

Seeds tumble at Tokyo

TOKYO, Sept 17: Patty Schnyder of Switzerland and Henrieta Nagyova of Slovakia became the first seeded players to fall in the 450,000-dollar Princess Cup women's tennis tournament today, report agencies.

Seventh seed Schnyder bowed to qualifier Maria-Alexandra Vento of Venezuela 4-6, 0-6, while ninth seed Nagyova slumped after taking the first five games in a row to go down 6-2, 4-6, 1-6 to Naoko Sawamatsu of Japan.

Another qualifier, Shinobu Asagoe, pulled off her biggest upset win when the 25th-ranked Japanese stunned 30th-ranked American Chanda Rubin 6-4, 6-3 to delight the fans at the Ariake Coliseum Centre Court.

"To win my first match was my biggest target in this tournament, because all the players here are professional," said Asagoe, 21, who turned professional in February.

In the second round, Asagoe will challenge second-seeded Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario of Spain, who received a first-round bye.

In other action, Taiwan's number one player Wang Shiting downed Japan's Naoko Kijimuta 4-6, 6-3, 6-1, while Japanese qualifier Mana Endo outclassed Cristina Torrens-Valero of Spain 6-4, 7-5.

Mino Saeki was a straight-forward 6-4, 6-4 winner over fellow Japanese lucky loser Haruka Inoue.

Harare Test begins today

HARARE, Sept 17: It may be the battle to avoid cricket's wooden spoon but there is much at stake for Zimbabwe and New Zealand when they begin a two-match Test series in Harare on Thursday, reports Reuters.

The home side believe their apprenticeship in Test cricket is finally over. New Zealand have a captain and a coach beginning their first full season as well as a crop of uncapped young players.

And both can only climb the Test ladder, New Zealand languish last on Wisden's unofficial Test world championship table with Zimbabwe only one place above in eighth.

"In the past we have been trying to hold our own, just tread water. If we lost in a close match or drew a Test series we thought we had done a good job," said Zimbabwe's player-coach David Houghton.

"But we now have 20 plus Test caps sitting in our changing room - we're no longer learners at this game, New Zealand will struggle to beat us here."

Zimbabwean supporters even believe their side go into the series as narrow favourites. The idea draws little response from New Zealand coach, Steve Rixon.

"If they want to be favourites that's fine. It doesn't worry me," Rixon said. "All I'm worried about is our guys doing their jobs and if they do I will be very surprised if they don't come out with the trophy at the end."

The Kiwis go into the series without their leading batsman and bowler of last season in Bryan Young and Simon Doull, who are both injured, so is paceman Geoff Allott while the experienced Danny Morrison has also been left out on family problem.

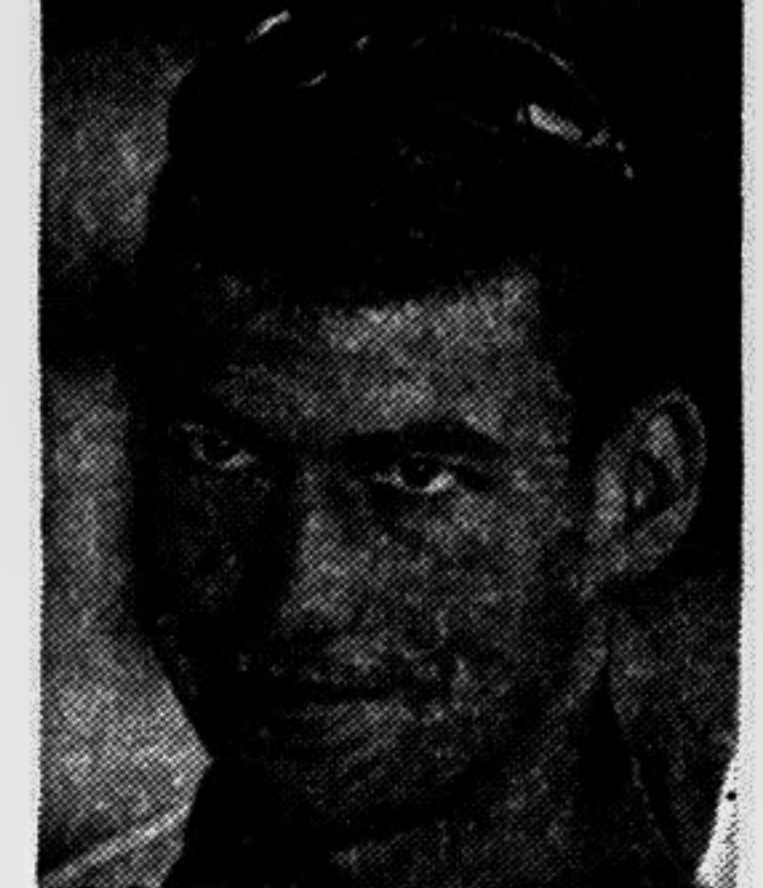
Instead their squad includes four uncapped players. Zimbabwe have a settled side although fast bowler Eddo Brandes misses the series because of a heel injury.

