Peace For All

The election was held in Moscow on Sept 27 at the triennial assembly of the bureau.

AMDISA workshop begins today

A six-day regional workshop on 'Strategies for Financing Business and Management Schools in South Asia' for heads of institutions will begin in Rajendrapur today, says a press release.

The workshop is being organised by the Association of Management Development Institutions in South Asia (AMDISA), in cooperation with Association Management Development Institutions of Bangladesh (AMDIB) with financial support of Commonwealth Fund for Technical Cooperation (CFTC) of Commonwealth Secretariat, London.

Some 25 directors of business schools and management development institutions of the SAARC countries are expected to participate in the workshop. Prof Dr AK Azad Chowdhury, Vice Chancellor, University of Dhaka, will inaugurate the workshop at 4:00 pm today. Prof Dr Abdur Rab, Director, IBA, and President, AMDISA, will preside over the inaugural session.

20 killed in police custody in 9 months

At least 20 people were killed in police custody during the last nine months in different parts of the country according to statistics of Odhikar, a coalition of human rights organisations.

The Odhikar data, based on newspaper reports, also showed that five women were raped by members of the law enforcing agencies.

Besides, at least four persons were killed and more than 1,300 people, including a photo-journalist, activists of different political parties and members of the Ansar, were injured in 'political repression,' according to Odhikar.

In its data the human rights organisation showed that more than one thousand persons, including women, were arrested by the law enforcing agencies during this nine month period.

Meanwhile, Odhikar, in a statement on Thursday, said the recent incidents proved that the government and the police administration have failed to take effective measures to check women repression by members of the law enforcing agencies.

The human rights body alleged that in some cases, senior police officials tried to suppress the incidents in which police personnel were involved in immoral acts.

'Steps taken to expand science education'

A three-day science fair began at Viharunessa Noon School and College in the city yesterday, reports UNB.

Commerce and Industries Minister Tofael Ahmed opened the fair, organised by the Science Club of the institution. The club was established by the students of the college last year.

The government has taken up steps to expand science education in schools and colleges across the country, Tofael Ahmed said while addressing the function.

He further said the government is contemplating the report of the Education Committee to formulate a science-based education policy.

Presided over by the college Principal Hamida Ali, the opening ceremony was also addressed by college governing body chairman H B M Iqbal MP, its members A K M Firoz Noon and Humayun Kabir Khan and Prof Rokeya Akter Begum.

A total of 124 innovative projects — 89 in junior group and 35 in senior group — are on display in the fair that will remain open to invited guests and women.

More spinning, textile mills to achieve autarky urged

State Minister for Jute and Textiles A K Faezul Huq yesterday urged the industrialists to set up more spinning and textile mills in the country to achieve autarky, reports BSS.

"Textiles sector is a most prospective sector which can create enough job opportunities and earn more foreign currency for the country," the minister said while addressing a function at a city hotel.

Bengal Technological Corporation and a Germany-based worldwide textiles machinery company, Trutzschler, jointly organised the function entitled "Customer Day '97".

The state minister said, the government has fixed a target to achieve self-reliance in textile sector by the year 2000. "With this end in view, the government has been providing all-out help and cooperation to the investors in textile sector," he added.

BIUEF threatens agitation

Bangladesh Inter University Employees' Federation (BIUEF) has threatened massive agitation in all universities of the country if their three-point charter of demands are not met immediately.

The demands include immediate implementation of the proposed Pay Scale, amendment to the University Act to ensure representation of the employees to the Senate, Syndicate and finance committees, and raising retirement age from 60 to 65 years, says a press release.

A BIUEF press release signed by its president and secretary Rabiul Alam and Mohammad Bashirullah respectively said the delay in implementing the new Pay Scale has caused serious malady in the lives of the low-paid employees because of the price hike of essentials following the advance announcement of the Pay Scale.
