The leaders of Nari Samaj, at a press conference in the city yesterday, alleged that the investigation of the parliamentary committee was completely faulty.

The Nari Samaj leaders demanded fresh enquiry into the rape of Sima Chowdhury and the cause of her death in jail subsequently. They also called for exemplary punishment of those involved in the incidents.

Nari Samaj urged the Home Ministry to grant leave for a case to be lodged against the investigating officer of the Sima Chowdhury case.

The Samaj leaders urged the government to take necessary steps so that the report and the suggestions made in it does not affect the case in any way.

SKOP Dhaka div convention Sept 12

Leaders of the Sramik Karmachari Okhya Parishad (SKOP), a conglomerate of workers and employees' bodies, in a meeting Monday demanded of the government not to denationalise any industry without consulting them.

Chaired by workers' leader Abdus Salam Khan, the meeting discussed the Cabinet decision regarding disinvestment of five state-owned industries, says a press release.

It also decided to hold a convention of SKOP representatives from Dhaka division on September 12 at Jatiya Press Club auditorium at 3 pm.

The meeting expressed deep concern at the recent fire-fuelled stampede at garment factories where five workers were killed, saying the gates of the factories were under lock and key. About one hundred garment workers died in similar incidents so far, the meeting observed.

The SKOP leaders demanded legal actions against the factory owners who are responsible for death of garment workers and that their families be given compensation.

SKOP leaders Abul Bashar, Md Nurul Islam, Mabsuduzzaman, Dr. Wajedul Islam Khan, Iqbal Majumder, Omar Faruq Khasru, Shah Alam and Abdul Wahed were present at the meeting.