Both sides will be surprised at 14 on the morning of the match with the composition of each side's bowling attack the major area of debate.

The wicket is expected to turn by the second day and Zimbabwe include a second leg-spinner in uncapped Adam Huckle in their squad along with Kent's Paul Strang.

Steve for KL schedule

SYDNEY, Sept 17: Leading Australian cricketers, including vice-captain Steve Waugh, want to play in the Commonwealth Games in Malaysia regardless that England have snubbed the tournament and that they might not get paid, reports AP.

England withdrew when they were told the Commonwealth Games Federation would not pay players. Citing a busy schedule, England then offered to send an amateur team, which was refused.

Cricket will make its debut at next year's Games in Kuala Lumpur in September.

Australia have yet to finalise a schedule to tour Pakistan but it was originally believed the team would break off mid-way through to play at the Games before returning to the tour. The schedule is expected to be released Friday.

Waugh said he wanted to play at the Games if the Australian Cricket Board can work it into the schedule.

"I'm not concerned about what England are doing, I'm looking forward to going there," Waugh said Thursday.

"We're all for it as players, we want to go there. We want to represent our country and try and get a gold medal."

"It's a unique opportunity we wouldn't otherwise get and I think it'd be great to go there, representing Australia at the Commonwealth Games."

Young batsman Ricky Ponting said the players had spoken unofficially about it last month when they were still in England playing for the Ashes.

"We spoke about this before and that fact came up, that we probably wouldn't be paid for going there but that didn't worry us," Ponting said.

"I know that everyone wants to play and hopefully get a medal for Australia."

"It's going to be something very different and just to be involved in that sort of environment will be sensational, to be able to mix with other athletes."

The Australians would still be eligible for payment from the ACB.

Opening batsman Matthew Elliott said he would be thrilled to represent Australia in Malaysia if the opportunity arose.

"It would have to be good fun. Once every four years it'd definitely be an honour to get there and represent Australia," he said.

Daddy's Diego!

BUENOS AIRES, Sept 17: Diego Maradona said that he would give up football if his father asks him to do so, reports AFP.

Maradona, dogged by positive drug test reports that jeopardised his twilight career, spoke during television coverage of a match here.

The veteran has protested publicly over anti-doping test controls. Until a recent reinstatement his playing status was in jeopardy.

Maradona tested positive and was removed from the 1994 Argentine World Cup team.

Jamaica stay on course

RIO DE JANEIRO, Sept 17: Jamaica boosted their chances of becoming the first West Indian nation to qualify for the World Cup when they beat Costa Rica 1-0 in a CONCACAF qualifier on Sunday, reports Reuters.

Jamaica moved into second place in the final stage of the CONCACAF qualifying tournament, trailing leaders Mexico on goal difference, both teams have 14 points.

El Salvador also stayed in contention by hammering Canada 4-1 in San Salvador.

El Salvador are fourth with nine points, trailing the United States on goal difference, while Canada are bottom with five points and have only a mathematical chance of making the trip to France. The top three teams qualify for the finals.

Deon Burton, who scored the only goal in last week's 1-0 win over Canada, was again the hero for Jamaica as he struck in the 56th minute, setting off delirious celebrations amongst the 30,000 crowd in Kingston.

Costa Rica, who have not scored in their last four qualifying matches and have slipped to fifth in the table, were lethargic and rarely threatened the Jamaica goal.

McManaman holds Celtic

GLASGOW, Sept 17: Steve McManaman grabbed a stunning last-minute equaliser on Tuesday to give Liverpool a 2-2 draw with Celtic in a UEFA Cup tie featuring two former European champions, reports Reuters.

The England midfielder struck in the first round, first leg match just when he 50,000 Parkhead crowd, who had fallen silent in the first half after their stirring opening rendition of "you'll never walk alone", thought a comeback victory was theirs.

Celtic had gone behind after just six minutes when 17-year-old striker Michael Owen, again in the side in place of Robbie Fowler who was left out despite his fast recovery from injury, used his blistering speed to rip through the disorganised Celtic defenders to give Liverpool the perfect start.

McManaman, who had sent a dipping, curling shot over the bar in the fourth minute, almost made it 2-0 within the first quarter of an hour when he broke from the halfway line and rounded the defence to go clear on goal. But he hesitated and the chance was lost.

He made amends, however, in the 89th minute. Goalkeeper David James passed to captain Paul Ince who found McManaman inside his own half.

The midfielder dribbled upfield, rounded Alan Stubbs and curled the ball in front of the edge of the penalty box for a result that was a true reflection of the game.

That was the best goal I saw on the night," said Liverpool manager Roy Evans of the equaliser, admitting that he had been concerned that Liverpool might go 3-1 down.

"Macca's run was sensational, the finish was spot on."

