Truck Drivers and Workers Federation

Indian fabrics worth Tk 8 lakh seized, 2 held

Two people were arrested along with Indian fabrics worth about Tk 8 lakh from Mirpur road in Dhanmondi thana on Saturday, reports UNB.

Acting on a tip-off, DB police intercepted a truck on the road after following it from Gabtali bus terminal and arrested its driver Abul Hasan (45) and his helper Mohammed Ali Hossain (18) along with Indian sarees and garments materials.

They confessed to the police that they were carrying the goods from Benapole border for some shops of Dhaka New Market and Gausia Market.

Fire in 3 garments factories

Govt urged to take measures to check such incidents

Awami League acting President Abdus Samad Azad has condoled the death of five garments workers in a fire at Mohakhali on Saturday, reports UNB.

In a statement yesterday, the Foreign Minister prayed for salvation of the departed souls and early recovery of the injured.

Convenor of Bangladesh Samajtantrik Dal Khalequzzaman in a separate statement expressed shock at the death of the garments workers.

Accusing the owners of the recurring incidents of fire, he said the government has kept its responsibility limited within providing compensation to the victims instead of taking punitive action against the owners.

"This type of tragic deaths in garment factories can be compared with killings," Khalequzzaman said demanding action against the owners responsible for it.

BSD will organise a rally in front of Jatiya Press Club today at 5 pm and bring out a procession to protest against frequent fire incidents in garment factories.

In a separate statement, president of Samajtantrik Sramik Front Abdullah Sarker and general secretary Abdur Razzak expressed concern and profound shock at, what they said, the "killings" of the garments workers.

Criticising the government for its failure to take measures to check such frequent incidents, they said the garments owners were not taking steps to avert such happenings due to the government's "lenient attitude" towards them.

Meanwhile, Jatiya Sramik Federation at a meeting yesterday expressed grave concern at the unnatural death of the five workers.

Chaired by federation president Abul Bashar, the meeting said some 42 innocent garments workers were killed in the last few days in separate fire incidents at different garments factories in the city.

All those deaths were untimely and unnatural, the meeting said and urged the government to take effective measures to check such incidents.

Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK) has called upon the authorities concerned to take steps to check recurrence of fire incidents in garments factories.

Referring to the deaths of the garments workers, an ASK press release said fire-related accidents occur as the owners fail to establish factories as per required rules.

Schoolgirl killing

Nari Samaj expresses concern

DSE orientation course held

WP calls for building up movement against govt

Workers Party has called for building up vigorous movement against the Awami League government to protest its failure in all fronts, reports UNB.

The call was made at a three-day meeting of the party's central committee, that concluded in the city on Saturday, said a press release.

It said the government is completely dependent on the policies of World Bank-IMF, civil and military bureaucracy and NGOs.

The government has also miserably failed to restore law and order and ensure security of life and property of the common people. It is yet to repeal the Special Powers Act, Vested Property Act and other discriminatory laws, the WP pointed out.

The meeting said the government with its fascist behaviour has been curbing the freedom of expression of the opponents and compromising with the communal forces.

It said Bangladesh has become the dumping ground and market of foreign goods in last 15 months as the Awami League government has been implementing the instructions of World Bank and IMF.

It strongly criticised the government's privatisation, liberalisation and deregulation policies regarding the state-owned enterprises. As the government expedited these policies, Bangladesh became the open market of Indian goods, it said.

Referring to the local government issue, the WP meeting said the village council bill passed by the parliament is totally contrary to democratic ideas.

WP general secretary Rashed Khan Menon presented a report at the meeting, which was chaired by party president Amal Sen.
