LONDON, Oct 16: Former England cricket captain Ian Botham is being sued for more than 100,000 pounds (160,000 dollars) by his own lawyers, the BBC reported Wednesday, says

The firm, Swepstone Walsh, has drawn up a writ demanding the payment of legal bills relating to Botham's ill-fated libel action against Pakistani cricket legend Imran Khan, the BBC added.

Botham and former England colleague Allan Lamb sued Imran for libel last year, but lost the case.

Lamb, who used the same lawyers, is believed to have paid his costs in full.

Sources told the BBC that the writ stated: "The plaintiff's claim is for 105,200.57 pounds being the balance of the sum due and owing from the defendant Ian Botham to the plaintiff

Swepstone is also believed to be seeking interest on the sum. The BBC also reported that





HONG KONG, Oct 16: Former world number one Boris Becker on Wednesday denied media speculation that he was to leave his native Germany for the Spanish island of Majorca, reports Reuter. The popular German daily

Bild said on Sunday that Becker was ready to live on the Mediterranean island and had already found a school for his three-year-old son Noah. "It has been in the papers but

it is not true," said Becker, who is playing in an exhibition tournament in Hong Kong. "I have a number of places

around the world but it does not mean to say that when I buy something, automatically I am going to live there.

"I have bought a piece of land in Majorca, yes, but I do not know if that is all that important - many other Germans have that too. I am resident in Germany and I pay almost 70 per cent tax."

### Hartono given UN passport

JAKARTA, Oct 16: The United Nations Development Programme Thursday named former world badminton champion Rudy Hartono as its first goodwill ambassador in Indonesia, reports AP.

Hartono, 48, is also eighttime All England badminton champion and coached Indonesia's team that won a gold medal at the 1992 Barcelona Ol ympic Games.

UNDP resident representative, Ravi Rajan said Hartono would help the agency fight poverty in the world's fourth most populous nation.

Rajan said about 11 per cent of Indonesia's 200 million people are classified as poor nowadays compared with more than 60 per cent in the 1970s when Hartono was at the peak of his playing career.

Hartono said he would try to help young Indonesians over come poverty through badminton and other sports.
