## River riding high

BUENOS AIRES, Oct 3: River Plate had a player sent off but still came from two goals behind to beat Racing Club 3-2 on Wednesday and stay top of the Argentine championship, reports Reuter.

Two goals by Martin Cardetti, signed at the start of the championship from Rosario Central, and one by defender Eduardo Berizzo in the last 25 minutes gave River their sixth win in seven games.

Ruben Capria and Marcelo Delgado had scored for lowly Racing, who have not won a domestic titles since 1966.

River are two points ahead of newly-promoted Argentinos Juniors, who won 1-0 away to Velez Sarsfield with a freak goal by Hector Gonzalez.

Gonzalez mis-hit an attempted cross but the ball went through the legs of Paraguayan goalkeeper Jose Luis Chilavert and into the net to end Velez's unbeaten run.

## Rushd, Ratna reap rich

## BKSP finish fabulously

#### Mirpur yesterday.

On the final day of the three-day meet which saw five more records tumble events held, BKSP won ten golds and raised their haul to 48 in the 87-event championships.

Kushtha, who earned only one gold, emerged runners up with 13 golds followed by Ansars with 12 golds.

Ibne Rushd and Ratna Khatun both from BKSP, who had already made four marks in the previous two days, again set one more new record each to have the honour of setting five records apiece in the meet.

Rushd of 13-14 age-group, who already won six golds in the first two days, made his fifth record on Friday in the 100m freestyle winning the event in one minute 00.63 seconds. The previous record was one minute 02.17 seconds.

Ratna, the tiny girl of 11-12 age-group who set records in 200m freestyle, 200m individual medley, 100m backstroke and 100m freestyle, added yet another to her credit when she won the 50m freestyle gold in two minutes 37.04 seconds shattering the previous record of 2 minutes 39 seconds. It was Ratna's fifth gold so far.

Rushd and Ratna apart, Jewel Ahmed of BKSP, a swimmer of 15-17 age-group who

## China beat Saudi Arabia

BEIJING, Oct 3: China kept their World Cup hopes alive with a 1-0 win over Saudi Arabia in a rain-soaked Asian Group A match Friday, reports AP.

Defender Zhang Enhua headed the winning ball past Saudi Arabian goalkeeper Mohammed Al-Al-Daye in the 69th minute off a corner. China dominated much of the second half and held off some late Saudi Arabian challenges for the win.

Youssef Al-Thiyyani squandered Saudi Arabia's best chance by firing a free kick off the crossbar from just outside the box in the 82nd minute. Midfielder Khalid Al-Temawi also shot wide from the right of the penalty area in the 33rd minute.

China played very well in the second half. Saudi Arabian head coach Nilo Vingada told the official Xinhua News Agency.

"Players are not computers and they could make mistakes. The whole team was responsible for the loss," he said.

The match was played in rain in front of 30,000 spectators at the Jinzhou Stadium in the northeastern city of Dalian. China now have four points from three qualifying matches.

The two sides meet again November 6 in Saudi Arabia.

## Pabna record big win
