Lewis shows Golota no mercy

ATLANTIC CITY, New Jersey, Oct 5 (AFP): Britain's Lennox Lewis never looked so much like a champion. Andrew Golota never knew what hit him.

Lewis stopped his Polish rival in 95 seconds, the sixth-quickest route in heavyweight history, to keep the World Boxing Council crown Saturday, putting himself in position to fight for a unified world title in 1998.

"Basically I wanted to go out and make my statement to the world that I am the best heavyweight I wanted to intimidate everyone else," Lewis said. "I wanted to go out and prove myself, not worry about him."

Lewis rose to 32-1 while Golota fell to 28-3 with his third loss in a row. Golota was hospitalised and needed oxygen after the fight following what Golota manager Lou Duva called an anxiety attack.

Lewis sent a message to his possible unification foes, rival champions Evander Holyfield and Michael Moore, who fight next month in Las Vegas.

Lewis received four million dollars for the fight. Golota received 1.75 million dollars.

Half-marathon meet Kenyan men on a roll

KOSICE, Slovakia, Oct 5: Kenya's men excelled Saturday at the World Half-Marathon Championship, sweeping the individual medals and earning the team gold, reports AP.

Romania's women took the team title.

Shem Kororia won gold, beating Moses Tanui — who holds the world best mark 59:47. Their respective times of 59:56 minutes and 59:58 minutes were the first time the top two finished under an hour at any championship.

Kenneth Cheruyot placed third, finishing in 1 hour flat.

"Today, we needed to win," Tanui said. "Kenya simply wanted to be the best."

Kororia was surprised at his victory. "We have a very strong team but I didn't really think I would win this race," he said.

On the women's side, Tegla Loroupe proved trust in her was well founded. Though put on the Kenyan team only a little more than a week ago, she finished first in a time of 1 hour 8.14 seconds.

"Winning at the World Championship was my biggest dream," she said.

Romanian Cristina Pomacu and Lidia Simon were second and third, in 1:08:43 and 1:09:05 respectively. Other strong Romanian women finishers gave them the team victory with a total time of 3:27:40 hours, ahead of the Kenyans and Japanese.

First-place finishers over the 21.097 kilometers received 40,000 dollars. The purse was 20,000 dollars for second place and 15,000 dollars for third.

UEFA decision upsets Spartak

MOSCOW, Oct 5: Spartak Moscow president Oleg Romantsev on Saturday accused some officials in European soccer's governing body of bias against Russian clubs, reports Reuters.

Romantsev, who is also chief coach, lashed out at Friday's decision by UEFA's Control and Disciplinary Committee to re-play Spartak's first-round second-leg UEFA Cup match against Sion of Switzerland because the goals in the Moscow leg were too short.

"It's a pure provocation," Romantsev told reporters after Spartak beat Lokomotiv Nizhny Novgorod 3-2 in a Russian Premier league match.

"It's a big disadvantage for some of Europe's elite clubs to play against us from a financial point of view. Therefore some UEFA officials are purposely trying to eliminate the Russian clubs from European competition and for that reason they are instructing referees to be biased against us."

UEFA officials were not immediately available for comment.

Spartak defeated Sion 3-2 on aggregate after a 1-0 win in Switzerland and a 2-2 draw in Moscow, but the Swiss side complained that the goals at the Lokomotiv Stadium were 12 cms short.



Cronje counts on quicks




RAWALPINDI, Pakistan, Oct 5: The jinx on South Africa's cricketers in Pakistan looks set to continue as thunderstorms threaten to wash out the start of their first Test match tomorrow, reports Reuters.

The South Africans have visited Pakistan twice before but only for one-day tournaments — and lost on both occasions.

In 1994-95, they played a triangular series which was won by Australia and returned last year for the World Cup in which they were eliminated by the West Indies in the quarter-finals.

"Yes, we have bitter memories of Pakistan because of our previous two disappointments," South African skipper Hansie Cronje said, although his side did manage to beat Pakistan in a group match during the World Cup.

And now downpours have left the outfield in Rawalpindi drenched with weathermen

predicting more of the same. "I hope there is no rain but it seems to chase us wherever we go," South African manager, S K Raddy, lamented.

Although South Africa have been short of luck in Pakistan they have dominated on home soil. Even so, the hosts are refusing to be overawed.

South Africa won a one-off Test the last time these two nations met in South Africa by a massive 324 runs.

But Pakistan captain Saheed Anwar, who scored just 2 and 1 in that Test, said, "That Test match is history now. At present, we are confident after beating India 2-1 in the one-day series."

Despite fears of rain, the South Africans were quick to announce their lineup but the Pakistanis held back their side. The tourists have packed their bowling attack with four seamers in Allan Donald, Shaun Pollock, Brian McMillan and Brett Schultz. Pat Symcox is the only spinner while the batting responsibilities will be shouldered by Gary Kirsten, Adam Bacher, Daryll Cullinan, Hansie Cronje and Jacques Kallis.

"The intentions are very clear. We will attack and try for the kill," Cronje said, adding, "The team has been picked after a look at it (the pitch). I think it is a sporting track."

"Even if the wicket is shaved off, we will have a bowling attack capable of routing Pakistanis twice in a match," Reddy said.



Courier clinches China Open title

BEIJING, Oct 5: Top seed Jim Courier of the United States beat Magnus Gustafsson in three sets to claim the men's singles championship of the 328,000-dollar China Open ATP event here today, report agencies.

Courier finished off the fifth-seeded Swede 7-6 (12-10), 3-6, 6-3.

