

### Nat'l gymnastics Ansars rule the day

The Biman 23rd national gymnastics championship began yesterday at the NSC Gymnasium with Ansars establishing absolute supremacy securing four gold, four silver and two bronze medals in five events decided on the day, reports UNB.

Jessore DSA were a distant second collecting one gold and three bronze medals while Meherpur DSA bagged one silver and Dinajpur DSA one bronze.

The day's gold winners are: Men's parallel bar - M Nazrul Islam (Ansars); Long Horse - Mamun Al Firozi (Ansars); Roman Ring - M Nazrul Islam (Ansars); women's uneven bar - Jannatul Ferdous (Ansars), and Floor Exercise - Sharmeen Sultana Sumi (Jessore).

Earlier, State Minister for Youth, Sports and Cultural Affairs Obaidul Quader inaugurated the two-day national meet, organised by the Bangladesh Gymnastics Federation and sponsored by Biman Bangladesh Airlines.

In all, 60 gymnasts from across the country are taking part in 10 events - six for men and four for women.

### Kiefer clinches Toulouse title

TOULOUSE, France, Sept 29: German prospect Nicolas Kiefer made his ATP Tour breakthrough by beating holder Mark Philippoussis in the Toulouse final on Sunday, reports Reuter.

Kiefer, a member of the "Mercedes Club" launched by Boris Becker to promote young German talent, won his first tour event 7-5, 5-7, 6-4.

Seventeen aces and 58 percent first serve accuracy were not enough for the third-seeded Australian.

### Berlin Marathon Lagat sets new mark

BERLIN, Sept 29: Elijah Lagat of Kenya won the Berlin Marathon on Sunday with the world's fastest time this year, outstripping compatriot Eric Kimaiyo to win by two seconds, reports Reuter.

Lagat's time of two hours seven minutes 41 seconds was 10 seconds faster than the previous best set by Domingos Castro of Portugal and helped the 31-year-old collect a bonus of 78,000 marks (43,200 dollars) on top of his 30,000 mark first prize.

"I could have run even faster but I didn't want to leave my friend Sammy Lek" Lagat said. Lek, the 1995 winner in Berlin finished 13 seconds behind in third and was one of five Kenyan runners in the first six.

Cheered on by a million spectators, 18,514 runners from 74 countries took part in the world's fifth largest marathon that passes through the historic Brandenburg Gate and winds through eight districts in east and west Berlin.

The leading pack was on target at the 18-mile point (30 km) to break the nine-year-old world marathon record of 2:06:50, set by Belayneh Dinsamo of Ethiopia.

But a series of moderate inclines over the last six miles and sunny weather with temperatures near 20 degrees centigrade took their toll.

"I wanted to run a world record today," said second-placed Kimaiyo. "But the pace slowed down at times because of tactical considerations."

Catherina McKiernan of Ireland won the women's race with a course record time of 2:23:44. A four-time runner-up in World Cross Country Championships, McKiernan's time was the best for a women's marathon debutante.

She was followed home by Madina Biktagirova of Belarus in 2:24:46 and Marleen Renders of Belgium in third at 2:26:18.

Among the starters were Waldemar Cierpinski, who won the Olympic marathon in 1976 and 1980 for East Germany. Cierpinski was running with the manager of the former Bremen soccer team, Willi Lemke.

Frank Shorter, who won the 1972 Olympic marathon in Munich, was also planning to run, but had to cancel at the last minute due to a death in his family.

### Indian cops hold a bookie

NEW DELHI, Sept 29: Indian police have arrested a bookmaker and accused him of fixing international cricket matches with the help of top players, the Asian Age daily said today, reports AFP.

Police said they arrested Om Prakash Dhanuka in Calcutta late Sunday and seized documents and cash, adding they

believed the bookmaker was involved in a huge betting racket.

Computer files "containing names and information on cricket bookies in various parts of the world," including Dubai, London and many cities across India were also found, they said.

"It is likely that Dhanuka had regular contacts with a number of Indian cricketers who are alleged to be involved

in the betting scam," one police officer said.

An independent probe into match-fixing is under way in India following claims by former Indian all-rounder Manoj Prabhakar that he was offered 72,000 dollars by a teammate to ensure India lost to Pakistan in a limited-overs tournament in 1994.

Prabhakar made the claim in Outlook magazine earlier this year. Indian cricket chiefs backed a probe but said they were sure it would exonerate its players.

In July, former Pakistan wicketkeeper Rashid Latif added to the speculation when the same magazine quoted him as saying big-name players from India and Pakistan were involved in fixing results.

Latif later withdrew the allegations, saying he had been misquoted.

A police official Rajendra Kumar claimed Dhanuka had taken 500 million rupees (13 million dollars) in bets during cricket matches and suggested India's defeat against Pakistan on Sunday could have been the target of match fixing.

