25pc pier heads of JIMB found defective

Design defects in the Jamuna Multipurpose Bridge (JMB) superstructure were detected in December last year. which necessitated some major changes in the original design. extra work and reinforcement but no extra costs on the part of the government, official sources said.

They said about 25 per cent of the constructed pier heads were found structurally defective, following which some changes were brought about in

the design. In all, there are 49 pier head units on which the huge structure stands. The changes in design were

needed to strengthen these "defective" pier head units, they said. An expert said that each de-

fective pier head unit will require an additional beam to be placed underneath. "A total of seven or eight beams will be required to further strengthen the pier head unit," he added.

According to him, seven or

eight pier head units have shown structural cracks, which can be corrected by strengthening the pier head with extra
