# Yarygin dies in car crash

MOSCOW, Oct 13: Former Olympic freestyle wrestling heavyweight champion Ivan Yarygin was killed in a car crash at the weekend, Itar-Tass news agency reported, reports Reuter.

Yarygin, 49, the Olympic gold medalist in 1972 and again in 1976, was president of the Russian Wrestling Federation.

Itar-Tass said Yarygin had died in hospital in southern Russia soon after the accident on Saturday night.

Another passenger was also killed while the driver and a third passenger were seriously injured.

### African Champs' League roundup

JOHANNESBURG, Oct 13 Goldfields of Ghana and Angolan upstarts Primeiro Agosto have emerged as likely candidates for the African Champions' League final after the North African stranglehold on the tournament crumbled in the weekend's group matches, reports Reuter.

Goldfields deposed Tunisia's Club African from the top of Group B with a 2-0 home win on Saturday and now share the lead with Ferroviario Maputo. who effectively ended the reign of defending champions Zamalek of Egypt with a 2-0 win

in Mozambique the same day. But Mozambicans have to travel away for their last two matches in the leagues, including a trip to Ghana in two weeks' time which could well clear Goldfields' route to the two-legged final against the



# Sino lifter sets new world marks

SHANGHAI, Oct 13: Chinese strongwoman Xing Fen bettered the world records en route to win the women's 46-kg category weightlifting title at the eighth national games here on Monday, reports Xinhua.

The Chinese woman of Guangdong province, snatched 85 kgs and jerked up 117.5 kgs for a total of 202.5 kgs, all surpassing the listed world marks in the event.

The original world mark of 81.5 kgs in snatch was set by her compatriot Jiang Yinsu in the second East Asian Games in Pusan early this year, the world record of 105.5 kgs in Jerk was created by Zing Fen herself at the Asian Weightlifting Cham-pionships in July 1997, while the two-lift combined world record of 185 kgs was set by another Chinese Guang Hong in April, 1996.

# Sam Bera bags rirst goid

JAKARTA, Oct 13: Indonesian veteran Richard Sam Bera began his final swim meet with his country's first gold in the pool at the South East Asian Games on Monday, while emerging star Rita Mariani added a second, reports AP.

Sam Bera, 26, won the men's 100-metre freestyle, delighting a home crowd which had been denied a medal in the pool on Sunday's opening night. Mariani, 18, was an impres-

sive winner of the 100-metre breaststroke as 18-time SEA Games gold medal winner Joscelin Yeo, of Singapore, finished third.

Mariani has just finished high school and national coach Lukman Niode believes she can make a splash at the 2000 Olympics.

She clocked 1 minute, 11.96 seconds to be 0.59 outside Yeo's meet record. Kathy Echiverri, of the Philippines, was second in 1:15.41 with Yeo laboring to the wall in 1:17.69. Mariani said she was moti-

vated by the opening night washout. "After that I wanted to know