He quoted sources in betting circles as saying that the "odds were heavily in favour for Pakistan" and they won "convincingly."

Earlier this month Pakistan were thrashed 4-1 by India in a one-day tournament, prompting claims in Pakistan that those results had also been fixed.

Illegal betting on cricket results is believed to be widespread in India and the sub-continent but no player has ever been found guilty of being involved despite repeated allegations.

### Teacher no more Greg's teacher

LONDON, Sept 29: After becoming the first British player for 61 years to reach the US Open final and the first ever to be ranked in the top 10, Greg Rusedski has split with his coach, reports AP.

The big-serving left-hander has parted company with American Brian Teacher to team up with Englishman Tony Pickard, who was behind Stefan Edberg's rise to the top in the late 1980s.

According to press reports, Rusedski said the split with Teacher, who had been his coach for 16 months and helped him rise from 84 to No 10, was not acrimonious.

"We had an arrangement to work until September and, starting from this week I will be working with Tony," Rusedski said after his semifinal loss to Pete Sampras at the 6 million dollars Grand Slam Cup in Munich.

"He has proved by taking Stefan to the top that he is one of the best coaches in the world. Knowing that he is going to be helping me is an exciting prospect."

Montreal-born Rusedski, who took British citizenship in June 1995, lost to Pat Rafter in the US Open final three weeks ago and his performances at Flushing Meadow pushed him up to No 10 in the world.

Pickard, 63, went into semi-retirement after helping Edberg win six Grand Slam titles between 1985 and '94.

"Greg is unbelievably competitive and his commitment is great," Pickard was quoted as saying. "With the top 10 as it is, there is no reason why he can't get into the top five and, from there, anything can happen."

### Healy's source of spirit

BRISBANE, Australia, Sept 29: Australian wicketkeeper Ian Healy today said he wanted to continue playing in Tests in a bid to face the West Indies in 1999, reports agencies.

The pugnacious Healy, 33, is matches this summer, possibly against South Africa in Adelaide in late January.

Healy is 27 dismissals short of Marsh's record and has played 95 Tests.

But Healy is looking further ahead - he's determined to be around when the Australians travel to the Caribbean and take on the West Indies in 1999, a side Lara has said he wants to captain.

Australia won the Frank Worrell Trophy 2-1 in the Caribbean in April 1995 and retained it at home winning 3-2 early this year.

"He (Lara) has actually made my career span a lot clearer," Healy said here today of the prospect of another showdown with the temperamental batting maestro.

Healy said of Lara: "He said I'll guarantee you one thing, I can't wait to play these Aussies in two years time, I'll guarantee that we won't be losing."

"If he wants to guarantee they won't lose it's a great challenge for me. I figured well that's me. I've definitely got to be there."

Relations between the Australian cricketers and Lara have been touchy for some years.

It all began with Healy's stumping of Lara in the first Test here in 1992 when debate raged whether Healy had the ball when he broke the wicket.

Tensions mounted again last summer here when Lara snipped at the Australians through the press and had a heated confrontation with

Healy in the dressing room after play in the second Test in Sydney.

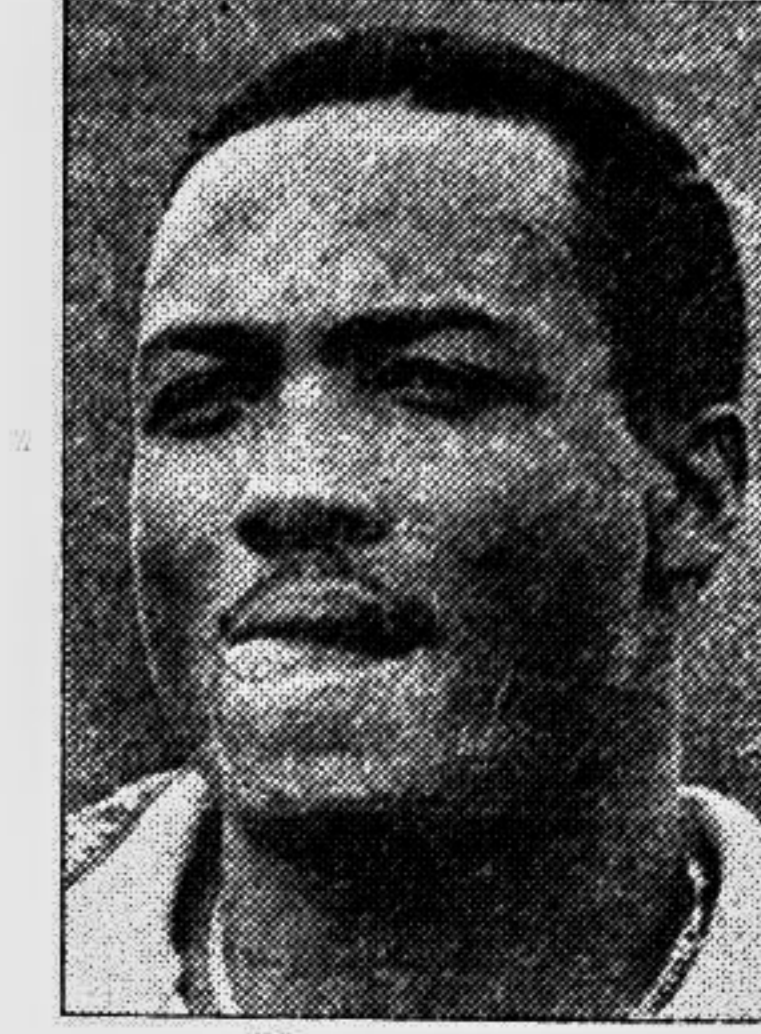
Healy had caught Lara for two in the first innings and the West Indian record holder disputed the catch.

