## Power supply in 21 south-western dists disrupted

From Staff Correspondent BARISAL, Oct 20: Power supply in 21 south-western districts of the country was disrupted as the 110-megawatt Goalpara plant in Khulna stopped power generation today due to technical faults.

According to sources in the PDB and the Barisal grid sub station, only 165 megawatt power was supplied till this evening against a demand for 340 megawatt. Only 12 megawatt power was supplied in 16 'feeders' during the evening peak hours against the demand for 38 megawatt in 6 districts under Barisal division. As a result, power supply in nine 'feeders' remained snapped at least for 3 hours under a rationing system.

# 300 children languish in jails

About 300 children are now in different jails across the country allegedly due to indifference of various government agencies and lack of facilities for juvenile confinement pre-

Jail sources said about 50 children, aged between nine and 15. were now staying at Dhaka Central Jail. They were arrested from different places in the city on various charges including theft, snatching and murder. Besides, some were also charged under the Arms and Explosives Act and the Women and Children Repression Act, 1995. Section 50 of the Children
