One sentenced to death for killing wife


BARISAL, Sept 11: A special court here today convicted a man in abstentia and sentenced him to death for killing his wife in 1996, reports UNB.


Judge Mohammad Araeshuddin gave the judgement in the crowded court against Probhat Kumar Halder of Andharmanik village in Uzir-