Then, in the fifth Test in Perth, where Lara made a century, Lara lambasted the Aus-

traliens for their treatment of young opener Robert Samuels.

"I haven't had a run-in with him (Lara) or spoken to him since the second Test," Healy said.

"The West Indies team themselves don't really fancy Brian Lara but he thought he would take Samuels under his wing and took offence over what he was copping out on the field."

### Sino spikers' sixth in a row

MANILA, Sept 29: China trounced Japan 3-0 at the last day of the 9th Asian women's volleyball championship Sunday to claim its sixth title in a row with all six match victories, reports Xinhua.

South Korea, who had only lost to China here, beat Chinese Taipei 15-5, 15-3, 15-10 in day's another championship round match to take the runner-up.

China, led by Sun Yue who won the honour of the tournament's best spiker and scorer, downed Japan 15-7, 15-9, 15-6 after overcoming some challenges in the beginning of the first set, where the scoring was 6-6 before the Chinese players took the lead.

Japan, who elected four wins and two losses, finished third with Chinese Taipei fourth.

In day's consolation round matches, Thailand trounced Australia 3-0 (15-1, 15-4, 15-0) for fifth place while Uzbekistan beat Philippines 3-0 (15-6, 15-8, 15-13) for sixth. Australia and Philippines were seventh and eighth.

### No one near number one

MUNICH, Sept 29 (agencies): With all the talk of a new generation coming in men's tennis, Pete Sampras proved Sunday there's going to be no change at the top soon.

The world's top-ranked player destroyed promising US Open winner Patrick Rafter with his serve, 6-2, 6-4, 7-5 to win the Grand Slam Cup and its huge title money of 1.5 million dollars.

With players like Andre Agassi and Boris Becker fading from the headlines, other players like Britain's hard-serving Greg Rusedski or Chile's Marcelo Rios are emerging.

But the most promising of the lot appears to be Rafter, the Australian with power and surprising speed. He has shot from 69th in the world to third this year.

But Rafter, 24, can't beat Sampras. He lost his sixth straight to the No 1 at the Grand Slam Cup just a week after Sampras beat him to carry the United States past Australia and into the finals of the Davis Cup.

"He's just too good and strong," said the frustrated Rafter. "I've got to look for

something new, something different to try to crack Pete -- but I haven't found anything yet."

Sampras made it clear from the start he wasn't going to let Rafter beat him Sunday after both knocked off some of the world's top players to reach the final of the six million dollar event.

"Because he just won the US Open, it raised my intensity," said Sampras. "He's No 3 now, so you come out firing."

Some hope Rafter could become the rival Sampras lacks since Agassi began sliding from the top several years ago.

"Well it's hard to say right now," said Sampras. "You know, with Andre and I, it was very unique. We're both Americans, different personalities, the whole nine yards."

"I just lost my bet to Henman -- now I can afford to buy him dinner," said Sampras, laughing.

Now Sampras' only rival is the all-time greats. He has won 10 Grand Slam titles, two short of Roy Emerson's record.

"The prime, physically and mentally, for a tennis player, is between 22 and 28," said Sampras, now 26. "For me, it's probably right now."

And he wants to underline his dominance of the men's game by becoming the first man since Australian Rod Laver in 1969 to win all four Grand Slams in one year.

"In today's game, it's difficult but the only thing really left for me right now is to try to break that record, or at least try to win the French," said Sampras, who has yet to taste success at Roland Garros.

Sampras won 2 million dollars at the Grand Slam Cup, doubling his earnings for the year. In addition to the biggest title money in tennis, he collected 500,000 dollars for winning Wimbledon and the Australian Open.
