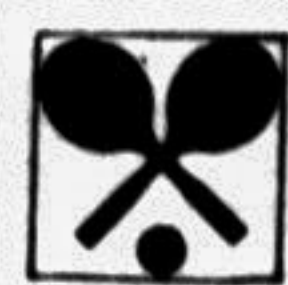

Rafter races into sennis



MUNICH, Sept 26: US Open champion Patrick Rafter made sure of 675,000 dollars in prize money with an impressive straight sets Grand Slam Cup win over Chilean Marcelo Rios to set up a semifinal with Czech Petr Korda, reports Reuter.

Australian Rafter, who relied on his trademark serve-and-volley game to tame Rios 6-1, 7-6 on Thursday, earned 425,000 dollars for advancing to the last four, plus a 250,000 dollars bonus for having won a Grand Slam.

Korda, who won the richest tournament in the game in 1993, will have to be content with 425,000 dollars for his 7-5, 6-3 win over Wimbledon finalist, Cedric Pioline of France.

World number one Pete Sampras plays Swede Jonas Bjorkman while Briton Greg Rusedski, who fell to Rafter in the US Open final, faces Russian Yevgeny Kafelnikov in the remaining quarterfinals today.

Rafter got off to a flying start by breaking Rios in the second game and again in the fourth before wrapping up the set with a winning volley.

Rios raised his game in the second set, both players holding serve and playing some great

tennis along the way until the tie-break.

"Last time I played him I won the first set 6-0, he won the second 7-6 and then he killed me (6-1) in the third," said Rafter.

The day's other match was much tighter with Korda and Pioline losing their serve in a tense first set until the Frenchman hit a forehand volley into the net to go one set behind.

Korda, slowly recapturing his best form after two years marked by a string of injuries, broke Pioline with perfect timing in the second set, opening a 5-3 lead and giving him the chance to serve for the match.

A winning serve on his first match point allowed him to stay in line for the 1.5-million dollar cheque awarded to the winner of Sunday's final.

Korda, who knocked out Sampras in the fourth round of the US Open, said he was still suffering from the head cold which forced him to retire from his quarterfinal against Bjorkman two days later.

"My nose keeps running and I still can't breathe properly but it's not too bad," he said. "I played better when it mattered most and that's why I won."

Asked if he thought he stood a chance against Rafter, he said: "I serve well, yes."

referring to their quarterfinal encounter at the 1996 Canadian Open. "I thought that was going to happen again."

serve to win the tie-break without conceding a point.

"I served really well and I think that was the key," he said. "On such a fast surface, it helps."

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Chileans call off strike

SANTIAGO, Sept 26: One day after Diego Maradona warned a strike by Chilean soccer players demanding better working conditions could spread throughout South America, the stoppage ended Thursday, reports AP.

"Everything has been solved and we have unanimously voted to end the stoppage," Carlos Ramos, president of the Players' Union said after a marathon assembly attended by players representing all professional Chilean clubs.

No details were available on the agreement, but Ramos indicated the players' key demands had been accepted, including end to frequent delays of up to two months by some clubs in paying salaries.

The clubs also agreed to lift sanctions against players who joined the two-week strike.

The players' decision will allow the First and Second Division tournaments to resume normally over the weekend, although there are some small details that are yet to be ironed," Ramos said. He did not elaborate.

Maradona, on a 24-hour visit here, said the day before that he and the World Players Union he presides over fully supported the Chilean strikers, and warned that no one should dismiss the possibility of the strike here "turning into a South American strike."

Papin powers

Bordeaux

PARIS, Sept 26: Jean-Pierre Papin scored against his old club Marseille on Thursday, helping Bordeaux to a 2-0 win, reports Reuter.

The victory lifted them to third in the French First Division, three points behind Metz who play Auxerre today.

Bordeaux got off to a perfect start with Lilian Laslandes scoring in the ninth minute. He was injured in the process and needed four stitches in a cut knee.

Former European champion Marseille came closest to equalising in the 35th minute when defender Laurent Blanc's free kick hit the post.

Papin struck Bordeaux's second goal after 63 minutes, stroking home Sylvain Wiltord's cross from close range.

Earlier, Lyon suffered their fourth defeat in five games at the Gerland Stadium when they went down 3-1 to Lens.

Lens jumped from eighth to fourth in the table after goals by Frederic Dehu, Yoan Lachor and Stephane Ziani had given them a 3-0 lead by the 55th minute.

Alain Caveglia scored Lyon's consolation goal in the 57th minute.

