More than 2.5 lakh rickshaws are illegally plying on the city roads which can cope with only about 80,000 such manually driven three-wheelers carrying valid licence plates, according to Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) officials.

The officials said they were unable to control the number of rickshaws in the city as no high-level decision was taken to solve the problem. For a clampdown on this massive irregularity, they needed to come down on the streets and confiscate the illegal rickshaws. This could not be done until the higher echelon of the DCC took a policy decision, they said.

"There is a total reluctance on the part of the decision makers to clampdown on illegal rickshaws." said a DCC official seeking anonymity. Several recommendations from the rel-

ingly by parliament on September 27 with the support of many old-guard politicians who had initially opposed it but buckled under heavy pressure from the public and pro-democracy

Thailand has seen 17 military coups since it switched from absolute monarchy to a parliamentary system in 1932. and the political system has been weakened by a series of shaky and short-lived govern-

Under the new charter the prime minister, members of the cabinet and parliament, senators, political appointees and local administrators must constantly declare their assets and liabilities.

The first disclosure must be made when they take office, the second 30 days after they leave office and the third one year
