Chilavert misses the target

Buenos Aires, Oct 6: Paraguayan goalkeeper Jose Luis Chilavert missed a penalty on Sunday as Velez Sarsfield lost 3-2 to San Lorenzo in an explosive Argentine championship match which saw four players sent off, reports Reuters.

Chilavert, who has scored three penalties in the championship, this time saw his effort saved by rival Oscar Pasetti in the 65th minute, with San Lorenzo leading 3-1.

Earlier, Chilavert had been on the wrong end when Nestor Gorosito converted a penalty to fire San Lorenzo in front. Martin Posse equalised but Uruguayan Sebastian Abreu put San Lorenzo back ahead before halftime and Gabriel Montenegro increased their lead early in the second half.

Damian Manusovich and Eduardo Tozzio of San Lorenzo and Martin Gomez and Federico Dominguez of Velez were the players shown the red card.

Leaders River Plate beat Gimnasia-Salta 2-0 while on Saturday Boca Juniors, playing their third game without injured Diego Maradona, won 3-0 at Gimnasia-Jujuy.

Hodde jets Owen train with the boys

LONDON, Oct 6: Liverpool's teenage sensation Michael Owen joined up with the England squad's training session today as coach Glenn Hodde began the countdown for the crunch clash with Italy in Rome next Saturday, reports AFP.

The 17-year-old boy wonder has made an enormous impression on the England coach since his arrival on the premiership scene in the final two weeks of last season.

He has continued to impress this term, initially filling in for Robbie Fowler and then keeping German striker Karlheinz Riedle out of the team until Sunday's 4-2 win over Chelsea.

France's first Fed Cup



DEN BOSCH, Netherlands, Oct 6: France won the Fed Cup for the first time on Sunday here beating the Netherlands 4-1 after sharing the reverse singles and winning the doubles, reports Reuters.

It was France's first appearance in a Fed Cup final and also a personal triumph for the flamboyant Yannick Noah who was named Fed team coach earlier this year after having led his country's men's team to Davis Cup triumph.

It was the second defeat for the Dutch in two finals. They were beaten by Australia in 1968.

The French had won both opening singles on Saturday but hard-hitting Brenda Schultz-McCarthy revived Dutch hopes by toppling France's leading player Mary Pierce 4-6, 6-3, 6-4 in the first reverse singles.

Sandrine Testud clinched the decisive victory by disposing of Miriam Oremans in the final singles.

Nathalie Tauziat and Alexandra Fusai put the icing on the cake by beating the Dutch doubles pairing Caroline Vis and Mahon Bollegraf 6-3, 6-4.

World number one Andre Agassi, who had also won all four previous encounters with France, fought back from a torrid opening set to win 6-6, 6-3, 6-3.

"She started unbelievably strong and I was not playing at all. It was no match but I told myself 'it will all come back' and the match really only started for me in the second set," Testud said.

Oremans swept through the

first set in 23 minutes but Testud came out more aggressively in the second set, setting the tone with a service break in the first game.

"It was very important for me to get the break early in the second set," Testud said.

Testud kept her cool despite several disputed line calls in the eight game and broke again

'98 Davis Cup

Sweden, USA top seeds

LONDON, Oct 6: Sweden and the United States, who will face each other next month for the Davis Cup title, were named joint top seeds Monday for the 1998 competition, reports AP.

Australia and Spain shared the next two spots followed by the Czech Republic and Italy sharing the fifth and sixth seeds, with the last two seeded positions going to Germany and the Netherlands.

The other eight countries in next year's Davis Cup World Group are: Belgium, Brazil, India, Russia, Slovakia, South Africa, Switzerland and Zimbabwe.

The draw for 1998 will be made Wednesday in London by the Davis Cup Committee of the International Tennis Federation.

The top seeds in other Davis Cup groups are: Euro/African Zone 1 — France and Britain (joint top seeds), Austria, Romania (joint third and fourth).

American Zone 1 — Chile, Mexico (joint top seeds), Asia/Oceania Zone 1 — South Korea, New Zealand (joint top seeds).

for the set in the ninth.

Testud quickly carved out a 4-1 lead in the final set after saving two break-points by Oremans, who twice threw down her racket in disgust over missed opportunities.

Testud saved another Oremans break-point in the seventh game and converted her third match point when Oremans hit a forehand into the net.

Afterwards she was fulsome in her praise of Noah. "He pushed me to give the best of myself... I knew that even in a difficult situation, he was always there," Testud said.

Pierce had been clear favourite against Schultz-McCarthy but had only herself to blame for the defeat after repeatedly squandering break-point chances in the final set.

World number eight Pierce, who was clearly unhappy with some line calls in the closing stages of the final set, hit a forehand marginally wide on Schultz-McCarthy's second match-point.

"It's difficult to accept that I did what I could and still lost but sometimes that happens when the other girl plays unbelievably well," Pierce said.

