# 58 killed in Tangail bus plunge

TANGAIL, Oct 14: In the worst ever road accident in the country, at least 58 people were killed and 25 injured as an overloaded bus skidded off the road and sank in a deep ditch at Baghutia in Kalihati on the Tangail-Mymensingh highway this afternoon.

Those killed included nine women and 10 children. The principal of Sinduria College, two teachers of Kalihati College - Selim, 35, and Biswanath Pramanik, 60 — and manager of Didhalkandi branch of Janata Bank Abdur Razzak, 51, were also killed in the accident. The name of the principal of the college could not be known.

## EC announces schedule Election to 4,330 UPs in December

Election to 4,330 Union Parishads (UPs) out of the 4,468 in the country will be held in phases in December, the Election Commission (EC) announced yesterday. Election to the remaining

138 UPs will be held later. The EC also announced the schedule for the December elections.

The elections will begin on December 1 and continue till December 31. Polling will not be held on Fridays National Immunisation Day on December 7, the Victory Day December 16 — and the Christmas Day — December 25.

The date for submission of nomination papers is November 3, scrutiny of the papers will be held on November 4 and the date for withdrawal of those is November 12.

The EC has already requested the Home Ministry to take steps for arrest of the identified criminals, maintaining 'utmost caution' and to launch a countrywide drive for recovery of illegal arms immediately.

Opposition Leader Begum Khaleda Zia has threatened to sue the government on "treason charges" unless it abandons the "conspiracy to handover the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) to

Claiming that the Awami League government was planning to sign an accord for withdrawal of army from the CHT and enabling the "separatists to rule the area," the former prime minister said, "No independent country can go for such an

agreement. "The army must remain in the CHT to protect national integrity... As patriots, we can't accept such a treaty.... If necessary, we'll sue the government on treason charges....." the BNP Chairperson said. She was addressing an installation ceremony of CBA leaders of T&T Board at the T & T Bhaban premises in the city last night. "In the process, the entire Chittagong region will be

handed over to India." She also called upon "patriotic" citizens to "undo the government's evil design against the national integrity. The BNP chief also blamed
