Teachers were, however, present as usual, he added. Police said fish plates of the railway track was removed at Fatehabad point to block the

university-bound shuttle train. The shuttle train later reached the university without students after repairing the fish

plates, police said. The activists of All Party Students Unity (APSU) continued their siege for the third consecutive day today at the entry point of Road No. 1 of the university to press their demands that include exemplary pun-ishment to the killers of Bakul and allotment of seats on the basis of merit and faculty.

Meanwhile, some activists of Islami Chhatra Shibir went on rampage on Hathazari road near the university, damaging a police van and a few vehicles at 1-30 pm today in protest against yesterday's arrest of their leader Nasirullah, police

About financial inability of many Bangladeshis to return home, the state minister said though there was a Welfare Fund it would not be much of a help as "We can't afford to bear the expenses for bringing all those Bangladeshis back." Saudi government is expected to make arrangements for sending them back, he added. He, however, did not confirm it.

"Most of them are overstayers, either they went with 'Umrah-visa' or lost validity of stay for job-hopping", said Mannan, adding that "If we could afford return of 28,000 people from United Arab Emirates last year. we have to bear the pain of current situation also.

While both the ministry and the embassy feel the urgency of arranging special flights by

Bangladesh Biman to expedite return of 10,000 Bangladeshis from Saudi Arabia, Biman is not in a position to do so due to its own constraints, sources pointed out. Two high officials of the na-

"It shows that those who borrowed comparatively larger amount became back soan defaulters," he said and noted that most of them are wilful defaulters who can repay, but don't.

"Some 95 per cent of the loan defaulters, if not 99 per cent, are wilful defaulters," the Bangladesh Bank governor said and blamed the country's 'teethless' laws for such a huge number of loan defaulters. "The situation has come to

such a point that the defaulters even tell the bankers 'you file case against me in the courts.' he pointed out.

Sarkar, however, blamed equally the bankers for the default culture, saying that they only considered the security against the loans which often misguided them. "But it should be kept in mind that security is not the only consideration, the man behind the security is the main thing."

He pointed out that like the economy, the banking sector is suffering from three diseases mismanagement, inefficiency and wasteful expenditure which, he cautioned, should be addressed without delay.

The governor said the bankers were asked to sanction loans keeping it in mind that they would have to recover the money. They also were asked to maintain accountability and transparency in their opera-

He also claimed that the government or the central bank is not influencing and giving any directive for sanctioning loans.

Sarkar's observation on the banking sector was supported by Khandaker Ibrahim Khaled. the outgoing Managing Director of Sonali Bank who has been transferred to the central bank as deputy governor.