She said Schultz's booming serve had made it difficult for her to find her rhythm.

Pierce held break-point in the sixth and eighth games of the final set but saw them go to waste either through Schultz-McCarthy's thunderous serves or her own lacklustre play on some crucial points.

She won a brief stay of execution by saving a first match-point in the 10th game but again wasted two break-point before succumbing on the second match-point.

Kuala Lumpur Sixes 8-member team leaves Oct 9

An eight-member Bangladesh cricket team will fly to Malaysia early Thursday to participate in the two-day Kuala Lumpur Sixes tournament starting on October 11.

A total of ten teams including three foreign will be split into two groups for the first round robin league. Top two finishers from each group will qualify for the final of the five-over-a-side tourney.

The winners will receive a cash award worth 8,000 Malaysian ringits (around 1,10,000 taka) while the runners-up will be richer by 4,000 ringits. Besides the third team will earn 1000 ringits.

Bangladesh have been placed in Group B along with three provincial sides Johore, Manza and Federal Territory and Melayu Malaysia. The other group comprises Singapore, Selangor, Penang, Air Lanka and HSSI.

Bangladesh will open against Manza on the first day. They play two more matches against Melayu Malaysia and Federal Territory later in the day.

The last first round match against Johore will be held on the following morning.

Swiss Indoors Rusedski's

LONDON, Oct 6: Greg Rusedski, already the highest-ranked British player since the ATP Tour computer rankings were set up in 1973, climbed to an all-time high of No. 4 on Monday following his second tournament victory of the year, reports AP.

The Canadian-born Rusedski, 24, who started the season as Britain's No. 2 behind Tim Henman, jumped from No. 10 to fourth after beating Mark Philippoussis on Sunday to win the Swiss Indoors in Basel.

Only Americans Pete Sampras and Michael Chang, and Australian Patrick Rafter are ranked higher.

Not since pre-war days when Fred Perry and Bunny Austin reached No. 1 and 2 in the then unofficial world rankings has a British player been so highly regarded.

I want to be up there in the same category as Perry and the other guys who have been champions through the years," said Rusedski, who began his surge by finishing runner-up to Rafter in the US Open.

Rusedski, a quarterfinalist at Wimbledon, won the Nottingham Open in June and reached three other finals this year.

Rusedski, who owns the fastest serve in the game has earned 1,258,473 dollar this season to bring his career earnings to 2,380,814 dollars.

Cesare beefs up midfield

ROME, Oct 6: Italy coach Cesare Maldini added some insurance at mid-field but otherwise made no surprise callups Saturday in naming players for next weekend's crucial World Cup qualifier against England, reports AP.

Sticking to his policy of continuity, Maldini will use the same core of players he has chosen since taking over as coach last year. His son, Paolo, will anchor the defense. Demetrio Al Bertini will motor the midfield and Gianfranco Zola will spearhead the attack.

Maldini added extra back-ups at midfield, where Roberto di Matteo and Antonio Conte are unavailable. Di Matteo is suspended after a red card in Italy's last qualifier — a lacklustre 0-0 draw in Georgia — while Conte has an inflamed left Achilles tendon.

Luigi Di Biagio and Eusebio di Francesco, both with AS Roma in the Italian First Division, bring depth to that department and will compete with Attilio Lombardo for a starting spot alongside Albertini, Angelo Di Livio and Dino Zoff. Roberto Baggio, who's not related to Dino, was not placed on the 22-player roster.

Inter run comes to halt



LONDON, Oct 6 (Reuters): Ajax Amsterdam and Barcelona extended their unbeaten starts to the season to nine and five matches respectively on Sunday while in Italy Inter Milan lost theirs and AC Milan finally managed a win at the fifth attempt.

Italy claimed their first league victory five games into the season as substitute Andreas Andersson's header proved decisive against promoted Empoli.

Leaders Inter were held to a 1-1 home draw by Lazio. A Ronaldo penalty cancelled out Pavel Nedved's opener for the Romans.

The draw ended Inter's 100 per cent record but they stay top with 13 points, two ahead of Roma, Parma and Juventus.

Argentine striker Abel Balbo scored a hatrick as Roma crushed Napoli 6-2 to move up to second while Juventus fought back from a goal down to beat Fiorentina 2-1.

It was the first time Fiorentina's Argentine striker Gabriel Batistuta had failed to score in seven league and cup matches since the start of the season.

It was a bad weekend for former national hero Roberto

Baggio. He found out on Saturday that he was not in the national squad to face England in Rome next weekend and on Sunday was sent off for a late tackle as his new club Bologna were held to a goalless draw at Piacenza.

ENGLAND

Czech striker Patrick Berger scored a hatrick as Liverpool overwhelmed 10-man Chelsea 4-2 on Sunday. The game swung Liverpool's way in the 26th minute when, with the score at 1-1 Chelsea's French defender Bernard Lambourde was sent off for his second bookable offence.

