreless first leg in Budapest and Rapid Vienna, virtually sure of qualifying after winning the home leg 6-1, weren't bothered by a 2-0 loss at Boby Brno of the Czech Republic.

NEW DELHI, Aug 27: Beleaguered Indian cricket captain Sachin Tendulkar retained his job today and was asked to lead the team against Pakistan for a five-match one-day series in Canada, reports AFP.

Jayant Lele, acting chief of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), said Tendulkar has also been invited to attend the board's meeting to be held in Mumbai "to present his views in the selection of the team."

In July, Tendulkar had complained of being stuck with "Bgrade" players, after the Indian selectors dropped left-handed batsman Vinod Kambli and wicketkeeper Nayan Mongia.

Tendulkar, one of the leading batsmen in the world, became captain of the side in August last year but his leadership was discussed by the selectors before the Sri Lanka tour after a series of defeats.

Tendulkar is still looking for his first series win abroad after a year as captain, under his captaincy, India lost oneday series in West Indies and a triangular contest in South Africa.

His woes continued when Indians were ruthlessly beaten by Sri Lanka in the one-day series concluded last week. Sri Lanka, who won the four-nation Asia Cup, also created batting records in the drawn two-Test

#### Srinath out of Sahara Cup?

MUMBAI, Aug 27: Pace spearhead Javagal Srinath has not yet submitted a fitness certificate to the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) which has effectively ruled him out of contention for a berth in the national squad for the series of one-day internationals against Pakistan next month, reports PTI.

India are to take on their arch-foes in the five-match Sahara Cup at Toronto (September 13. 14. 17. 20 and 21) before flying off to Pakistan to engage the home team in the threematch golden jubilee independence series (September 28, 30 and October 2.1

BCCI acting secretary Jaywant Lele said here today that Srinath had informed him that he has started training and would play a match on September 6 and 7 in Bangalore.

"But he has not given a fitness certificate and in its absence I can't see how he can be included in the team (on August 29 in Mumbai)," Lele said.

Srinath has been out of action for over six months since returning home without playing a match in the West Indies because of a rotator cuff tear in his right shoulder which had to be operated upon by a surgeon in South Africa.

#### Wake-up calls for Wright

LONDON, Aug 27: Arsenal's lan Wright's is being urged to turn up the volume of his favourité dance records in a bid to help him rediscover his goalscoring rhythm and finally break the club's goalscoring record, reports AFP.

The controversial England striker, who normally thrives under pressure, admits that all the hype is getting to him.

"Every time I step out of my house I get people coming up to me and asking me about the record," he says. "I just want to get it done and out of the way." Wright looked off form in

#### France makes history

PARIS, Aug 27: France became the first country in soccer history to have 10 teams taking part in European Cup competition when Lyon, Auxerre and Bastia qualified for the UEFA Cup first round via the Intertoto Cup on Tuesday, reports Reuter.

Lyon ousted compatriots Montpellier 4-2 on aggregate while Auxerre overcame Germany's Duisburg 2-0 and Bastia had to play extra time to beat Swede's Halmstadt

Nine out of the French First Division's 18 team, plus demoted nice who won the French Cup last season, will take part in the three European competitions this season.

The pervious record was held by England and Italy with eight

Auxerre, who had a goalless draw at Duisburg two weeks ago. went ahead one minute before the hour when striker Bernard Diomede netted a tremendous free kick. The 1996 French champions

put the issue beyond doubt when Cyrille Jeunechamps scored with seven minutes to go. Lyon's opponents Montpellier finished with nine men af-


