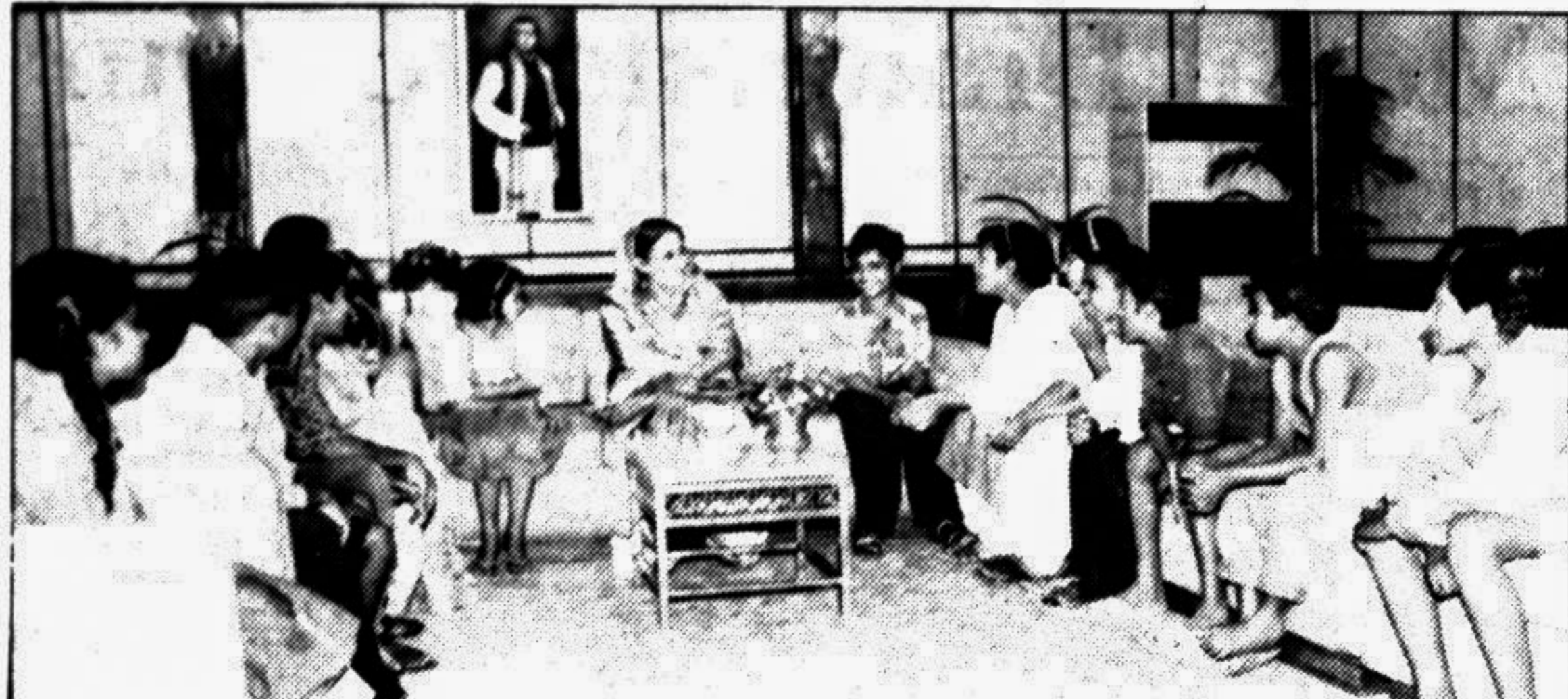

Street children tell their woes to PM on TV programme

A unique programme was presented by Bangladesh Television (BTV) last evening where the Prime Minister talked to a group of street urchins who are surviving by waging a continuous battle against many odds and obstacles, reports UMB.

The helpless but resolute street children told Sheikh Hasina their tales of woes and sought her help for their education and care on the half-hour programme. "Shishuder Mukhomukhi" (face-to-face with children).

Sagar, who is working as a restaurant boy, told the Prime Minister about the misery of his life, his struggle and his dream for the future.

Ruby, who is working as a maid at a house in the capital, said she had lost her father in a village clash and now worked for food.

"But they don't give me adequate food, they beat me and give me a lot of work to do," said the crying little girl, aged about eight, expressing her desire to study and play.

Billal, aged about 10, said he spends the night under the porch of the Parliament Building, and survives by selling chocolate and chewing gum in the adjoining areas.

The boy said he attends an NGO-run school and wants to be a government officer after completing his studies.

Tempo helper Alauddin, who is at school, also wanted the scope for further study. He wants to be a doctor to serve the nation, he told the PM.

Abed, another small boy who earns his livelihood by breaking bricks in the city, wanted the Prime Minister to explain who are the children she meant as the future of nation. "Are we those children, or are they the offsprings of rich people?" he asked.