SPAIN

Two goals from Oscar Garcia helped Barcelona to a hard-fought 3-2 win over Tenerife in the Nou Camp. The hosts had trailed 2-1 and manager Louis van Gaal was booed by the fans until Luis Enrique hit the winner in the second half.

It was their fifth victory in five games this season and gives them a four-point lead over Mallorca who were held 2-2 at Compostela.

Third-placed Celta Vigo continued their good start with a 4-1 win over Salamanca to also move to 11 points. Real Madrid are back in fourth place on goal difference after being held to a goalless home draw by Deportivo Coruna.

Real missed a hatful of

chances including a penalty — Davor Suker's spot-kick being saved by Jacques Songu.

NETHERLANDS

Ajax stretched their 100 per cent record to nine games with a 1-0 win at Willem II Tilburg, courtesy of an early goal by Michael Laudrup.

With 27 points from nine games Ajax are already eight clear of PSV, who handed Heerenveen their second successive defeat — 3-1 on Saturday.

Twente Enschede are third on 18 after beating Groningen 2-0 while Feyenoord are fourth — one of three teams on 17 — following their 2-1 home win over Nac Breda.

FRANCE

League leaders Metz lost their first game of the season as Strasbourg capped a fine week with a 2-0 win.

Strasbourg, who knocked Glasgow Rangers out of the UEFA Cup on Tuesday, had previously managed only one league win in nine games. Second half goals from Pascal Nouma and Olivier Dacourt did the damage.

Metz stay top on 23 points with PSG two points behind after a 0-0 draw at Nancy. Bordeaux are in third place on goal difference after winning 1-0 at Montpellier.

Mexico closer to coast



MEXICO CITY, Oct 6: Mexico have scored a hatrick as El Salvador 5-0 on Sunday to leave themselves on the brink of a place at next year's World Cup finals and severely dent the chances of their opponents, reports agencies.

Three goals in an eight-minute spell midway through the first half destroyed El Salvador after Mexico, who need only two points from four games to qualify, had missed an early penalty.

Mexico lead the final stage of the CONCACAF qualifiers with 14 points from six games, while El Salvador are fourth with nine points from eight, one point behind the United States and three adrift of surprise package Jamaica. The top three teams qualify for France.

"With this victory and the difference in goals, we are already practically in the World Cup in France," said Mexican manager Bora Milutinovic.

But forward Alberto Garcia Aspe, who scored one of Mexico's goals, urged his team "to obtain all the points possible and show its best soccer" in the squad's remaining four qualifying games.

Mexico drew first blood at the 30-minute mark, when Benjamin Galindo tapped a soft shot into the Salvador goal.

Aspe upped the score to 2-0 at

the 35-minute mark, and Galindo followed up on a penalty in the 38th minute to bring the score to 3-0 at the half.

A disorganised Salvadoran squad managed to penetrate Mexican defences only a few times with shots that were easily handled by Mexican goalkeeper Jorge Campos. Close defence coverage of Salvadoran forward Mauricio Cienfuegos neutralised the Salvadoran offence.

It was a rough day for Salvadoran goalkeeper Misael Alfaro, with Mexico's Roberto Alves 'Zague' scoring on a driving shot at 48th minute and Luis Garcia at 81. However, Alfaro was able to block a Mexican penalty kick early in the game.

Salvadoran manager Milovan Djoric criticised the work of Chilean official Eduardo Martinez Gamboa, saying he had "opened the way" for the Mexican goals by not calling two alleged penalties.

Djoric said he hopes to keep El Salvador's hopes alive by ending qualifying play at a 12-point tie with Jamaica and gain a berth on the basis of goals scored.

Mexico now top the CONCACAF with six games played, and need only a tie during their next match, an October 12 meeting with Canada in Edmonton, Alberta to qualify.

Sunday's game was played before an estimated 120,000 fans at Mexico City's Guillermo Canedo White stadium.

Russian spikers Euro champs

PRAGUE, Oct 6: Russia breezed through Croatia in three sets to capture the women's title of the European volleyball championship in Brno, Czech Republic, on Sunday, reports Xinhua.

The Russians cracked the Croat team 15-7 in the first set in 17 minutes. The Croats tried to turn the table in the second set, but they could not match the Russians powerful spikes and had to settle a set 12-15 in 32 minutes.

In the final set, Croatia jumped to a 5-1 lead, but the Russians quickly controlled the game and won the rubber 15-9.

Rajbari rowing

RAJBARI, Oct 6: A three-day rowing competition organised by Rajbari District Sports Association, concluded Sunday at Godabaraz ghat on the bank of the Padma, reports UNB.

The Pabna Akheri Hamla team emerged champion and Pabna Shapla became runner-up.
