Karachi KARACHI, Oct 4: Two Bangladesh nationals employed in the Pakistani fishing industry were shot dead overnight in a coastal area here, police said today, reports

Some guards of the owner of a private fishing business were allegedly involved in the shooting, but the reason was not immediately known, the police

Three suspects have been taken into custody in connection with the incident, which took place in the city's eastern district of Landhi, they said.

Prime Group shuts its units indefinitely

From Our Correspondent NARAYANGANJ, Oct 4: The management of Prime Group has shut down its industrial units at Nandalalpur under Fatuliah thana for an indefinite period this morning.

The decision was taken under the provisions of the labour employment law of 1965 and announced the mills' closure until further order, a company official said.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday asked her party leaders and workers to work for establishing people's right to food ignoring opposition's negative politics of destruction, terrorism and anarchy, reports UNB.

Non-govt teachers on strike

Lakhs of primary students deprived of schooling

By Staff Correspondent

Lakhs of students of nongovernment primary schools are now deprived of schooling as 92 thousand teachers are on strike from October 1 demanding nationalisation of those schools.

Their strike is scheduled to continue till October 20.

There are over 28,000 nongovernment primary schools in the country. Out of this figure, 23,000 are registered with the government. The registration qualifies the schools to get a meager government grant to pay the teachers. On an average, a government

primary school teacher gets Tk 1,050 per month as basic salary and other benefits. A teachers of a non-government primary school receives an amount equivalent to only 71 per cent of the basic salary of a govern-

ment school teacher and no other benefit. The percentage comes down to 61 if his school is below five years old and 51 per cent if it is below three years old, according to sources in the Non-government Primary School Teachers Association. The government in 1990 also set a maximum ceiling of four teachers for each non-government school who would get this salary. The only other government help a registered non-government primary school gets per month is Tk 30 for contingency such as chalk and duster.

"This is outright discrimination. We are doing the same job with same time table, syllabus and surroundings but our pay is so much different," said Badiuzzaman Akand, a non-government primary school teacher of
