EDINBURGH, Oct 24: The four-day Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) began today with a renewed pledge to make united and integrated thrust for promotion of democracy, the pursuit of prosperity through trade and development and the building of consensus among the member nations, reports BSS.

Head of the Commonwealth Queen Elizabeth II formally inaugurated the 54-nation meeting with a clarion call to work collectively for the future of our people and for the wider world.

This is the first time in 20 vears Britain has hosted a Commonwealth summit, and the first time in the queen's four-decade reign that she has

"The response is very poor so far. It seems that sufficient lands for resettlement of the slum dwellers may not be available."
