Indonesia buck up Brunei

JAKARTA, Oct 20: A senior Indonesian official has expressed hope that the next South East Asian Games in Brunei in 1999 will be much better than those which ended on Sunday in Jakarta, reports AFP.

The Games went as planned. I'm happy about it, but I hope that the next Games will be much better than what we did here." The Jakarta Post today quoted Coordinating Minister for People's Welfare Azwar Anas as saying after the closing ceremony.

Indonesia played host to the largest ever South East Asian Asian Games with 34 events in numerous venues — several of which were criticised for sub-standard conditions.

Sports and Youth Minister Hayono Isman apologised on the opening day for any inconvenience caused to the more than 4,300 athletes and hundreds of officials from the 10 countries in the region.

UNDATED, Oct 20 (Agencies): AC Milan were whistled off the pitch on Sunday after a humiliating 2-1 defeat to bottom club Lecce, plunging Italy's former giants back into crisis.

Champions Juventus were 5-0 winners at Bari while AS Roma drew 0-0 with Fiorentina, a day after Inter Milan made sure they stayed top by beating Napoli 2-0 away.

But the drama was all at San Siro, where struggling Milan went a goal down after just two minutes and were controversially a man down just four minutes later in a nightmare start for Fabio Capello's men.

Lecce, who had lost all five of their previous league games this season, scored through Dejan Govedarica and Milan's Miroslav Djordjevic was then dismissed for allegedly elbowing Stefano Cassio in the face.

But there more drama in the five long minutes of first-half injury time.

A foul by Milan goalkeeper Massimo Taibi earned Francesco Palmieri 47th minute penalty which the keeper managed to save. But two minutes later, another foul by Croatian Zvonimir Boban gave Casale the chance to make it 2-0 and the midfielder made no mistake.

In a tense, hostile atmosphere, match referee Massimo de Santis was escorted from the pitch by police at the break and missiles rained down on one of the linesmen.

Milan pulled one back in the 76th minute, when French winger Ibrahim Ba sent the ball into the middle and Lecce's Guadeloupe-born defender Jean Cyprien put the ball past his own keeper.

But the anger of the Milan fans could be heard loud and clear as the final whistle went, as their team suffered their third defeat in six league games.

Milan dropped to 13th in the 18-team league, just one point out of the relegation zone. The club has shown none of the consistency or verve it was famous for as it compiled four league titles in five years from 1991-96.

Air Force

hockey

JESSORE, Oct 20: The BAF base Zahirul Haque beat the hosts BAF base Matiur Rahman by a solitary goal in a match of the Bangladesh Air Force inter-base hockey championship here today, reports BSS.

In another match, the Air Headquarters Unit defeated the BAF base Bashar 5-3.

Juventus meanwhile needed help from Bari's Swedish midfielder Klas Ingesson, who tried to clear Alessandro del Piero's cross but sent the ball into his own net just before the break.

But it all became easy when Bari went down to 10 men with the sending off of defender Neogrouz in the 56th minute.

Frenchman Zinadine Zidane scored twice, Alessandro del Piero got a fourth in the 87th minute and Gian Paolo Maniglio scored an own goal at the end. Juventus moved into second place. Parma striker Enrico Chiesa scored his first league goal of the season and Dino Baggio scored a superb second — one touch to trap the ball and another to blast it into the top left corner from 22 yards — they overwhelmed Bologna.

The visitors were without Roberto Baggio, though, who was suspended after being sent off last time.

Elsewhere, Sampdoria finished the match with just eight

players but defeated Piacenza, who themselves had two men sent off, 3-1 with Sandro Tavolieri striking twice. The five explosions set a record for a Serie A match. Three games had seen four players sent off, most recently the Jan. 5 match between AC Parma and Juventus last season.

Serie A now takes two weeks off, with action resuming Nov. 1, because the Italian national team plays at Russia Oct. 29 in a playoff for a spot at next summer's World Cup finals.

GERMANY

Lady luck smiled on Kaiserslautern as they staved off a barnstorming Bayer Leverkusen to grab a 1-1 draw on Saturday to maintain their four-point lead over Bayern Munich, who likewise finished 1-1 in Karlsruhe.

European champions Borussia Dortmund just avoided their fifth consecutive loss with a goalless draw in a Ruhr derby against Duisburg.

The Frenchman, once a baseline specialist, has turned his game around this season and it was by rushing the net that he broke the 19-year-old Haas twice in the first set to win it 6-4 after 46 minutes.

At the start of the second set, it seemed Haas would fight his way back into the match as the Nick Bollettieri pupil led the local favourite 3-0. But Santoro broke back straight away and served for the match in the 10th game, which he won to love on his first match point.

Despite the loss, Haas, who beat Swede Thomas Enqvist and title-holder Yevgeny Kafelnikov on his way to the final, confirmed the fine form of Germany's young generation.

Earlier this month, his young compatriot, Nicolas Kiefer won his first career title in Toulouse.
