



Kenya, set 275 to win after New Zealand declared their second innings at 244 for 4, scored 207 for 5 when the declaration was made.


Miura mauls Uzbekistan

TOKYO, Sept 7: Kazuyoshi Miura of Japan scored four goals in his side's 6-3 victory over Uzbekistan today in the Asian Group B qualifying match for the 1998 World Cup. reports AFP.

Norway the ninth nation



LONDON, Sept 7: Norway became the ninth nation to book their place in next

year's World Cup finals and the Netherlands all but joined them when they both important qualifying matches on Saturday, reports agencies.

Norway clinched their place when they won 1-0 in Azerbaijan thanks to a 43rd minute long-range goal from Chelsea's Tore Andre Flo. Norway join world champions Brazil, hosts France and qualifiers Nigeria. Morocco, Tunisia, South Africa, Cameroon, and Romania in the finals.

Although Norway played in the 1994 finals in the United States, their only previous appearance before that was in 1938 so that Saturday's Triumph is another major achievement for coach Egil Olsen, who also was in charge four years ago.

After eight years as coach, Olsen will quit once the 1998 finals are over to be replaced by 38-year-old Nils Johan Semb. the junior national team coach.

While Norway wrapped up Group Three, the Dutch virtually claimed Group Seven with a 3-1 win over neighbours Belgium, the nation with whom they are co-hosting the 2000 European Championships.

But there was no sharing of the spoils in Rotterdam as the Dutch won convincingly with a solo effort from Dennis Bergkamp late in the game

behind Greece and Denmark with a hard-fought 3-2 win over Bosnia with all to play for in the remaining few matches. The upset of the night came

in the Group Three match in Lausanne where Finland beat Switzerland 2-1 to keep alive their hopes for a first ever appearance.

They moved into second place behind Norway with reasonable hopes to staying there. Jari Litmanen (16) and Antti

Finns with Adrian Kunz's 90th minute goal proving too little too late for the Swiss.

The jostling for positions behind Romania in Group Eight continued with Ireland winning 4-2 in Iceland and Lithuania beating Macedonia 2-0.

Runaway group winners Romania, who qualified last month, won 8-1 in Liechtenstein to maintain their 100 per cent record, leaving Ireland. Lithuania and Macedonia to fight for second place. Ireland meet Lithuania on Wednesday and both teams go into the match on 14 points.



ROME, Sept 7: The disillusioned head of Italy's Olympic committee was quoted as saying on Saturday that

Rome was denied the 2004 Games by a pact of mutual support between Athens and Africa, reports Reuter. The International Olympic

Committee (IOC) awarded the Games to the Greek capital on Friday night after a head-tohead with Rome in the final round. The IOC members were won

over by Athens' resolve to host a 21st century Olympics after the disappointment of losing out to Atlanta in the bid for the 1996 Centenary Games. But Mario Pescante, presi-

dent of the Italian Olympic Committee, said Athens had won because it had garnered overwhelming support from African IOC members. He suggested that support would be repaid when Cape

Town, defeated in the penultimate round of voting on Friday, bids for the 2008 Olympics. "Sport should teach us to ac-

cept defeat with a smile on our lips but just at the moment I

find that hard to do," Pescante was quoted as telling Italian daily Corriere Dello Sport. "A continent turned against

us I can't see any other explanation. Africa didn't support us at all. Maybe they made an accord for the 2008 Games." Asked if Rome would bid for the 2008 Olympics, Pescante

told Corriere: "It would be absurd to resubmit." "I can already see where the Games are going in 2008...

Europe will have to wait until at least 2012 to win the Olympics again." The comments were pub-

lished on the same day that International Amateur Athletic Federation (IAAF) chief Primo Nebiolo, who also backed the Rome bid, made it clear that he was looking forward to working with the Greeks despite the de-

Nebiolo said he was one of the first delegates to congratulate Athens after the victory. A statement from the IAAF president's office said the Italian was confident in the ability of Athens to run the Games.

"Dr Nebiolo wishes to express confidence in Athens' ability to organise an excellent 2004 and looks forward to working closely together with the Athens organisers," it said. Athens' victory at Friday's meeting in Lausanne makes a European Olympics in 2008 less Few people would expect the

IOC to give the Olympics to the same continent twice running and Cape Town looks well placed to take the Games to Africa in 11 years time. Pescante said he was satis-

fied the Rome bidding committee had done everything it could to bring the Games to Italy. "We didn't make any mis-

takes. We have no reasons to chastise ourselves," he said. Rome mayor Francesco Rutelli gracefully accepted defeat on Saturday, saying the eternal city should be proud of

having come so close to winning the prestigious bid. "We are calm, we accept the verdict knowing that we did everything we could," Rutelli told reporters after returning from Lausanne.

"To Athens, with whom we will forge a pact of friendship next October 5, go our most sincere best wishes," he added.
