The DUJ will also hold similar rallies in all other units in preparation of its three-hour token strike in all newspapers and news agencies on Oct 12 in response to the call by the Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ).

Some 100 moot officials from across the country are participating in the course.

Bangabandhu Jubo Parishad

Bangabandhu Jubo Parishad has demanded to expedite the trial of the killers of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and his family members, reports BSS.

The demand was made at a meeting of the Dhaka city unit of the Parishad with its joint convenor Monirul Islam Babul in the chair.

The meeting welcomed the ban on public meetings on the city streets and expressed concern about the BNP-called road and rail blockade programme tomorrow.

Parishad leaders Rezaul Karim Khan Reza, M Ataur Rahman, Mahmudur Rahman Khokon, A S M Hanif, Shamim Siddique and Rezaul Islam Bared addressed the meeting, said a press release.

Peace For All

Masudul Hasan, Director of Peace For All, has been elected the regional representative for region of Asia-1 of International Peace Bureau, says a press release.

The election was held in Moscow on Sept 27 at the triennial assembly of the bureau.

Hasan will now work in the capacity of international counsellor of IPB on behalf of the 19-member organisation of five Asian countries.

AMDISA workshop begins today

A six-day regional workshop on 'Strategies for Financing Business and Management Schools in South Asia for heads of institutions' will begin in Rajendrapur today, says a press release.

The workshop is being organised by the Association of Management Development Institutions in South Asia (AMDISA), in cooperation with Association of Management Development Institutions of Bangladesh (AMDIB) with financial support of Commonwealth Fund for Technical Cooperation (CFTC) of Commonwealth Secretariat, London.

Some 25 directors of business schools and management development institutions of the SAARC countries are expected to participate in the workshop.

Prof Shah Monir Hossain, Director, Medical Education & Health Manpower Development Directorate of Health, Mohakhali, Dhaka, will preside over the inaugural session.

20 killed in police custody in 9 months

At least 20 people were killed in police custody during the last nine months in different parts of the country according to statistics of Odhikar, a coalition of human rights organisations.

The Odhikar data, based on newspaper reports, also showed that five women were raped by members of the law enforcing agencies.

Besides, at least four persons were killed and more than 1,300 people, including a photo-journalist, activists of different political parties and members of the Ansar, were injured in 'political repression,' according to Odhikar.

In its data the human rights organisation showed that more than one thousand persons, including women, were arrested by the law enforcing agencies during this nine month period.

Meanwhile, Odhikar, in a statement on Thursday, said the recent incidents proved that the government and the police administration have failed to take effective measures to check women repression by members of the law enforcing agencies.

The human rights body alleged that in some cases, senior police officials tried to suppress the incidents in which police personnel were involved in immoral acts.

The speakers at the rally said that unlike other countries of the world, the Drug (Control) Ordinance, 1982 recognised only the pharmacy graduates as experts in place of qualified persons.

The SCPJDPI announced an elaborate programme to press home their demands that include meeting the Health Minister on Oct 10, 1997, organising 'human chains' in all universities and university colleges on Oct 23, boycotting classes from Oct 26 to 30, observing strike by students of the faculty of science in all universities and university colleges on Nov 9, 10, 16 and 17; token hunger strike by students of the faculty of science in all universities and university colleges on Nov 9, 10, 16 and 17; token hunger strike till death from Dec 8 in front of the Prime Minister's Secretariat.

Graduates from non-pharmaceutical science disciplines with training in drug manufacturing have been designated as 'key personnel' in a recent recommendation by the World Health Organisation.

In most countries, people involved in drug manufacturing and standard control are identified as 'qualified persons'. The council leaders called for implementation of the provision in Bangladesh.

This existing provision protects the pharmacists from open competition in job application.

SCPJDPI brought out a procession after the rally and submitted a memorandum to the Prime Minister's Office.
