



The Swede, who officially received UEFA's backing for the FIFA presidency at a conference in Helsinki, said the proviso was that the money had to be used for concrete projects to promote soccer in their coun-

Havelange, who has been FIFA head since 1974, is not standing in next June's election and the FIFA presidency appears to be between Johansson and Argentina's Julio Grondona who likely will get the large South American vote.

In the past, Johansson has been an outspoken critic of Havelange's methods and the two have clashed over important decisions such as the cohosting of the 2002 World Cup in South Korea and Japan, which the Swede pushed through against the Brazilian's wishes.

Stating his case Thursday, Johansson said FIFA had to become more democratic and also ensure that income generated from soccer was reinvested directly in the game.

"The world football movement is a community," he said. "For this reason FIFA has to further strengthen its democratic government, as the Untied Nations of world football towards the inside and the out-
