KATHMANDU, Sept 11: The disciplinary committee of the SAFF championship penalised only two men for Wednesday's ugly incident which unleashed a reign of terror after the first semifinal between Sri Lanka and Maldives.

Games organisers unveiled a "countdown globe," a 1.8 tonne five-metre high stainless steel structure fitted with a luminous crystal display clock resting on a three-metre wide base.

The organisers' communica tions director Maziah Mukhtar said at least four helicopters would fly next year from Christchurch, New Zealand, across Australia and over Indonesia before touching down at Kuala Lumpur.

Routes were still being worked out to enable the helicopters to land along the way for display and refuelling. Maziah told the New Straits Times daily.

Six thousand athletes and 1,500 officials are expected to take part in 15 events, including cricket, rugby, netball and hockey which are being introduced to the programme. Invitations have been sent to 67