Celtic had earlier poached two second half goals to turn the tables and lead Liverpool 2-1 in the clubs first European competition clash since the spring of 1966 when they met in a European Cup Winners' Cup semifinal. On that occasion Liverpool won 2-1.

Jackie McNamara scored off a one-two with Carraig Burley in the 53rd minute and when Swede Henrik Larsson was tripped by James in the Liverpool box after being sent clean through, Simon Donnelly, who had earlier hit the crossbar with a half-volley, netted the penalty.

"We took a very early goal and it took us some time to come back," said Celtic manager Wim Jansen.

"The goal in the last minute is part of the game. Two away goals is not easy but we are still in the game."

Celtic will be without their suspended captain Thomas Boyd for the second leg in two weeks.

They also lost Dutch international midfielder Regi Blinker who was carried off in

the 44th minute with a shoulder problem.

In Madrid, a clinical peace of finishing by Brazilian midfielder Juninho and Christian Vieri penalty enabled Atletico Madrid to come from behind to beat English Premier League Leicester City 2-1 in the first leg first round tie.

Leicester, whose only previous foray into Europe ended in defeat in the Cup Winners' Cup by Atletico 36 years ago, stunned the home side and the 28,000 crowd when Lan Marshall rifled home from close range after just 11 minutes.

Atletico attacked relentlessly for nearly an hour as Jose Luis Camarero, Vieri and Kikonarvae all squandered excellent chances or were felled by the heroics of Leicester's American goalkeeper Kasey Keller.

However, in the 69th minute Juninho, transferred from English club Middlesbrough in the close season, finally levelled the scores with a superb opportunist goal.

Two minutes later Vieri stroked home the winner from the penalty spot after Jose Mari Romero was brought down by Muzzy Izzet.

In Portugal, Italy's Lazio

made virtually certain of a place in the second round of the UEFA Cup with an emphatic 4-0 first leg victory over locals Vitoria Guimaraes.

After a closely contested first half, Italian international striker Pier Luigi Casiraghi fired Lazio in the lead in the 48th minute following a fine cross from the right by Roberto Mancini.

Diego Fuser scored the second 14 minutes later when he surprised the Guimaraes defence with a fiercely struck shot from outside the area.

From then on it was all Lazio. Pavelnedev headed the third after another fine run from Nacini and Alessandro Nesta added a fourth in the 78th minute to make the return leg in Rome little more than a formality.

Meanwhile, French club Auxerre will start the second leg with Deportivo Coruna as clear favourites after returning to Spain with a 2-1 win.

An indecisive Deportivo side, still struggling for ideas in midfield and power in front of goal since the departure of their Brazilian midfielder Rivaldo to Barcelona just before the start of the season, squandered several chances in the first half.

ZAGREB, Sept 17: Croatia coach Miroslav Blazevic, faced with growing public discontent, took the blame on Monday for his side's poor performance in World Cup qualifiers, state radio reported, says Reuters.

"I am abandoned by everyone, except my players, assistants and the people who decide if I will still steer the national side," a bitter Blazevic told a news conference.

Croatia were beaten 3-1 by Group One leaders Denmark in Copenhagen last Wednesday and a few days earlier only just managed to beat underdogs Bosnia with a late goal by captain Zvonimir Boban of AC Milan. They managed only three home draws earlier in the year.

Another hurdle awaits Mary

RALEIGH, North Carolina, Sept 17: Suspended American distance star Mary Slaney has been cleared of an alleged doping offense and can run again, USA Track and Field announced Tuesday, reports Reuters.

"The doping hearing board has concluded that Mary Slaney committed no doping violation," USA Track and Field said following a weekend hearing in Chicago on a disputed doping test from the 1996 US Olympic trials.

The test had found Slaney to have a higher than acceptable ratio of testosterone to epitestosterone, although she has consistently denied taking steroids or any substance banned by the IAAF.

Despite the ruling issued by US track officials, the general secretary of the International Amateur Athletic Federation said the world governing body must look at the merits of the

decision by the US doping hearing board before lifting its international suspension.

"If we do not agree with the merits of the decision, then there is a dispute and it will go to arbitration," Istvan Gyulai said in a telephone interview from his home in Budapest.

Mary Slaney not only was suspended by USA Track and Field but by the IAAF as well," Gyulai said. "USA Track and Field has the power to do this but the IAAF must also look at all the merits of the decision."

Slaney was pleased with the ruling, but had made no decision on whether she will compete during the upcoming indoor season or next summer, her husband Richard said in a telephone interview from their home in Eugene, Oregon.

"It's hard to feel vindicated (by the decision) for something you never did," he said. "So I don't think relief is the right word."

If she does compete this winter, it will be at the Millrose Games in New York in

February," Slaney added.

The IAAF suspended Slaney in June pending the outcome of the US hearing of her disputed drug test. The US federation then added its own suspension, prohibiting Slaney from competing in the US championships in Indianapolis in mid-June.

Richard Slaney said he received a telephone call concerning the decision Tuesday morning.
