Country's two stock exchanges will operate on Saturdays from next weekend, following the footsteps of banks. in their bid to revitalise the market with increased transactions, reports UNB.

The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), on the other hand, abolished all quotas. barring that for the non-resident Bangladeshis, in the initial public offerings (IPOs) of the issues to provide a levelled playing field.

The quota dismantling followed the conditions set by the Asian Development Bank (ADB) for an 80 million US dollar project loan. The finance minister had also pledged to abolish quotas in his budget speech.
