

Betting thru' InterNet

KUALA LUMPUR, Sept 12. Malaysian police have smashed an international soccer gambling syndicate which used the InterNet to accept bets, reports

said today, reports AFP. The syndicate was believed to be linked to an illegal betting house in England and had accepted more than 2.5 million in bests since January said Penang police criminal chief senior assistant commissioner Amiruddin Embi.

Malaysia has achieved a notoriety since a wave of match fixing rocked the country's football championship. The betting ring was based in the northern state of Penang.

Police arrested two men. aged 36 and 27, when they raided the house and seized a computer, printer, facsimile machine, two handphones betting slips and a list of international soccer schedules.

"They were collecting bets for the match between Norway and Switzerland in the Word Cup preliminary rounds when we raided the place," Amiruddin was reported as saying by the Star daily.

Initial investigations showed the syndicate was raking in up to 200,000 ringgit (66,667 dollars) per match in the World Cup qualifying rounds, the English Premier league, FA Cup and the recent Copa America tournament.
