## China to help install 1.4 lakh phones, relocate industries

Visiting Chinese Vice Prime Minister Wu Bangguo yesterday expressed keen interest in providing assistance in installing 1,40,000 digital telephones in Bangladesh, reports BSS.

"China is keen to assist Bangladesh in the development of telecommunications sector through skilled and internationally reputed Chinese experts and companies," Wu said while Telecommunications Minister Mohammad Nasim called on him at Hotel Sheraton this afternoon.

Appreciating the government's development policies including measures for refurbishment of the telecommunications system, the Chinese leader said his country wants to participate in the development process of Bangladesh.
