US top guns start firing

WASHINGTON. Sept 20: Michael

Chang usually isn't this powerful. Pete Sampras usually isn't this

theatrical. Together, they put the United States in a position that's almost unbeatable, reports AP. Chang, avenging one of the

most difficult losses of his career, supplemented his strong baseline game with an uncharacteristically strong serve to beat US Open champion Patrick Rafter 6-4, 1-6, 6-3, 6-4 Friday to open the semifinals of the Davis Cup.

Then Sampras, not known for his on-court antics, skipped like a child and repeatedly pumped both arms in the air to fire up the sellout crowd as he overwhelmed Mark Philippoussis 6-1, 6-2, 7-6 (7-5) to give the Americans a commanding 2-0 lead over Australia in the best-of-5 tie.

"The first two sets, that's probably the best tennis I've played in my career," said Sampras, a daunting statement considering he's often called the best ever to play the game. "I think (the crowd) thought

Chang's pin-point groundstrokes benefited from a slower hardcourt surface that the one used at the US Open, but he also served a surprising 11 aces and constantly kept Rafter off guard. He finished the match with consecutive aces after Rafter had saved three match points.

The second match pitted two of the strongest servers in the game, but proved anticlimactic when Philippoussis came out

TORONTO, Sept 20: The case of the cricket fracas took a new

twist Friday, report agencies.
Toronto police, who Wednesday charged Pakistan player
Inzamamul Haq with assaulting a spectator at a match against India here Sunday, said they had now laid the same charges against the fan.

A police department spokes-man said Shiv Kumar Thind, 29, a resident of the Toronto suburb of Etobicoke, was cited with hurling a megaphone at Inzamam. Thind allegedly used the

megaphone to taunt Inzamam during the match, one of five in the annual Shahara Cup series. Inzamam retaliated by jumping into the stands to seek out the heckler.

Play was abandoned for 37 minutes while Thind was hus-

tled out of the grounds. Although the megaphone missed its target, Inzamam re-portedly picked up a cricket bat and charged into the crowd. He was later charged on three counts of assault and banned by International Cricket Council referee Jackie Hendriks from playing in the third and fourth matches of the series because of "conduct unbecoming an international cricket player and for bringing the game into disre-

The spectator admitted that he had been using the megaphone to hurl abuse at Inza-

"I said he looked like a 'potato because he didn't have a good body," said Thind.

Uzbeks, Kazakhs earn first points

ALMATY, Sept 20: Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan earned their first points after playing out a 1-1 draw in a World Cup Asian Zone second round Group B match here today, report agencies.

Ruslan Baltiyev put Kazakhstan ahead through an 84th minute penalty. Oleg Shatskikh equalised a minute later for Uzbekistan.

Both teams are out of contention for places to next year's finals in France.

On Friday, Saudi Arabia had goalkeeper Mohammed Al Daeyea to thank for their 1-1 draw with Iran in a Group A match in Tehran.

Al Daeyea, whose penalty saves helped the Saudis to the Asian Cup last December, saved a spot kick from Karim Bagheri in the 28th minute and made several other stops as the Saudis held on for the draw and a share of the lead in the group alongside Iran.

The Saudis took the lead the 33rd minute through a closerange shot from Ibrahim El-Souayyed but Bagheri earned a point for Iran with his 64thminute goal.

Kuwait moved to within one point of Iran and the Saudis at the head of the group after a 2-0 win away to Qatar thanks to goals from Jassem Houaidi after 17 minutes and Bachar Abdallah a minute from full time. Japan maintained their un-

beaten record in Group B with a 0-0 draw away to the United Arab Emirates but are two points behind group leaders South Korea. GROUP A



Transfer system stinks

LONDON, Sept 20: A four-year inquiry into English soccer's transfer system concluded today that it created a "cult of dishonesty" by allowing agents to receive illegal payments, reports

Reuter. It said agents were commonly used as intermediaries in transfers, although this practice was banned under

Football Association rules. Agents were paid for their services but received money after providing invoices which falsely recorded the work they

Those in authority turned a blind eye to what was going on, the inquiry's report said. This attitude "only served to damage the game of football by making it easier for more serious corruption to flourish".

The FA said it was deeply concerned about some of the report's contents and said a decision on whether it would lay charges against individuals would be taken shortly.

"Unacceptable and unsavoury activities in the past have been revealed," it said in a statement. "The public have the right to expect integrity, honesty and accountability in the way the national sport operates. That expectation must be met. It will be.

"There is a clear need for reassurance that the financial affairs of all clubs will be conducted properly in the future."

But many greeted the report with relief, saying it did not show corruption was widespread in the game.

"I do not think this report demonstrates that football is a corrupt game and nothing we investigated was related to the fixing of matches," said lawyer Robert Reid, who headed the inquiry team.

There is no evidence that players were bought or sold for the financial gain of the managers. The transactions were thought to be in the best interests of the club."

The report recommended stricter controls on agents, some of which have already been introduced, and urged clubs to take greater care that transfers were undertaken in an atmosphere of openness.

But it was careful not to recommend charges be laid against any individuals.

The inquiry was set up in November 1993 to investigate "bungs" — illegal payments — after allegations in a court case about the transfer of Teddy Sheringham. Now an England player, from Nottingham Forest to Tottenham in 1992.

The longest investigation undertaken by the English game also investigated transfers involving Scandinavian players such as Anders Limpar and John Jensen to English
