Diana killed in car crash

were informed of their mother's death by their father, Prince Charles, at Balmoral Castle, Scotland, where the royal family traditionally spend their summer holidays.

Bernadette Chirac, the wife of President Jacques Chirac, as well as Prime Minister Lionel Jospin both visited the hospital this morning.

President Clinton expressed sorrow, saying he and his wife. Hillary, "knew Princess Diana and we were very fond of her" In a statement from Martha's Vineyard, Massachusetts, where he's vacationing, Clinton said that his thoughts were with Diana's family, friends and especially her children.

The crash happened shortly after midnight, after Diana and Fayed had dined at the Ritz Hotel - owned by Fayed's family - and were on their way to a private villa in western Paris, also owned by Fayed, French radio said.

As Diana and Fayed's black Mercedes entered the tunnel along the Seine River, they reportedly were trailed by at least seven paparazzi on motorcycles in a high-speed pursuit of pho-

France's interior minister, Jean-Pierre Chevenement, said Diana's car was traveling at high speed through the tunnel. and the driver lost control. He didn't specify the speed, but a source close to the investigation, speaking on condition of anonymity, said it was well over 100 kilometers per hour. The

speed limit was 50 kph. The source added that the two were not believed to be wearing seatbelts.

It said the car crashed into a concrete post in the centre divider, then bounced into the right wall. The impact decimated the car, turning it into a heap of crumpled metal and broken glass.

Chevenement said seven photographers were in custody, and a criminal investigation was under way. France Info radio said at least some of the photographers took pictures before help arrived — and that one of the photographers was beaten at the scene by horrified witnesses.

NORTHOLT, (England), Aug 31: The plane carrying the body of Diana landed at Northolt military airport west of London today from France. The plane took off from Villacoubaly military airport southwest of Paris, carrying the coffin draped in the royal standard Prince Charles and her sisters Lady Sarah and Lady Jane accompanied the corpse during the short flight.

Police also impounded two motorcycles and a scooter. Fayed, the 42-year-old son of

the billionaire Egyptian owner of London's prestigious Harrod's department store, died immediately. Also killed was the chauffeur - a security agent at the Ritz Hotel, owned by Fayed's father, Mohammed Ali Fayed. Al Faously injured in the crash.

Newspapers reported Diana first met Fayed almost 10 years ago when he and Prince Charles played polo on opposing teams Films he has produced or coproduced include the 1981 Oscar-winning "Chariots of Fire." "The World According to Garp, "F/X" and "Hook.

On Aug 21, Princess Diana and Dodi Fayed flew to the French Mediterranean resort of St Tropez for their third holiday together in five weeks.

Reportedly a multi-millionaire, Fayed had homes in London, New York, Los Angeles and Switzerland as well as a garage full of luxury cars. His 1994 marriage lasted just eight

Mohamed Al Faved was a friend of Princess Diana's fa-

ther, the late Lord Spencer. In the first week of August, British newspapers speculated that Dodi and Diana were in love. On Aug 10 a tabloid newspaper published blurred pictures of the couple kissing.

Diana and Prince Charles, heir to the British throne, separated in 1992 after 11 years of marriage and divorced last year Last week, Diana told the French newspaper Le Monde that she would have left Britain if it wasn't for her children.

"Any sane person would have left long ago. But I cannot. I have my sons," Diana said in the interview.