Inter look to extend run



MILAN, Sept 26: Inter Milan are ready to line up another week at the top of the Serie A on Saturday after taking what should be three easy points from newly-promoted Lecce, reports AFP.

Both sides have made a highly consistent start to the season — with Inter winning all three matches and Lecce losing all three.

Inter will also be at full strength after their coach Gigi Simonini rested Ronaldo and the team's other key players for their midweek cut tie here against Second Division Foggia.

The second string side played badly and squeaked home 3-2 with two goals in the last 10 minutes. But it still meant that Inter have won all six competitive matches they have played this season.

Champions Juventus have yet to concede a goal this season, but their defence is bound to be tested by a Sampdoria side still patiently waiting for Jurgen Klinsmann to find the target.

Both clubs have seven points, and neither side is expecting an easy time in Genoa on Saturday.

Juventus have scored 13 goals in their last three matches (Champions' League, Serie A and Italian Cup), but Sampdoria's confidence has risen after overturning an Italian Cup defeat in midweek.

Sampdoria lost the away leg to Graeme Souness Torino three weeks ago and were 1-0 down in Genoa before reserve striker Sandro Tovalieri, hoping to win a first-team place, scored a hat-trick on Wednesday night.

Italy's other club in next week's Champions' League, Parma, will try to avoid defeat in their away game with Udinese — a feat which proved beyond AC Milan last weekend.

Lazio, whose flying start to the season came to an abrupt end at Empoli last week, are at home to newly-promoted Bari in Saturday's other fixture brought forward because of European Cup action.

Florentina's Argentine skipper Gabriel Batistuta, who has scored in every match this season — six in three league games and one in each of their

Italian Cup wins — will be looking to continue that run on Sunday against Empoli.

AC Milan and Vicenza meet after very different experiences in their midweek Italian Cup ties.

Milan notched their first win of the season in any competition by beating Reggina 2-0

but holders Vicenza lost 3-2 to Pescara and went out on the away goals rule.

Coach Fabio Capello, who has maintained all week that his side will be one of the major players this season, can only pray now for his team's first league win to get things properly underway.

Lewis not afraid of Golota



NEW YORK, Sept 26: World Boxing Council (WBC) heavy weight champion Lennox Lewis is hoping he can finish off Andrew Golota before the more sensitive parts of his anatomy become a target for the Polish brawler, reports Reuter.

"I'm going out there with a positive outlook and hope I can knock him out before his losses hit his mind," said the Briton, who puts his title, and possibly his manhood, on the line against Golota October 4 in Atlantic City.

Golota earned ring infamy in a pair of fights against Riddick Bowe last year when he was disqualified each time for repeatedly striking Bowe with low blows.

"He is a dirty fighter," Lewis said of the rough and tough 29-year-old challenger during a telephone news conference from his training camp in big bear, California.

"I think the whole world will be watching him and if he does it again, he has got to be the stupidest boxer in the world," Lewis said.

Stupidity in the ring is something that Golota himself has admitted to.

Unlike Mike Tyson, who was losing when he resorted to biting Evander Holyfield, Golota had been battering Bowe both times when Bowe was handed victory by disqualification.

"Definitely there is the chance that he will resort to

those tactics, but I don't think it will be a good move for me to retaliate," said Lewis, who takes a 31-1 record into the risky bout.

Some boxing insiders have suggested that Lewis was making a big mistake by taking on the rugged Golota, who could prove a most dangerous opponent if he doesn't get himself disqualified.

But the 32-year-old Briton,

Lewis said of the rough and tough 29-year-old challenger during a telephone news conference from his training camp in big bear, California.

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"Definitely there is the chance that he will resort to

who will earn about 7 million dollars for the fight, said he had no alternative in the diluted heavyweight division if he wanted a meaningful challenge.

"In order to prove that I'm the best in the world I need to go out against the boxer the world deems the best," Lewis said.

"I didn't get the chance against Bowe and I didn't get the

chance against Tyson," Lewis said of the former champion currently under suspension for his vicious biting of Holyfield in June.

Bowe retired after the Golota rematch and Lewis will have to wait to get his shot at World Boxing Association champion Holyfield, whose unification quest first pits him against International Boxing Federation champion Michael Moorer on November 8.

They only other person out there was Andrew Golota and a lot of people hold him in high regard," Lewis said of the challenger whose only blemishes on a 28-2 record come from the disqualifications in fights he was about to win.

"I'm glad that he had some boxing ability. Whether he can stay in the rules is the question."

LONDON, Sept 26: Italian striker Fabrizio Ravanelli has signed for French First Division club Olympique Marseille from Middlesbrough, BBC radio reported on Thursday, reports Reuter.