The Prime Minister was visibly moved listening to the sad tales of the hapless children and said these were the realities of the country.

These street children are faced with endless problems, they face torture, they have no food and shelter, and they are growing up without care and affection, Hasina said.

"As the head of government, I have a responsibility to take care of these children and thousands others like them, but it is not possible for me alone to take care of all of them," the Prime Minister said and urged the affluent and conscious section of society to come forward in aid of the helpless urchins.

She added, "If one well-to-do family takes the responsibility of one child then lakhs of children will get shelter and food, get the opportunity of education."

The Prime Minister assured the children during the TV programme that her government would do its best to nurture their dreams.

"We must do something for them so that they can survive with their beautiful dreams, so that their dreams do not die," she said calling upon all to work for the welfare of the children.

Affluent section of society urged to help children

Post and Telecommunications and Housing and Works Minister Mohammad Nasim yesterday called upon the affluent section of the society to come forward with a helping hand for the distressed and neglected children, reports BSS.

The minister was addressing the concluding session of the "World Child Day and Child Rights Week-97" as chief guest at Shishu Academy.

Nasim said all children have equal rights to grow as healthy citizen, no matter where he or she is born or lives.

Presided over by Begum Ivy Rahman, chairman, Jatiya Mohila Sangstha, State Minister for Youth and Sports and Cultural Affairs Obaidul Qader, and director of Shishu Academy Golam Kibria, among others, spoke on the occasion.

Three tiny tots Swaraj, Kakon and Nancy also had the privilege to address the function.

The minister said that the present government attaches top priority to the proper development of children and women.

In this regard he referred to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's selection of a day in a year to spend among the children of the country. He said Sheikh Hasina has special sympathy for the distressed children as she had lost her minor brother Russel in a brutal killing in 1975.

Occupied link-road in Motijheel cleared

The link-road in Motijheel, occupied by a group of people last month, has been cleared of all obstacles, except for dozens of roadside restaurants.

A group of people had occupied the link-road behind Sonali Bank headquarters and built several shops there, claiming that it was leased out to them by the Land Reforms Board under Ministry of Land.

They also put up three separate signboards which read 'Bangladesh Sramik League', 'Awami Jubo League Motijheel Unit' and 'Court of Wards under Ministry of Land'.

The Land Reforms Board had admitted leasing the land, saying it was the custodian of the land, which had once belonged to Nawab Sir Salimullah.

State Minister for Land Rashed Mosharrar intervened following reports published in the national dailies and asked the LRB to immediately cancel the lease and free the thoroughfare of all obstacles.

Yesterday, the road was found clear and all the signboards removed. But owners of a makeshift restaurant by the side of the road said they had been there too long to be evicted. "We have been here for more than ten years, so we have the right to do business here," claimed a restaurant worker.

Road divider at Manik Mia Avenue to be completed in six weeks

Despite a severe cash crisis, Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) has taken up work to construct an island on the road in Manik Mia Avenue in the city.

The work on the divider started Thursday involving about Tk 20 lakh. DCC sources claimed the divider would not only beautify the area but also provide safety to pedestrians crossing the wide road.

The planned island will be 10-feet wide splitting the one-km long and 60-metre wide Manik Mia Avenue road into two sections. The construction is expected to be completed within one and half months, according to sources in the City Builders (Pvt) Ltd., the company given the contract.

The decision to build a series of dividers in the city comes at a time when accumulated arrears of several hundred DCC contractors remain unpaid due to fund constraints.

On September 15, about 200 angry DCC contractors besieged the acting Chief Engineer's office at Nagar Bhaban demanding payment of their arrears. Two persons were arrested after the Mayor's private secretary sustained minor injuries in a scuffle that broke out inside the engineer's office.

A top DCC official said last night that construction of the Manik Mia Avenue road divider was part of a package programme taken up by the DCC six months ago.

"The traffic division of the city put forward its recommendations to the DCC in a series of meetings held earlier in the year and the DCC has set out to do the job," the official said.

He added that under the same development programme several link roads, and over-bridges would be built in the city.

The official denied that the DCC was having a fund crisis at the moment and said, "within the last one month just see how much area we have cleared, there is hardly any outstanding bills for the current year," he claimed.

Meanwhile, DCC's Contractors' Association, in a press release last night said that the DCC has come out of the fund problem and was taking steps to pay off the arrears.

US envoy meets Speaker

The US ambassador to Bangladesh John C Holzman called on Speaker Humayun Rasheed Chowdhury at his Sangsad Bhaban office yesterday, reports BSS.

During the meeting they discussed various issues of bilateral interest including matters relating to functioning of Bangladesh Parliament and its committees.

Secretary of the parliament secretariat Quazi Md Manzur-e-Mowla was present on the occasion.
