



ZURICH, Oct 18: Lindsay Davenport strolled into the semifinals of the European Indoor tennis championships by crushing Venus Williams 6-0, 6-4 Friday, reports Reuter.

The all-American quarter final took just 55 minutes to complete with Davenport, the fourth seed and world number six, providing her teenage compatriot with a tennis lesson.

Davenport, who did not play her first match until Thursday and then was on court for less than 40 minutes when Natasha Zvereva retired from their second round clash with an injury, said she had been concerned about the little time she had spent on court.

"Sometimes playing a lot of matches is good and sometimes it can go the other way. said Davenport. "I can tell you I felt relaxed out there, fresh.

The Olympic champion made very few mistakes, particularly in the first set when she broke her 26th ranked opponent three times.

In the second set Williams began to show sings of life when she broke Davenport to level at 1-1, but Davenport refused to relinquish control, recording the decisive break at 5-4 then serving out the match to reach her fourth semifinal in seven tournaments.

Williams, who as won just one match since her appearance in the final of the US Open, admitted later that she was finding it hard to live up to expectations after her performance at Flushing Meadows.

"Maybe I should just forget about the US Open," said Williams, "Lindsay was serious about winning today, apparentily I wasn't.

Nathalie Tauziat of France. playing in her first tournament since the US Open, came back from a set down to book her place in the semifinals with a 4-6, 6-1, 7-5 win over Belgium's Sabine Applemans.
