Jayasuriya, 27, who is in line for Sri Lanka's cricket captaincy after current captain Arjuna Ranatunga retires, will visit the pilgrimage centres of Tirupati and Tiruvannamalai, said K Ravi, a friend who will accompany Jayasuriya during the pilgrimage.

"He is a very religious man and visits Hindu temples and Buddhist monasteries," Ravi

A Hindu shrine in Tirupati in Andhra Pradesh state draws millions of devotees every year. The devout believe that praying to Lord Venkateswara there will grant them their wishes.

Jayasuriya is a Buddhist, the majority religion in Sri Lanka and the Tirupati temple that allows non-Hindus inside.

The other temple-town that Jayasuriya will visit is Tiruvannamalai in Tamil Nadu state. The town has 100 temples and houses. It is believed to be the retreat of a saint who urged people to find happiness by looking within themselves through constant introspec-

Dutchboy defends IBF belt

BANGKOK, Aug 30: Ratanaphon Dutchboy Gym defended his International Boxing Federation mini-flyweight title Saturday with a devastating second-round technical knockout of Brazilian challenger Wellington Vicente, reports AP.

The Thai power puncher, 22, sent Vicente reeling into the ropes with a punishing left body shot, then delivered some 20 unanswered blows to Vicente's head before the fight was stopped five seconds before the

The victory brought Ratanaphon's professional record to 34 wins with 24 by knockout, one draw and two losses. Vicente, 21, who had been ranked seventh in the classification by the IBF, now has a record of 11 wins, five by knockout, and two losses.

Thai boxing matches are normally held outdoors, but the fight was moved to a gymnasium in the northeastern town of Nong Khai due to heavy seasonal rains.