India's Davis Cup duo, Leander Paes and Mahesh Bhupathi clinched the doubles title defeating Americans Courier and Alex O'Brien in straight sets 7-5, 7-6 (9-7).

The top-seeded Indian pair, ranked fifth in the world, continued their fine run and didn't allow the experience of Courier, the former world number one, and O'Brien to bother them much on their way to eighth doubles title and fifth this year.

The Americans fought every inch of the battle before conceding the first set 5-7, but Paes and Bhupathi, playing some fine doubles matches recently including one against Chile in the Davis Cup World Group play-off last month, were equal to the task taking the second set tie-breaker 7-6 (9-7) to signal yet another triumph in the doubles circuit.

Fast guns go into final

BASEL, Switzerland, Oct 5: Mark Philippoussis and Greg Rusedski, the fastest servers in tennis, both won their semifinals Saturday to set up an intriguing showdown in the million-dollar Swiss Indoor ATP Tour tennis tournament, reports AFP.

Australian Philippoussis downed Britain's Tim Henman 7-6 (7/2), 6-4 to end hopes of an all-British final but Henman's fourth-seeded compatriot Rusedski then scored a thrilling 6-7 (5/7), 6-3, 7-5 win over seventh-seeded Czech player Petr Korda.

US Open semifinalist Rusedski, who has made at least the quarterfinals in each of his last six tournaments, hammered the 19th aced in a desperately tight battle between two left-handers.

Rusedski improved his record against southpaws this year to 8-3.

The first Briton ever to crack the top 10 in the world rankings, he kept his nerve to play his way out of several tight shots against the experienced Korda.

Korda won the first set tie-breaker with a backhand passing shot down the line but Rusedski hit back impressively, breaking his foe's serve three

times in the second set.

The decisive set went with serve until the 12th and final game when Rusedski broke Korda again to seal his win in just a shade over two hours.

It was a deserved victory after he dropped serve only once in the match.

Rusedski has now won 21 of his last 26 matches and he believes new coach Tony Pickard — who has taken over from Brian Teacher — is helping him with his motivation.

"It's been great and his tactical advice is excellent," Rusedski said.

Philippoussis, meanwhile, reached a final for the second straight week when he beat Henman.

The 20-year-old Australian, who lost to Germany's Nicolas Pietrangeli in the Toulouse tournament final in France last week, triumphed in 1 hr, 27 min.

Henman dropped serve for the first time in 24 games at this tournament in the third game of the second set.

Philippoussis then rode his luck to go 3-1 up when Henman was twice beaten by net cords.

Henman was unable to break back and Philippoussis served out the match in the 10th.

Philippoussis took the first set 7-2 in a tie-breaker when Henman netted the Australian's

second serve. Philippoussis had broken Henman with a great backhand drop shot to go 2-1 up and Henman dropped serve twice in a row to allow the Australian to force 5-2 ahead.

The Briton had been forced to save a set point at 5-4 down in the 10th game when he put away a crisp volley at the net as the Australian stretched to reach Henman's deep serve.

But it was Philippoussis who had first been in trouble on his serve when he survived three break points in the third game which went to five deuces.

The Australian showed his class in the 11th game when he slid in to scoop a low forehand over for the game as Henman's drop shot appeared to have won the point.

There was very little in that rally — but that was the pattern of the entire match.

"Against someone like Philippoussis you don't get those chances," it said to take those chances. "That's a disappointing Henman."

The final, with a 138,000-dollar first prize at stake, will start today.

Rusedski expects it to be "a matter of a few points here and there." "I won our only previous match — at Wimbledon in June — and I hope to continue the sequence."

Brenda gives Dutch hope

DEN BOSCH, Oct 5: Inspired by a fanatical 8,000-strong crowd, Dutch number one Brenda Schultz-McCarthy upset France's Mary Pierce 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 Sunday to put the Dutch back in contention in the Fed Cup final, reports AP.

The Dutch trail 2-1 after three of the final's five matches with a singles and a doubles match still to play.

Schultz-McCarthy had to come from behind to beat the higher-ranked Frenchwoman.

Playing poised and controlled tennis, Pierce took the first set with a single service break in the ninth game.

But with the increasingly noisy crowd lifting her, and her powerful service beginning to find its range, Schultz-McCarthy battled back in a seaws second set, which she won 6-3, breaking Pierce twice and losing her serve once.

World number eight Pierce had beaten the big serving Dutchwoman ranked 15, in five of their six meetings before Sunday.

Pierce made the stronger Sicilian Open Berasategui's

PALERMO, Oct 5: Spain's Alberto Berasategui breezed past the inexperienced Dominik Hrbaty in straight sets Sunday to win the Sicilian Open for his first title of the year, reports AP.

No 2 seed Berasategui, who also captured this 328,000-dollar clay court tournament in 1994, needed only an hour to beat Hrbaty, the sixth seed, 6-4, 6-2.

Berasategui, who lost in the final at Marbella, Spain, last month, now has 13 career singles titles. He's currently 27th in the ATP rankings.

It was the first career ATP final for Hrbaty, a 19-year-old Slovakian ranked 44th. He upset top seed Alex Corretja and third seed Albert Portas en route to the final.

Gatti retains IBF crown

ATLANTIC CITY, New Jersey, Oct 5: American Arturo Gatti stopped Mexico's Gabriel Ruelas in the fifth round here Saturday to retain the International Boxing Federation (IBF) junior lightweight title, reports AFP.

Gatti rose to 29-1 when referee Benji Esteves halted the bout two minutes and 22 seconds into round five.

"I knew this fight would be very hard," Gatti said. "He took a lot out of me at the beginning. It was a very hard fight. He really hurt me in the fourth round."
