

CBAs oppose move fearing bad deal for workers

The government's privatisation programme in jute and textile sectors, the two lossmaking leviathans among the State-Owned Enterprises (SOE), has been put on hold as it went for a temporary truce with trade

The workers in turn announced withholding of their agitations to lay a siege around the Karim Jute Mills (KJM) which is up for sale.

It is part of the 115 SOE's the government has earmarked for privatisation in the current and next financial years. This year, 65 SOE's are to be privatised in a bid to gear up the programme to reduce state subsidy.

Focus on CBAs

The KJM is part of a package of six SOE's for sale to highest bidders along with three textile mills, one sugar mill and a can printing plant which the cabinet approved recently.

Sale of these enterprises have become a litmus test for the government's resolve to shake-off the burden of loss making SOE's. A psychological barrier seems to be preventing the two sides from reaching an accord to facilitate their smooth transfer after the government recently managed to clear eight SOE's from its inventory and offload shares of nine others to spur the privatisation programme.

The government and the workers unions went for a truce in June and again last week. But tender for sale of KJM has been approved by the cabinet and the file awaits final clearance from the Prime Minister's Office (PMO). The workers, meanwhile, has chosen the union group backed by the main-opposition BNP to lead them as Collective Bargaining Agent

(CBA) in the KJM. For the moment, the uneasy truce is holding. The workers, led by Patkal and Bastrakal See Page 12 Col 3

Notification Re: Distribution of Public Issue

In order to protect investors interest in securities by ensuring proper issuance thereof, the Commission in exercising its power under Section 2CC of the Securities & Exchange Ordinance, 1969, as amended by the Securities & Exchange (Amendment) Act, 1997 requires that any issuer of securities must distribute securi-

ties in IPO in the following manner: . Minimum Market Lot in Initial Public Offering (IPO) shall be securities worth Taka 5,000/=(Taka five thousand) only.

2. Quota at 10 (ten) per cent shall be reserved for non-resident Bangladeshis (NRB) out of the total amount of IPO. There shall be no other quota for any other categories of applicants. In case of over-subscription, the allotment will be made by the Company on a pro-rata basis subject to the nearest Multiple of the Minimum Market Lot.

3. The balance 90% of the total amount of IPO shall be available for subscription by the applicants resident in Bangladesh for securities in the following manner:-

(a) 70 (seventy) per cent of the total amount of IPO is available for the applicants applied for Minimum Market Lot. In case of over-subscription, the securities will be distributed through public lottery. (b) The balance 30 (thirty) per cent is available for applicants other than those for Minimum Market Lot. In case of over-subscription, the allotment will be done on pro-rata basis subject to the nearest Multiple of the

Minimum Market Lot. 4. In case of under-subscription in any category mentioned in paragraphs 2 and 3, such under-subscribed amount of IPO may be allotted to any other categories which have been over-subscribed, preference being given to applicants for Minimum Market Lot.

5. Refund of over-subscription money of applicants resident in Bangladesh shall be made by Account Payee Cheque payable at Dhaka or Chittagong, as selected by the applicants. For the purpose, number of bank account along with name of bank and branch shall be indicated in the Securities Application Form. 6. A non-resident Bangladeshi shall apply either directly by enclosing a foreign demand draft drawn on a

bank payable at Dhaka; or through a nominee by paying out of foreign currency deposit account maintained in Bangladesh; for the value of securities applied for. The value of securities applied for, may be paid in Taka or US Dollar or UK Pound Sterling at the rate of exchange mentioned in the Securities Application Form. Refund of over-subscription, if any, shall be made in the currency in which the value of securities was paid for. 7. In case any difficulty arises in the implementation of paragraphs 1 through 6 above, the Commission shall allow distribution in such a way as it deems fit that best protects the investors interest.

8.
