

ADELAIDE, Oct 27: Steve Waugh has criticised Australia's recent one-day performances under teammate Mark Taylor, the man he is expected to replace as limited-overs captain, reports AP. Taylor is under pressure to

retain his place in the one-day team with Waugh to lead an Australian side against the country's cricket academy graduates on Tuesday. Waugh said Australia would

be more aggressive in their batting and more desperate in the field if he took over from Taylor as captain. "We've had a disappointing time over the past 18 months

falling from the best one-day side to probably fifth or sixth, he said Monday. "That's not good enough for

Australia. We can probably be a little more aggressive and improvise a bit more while the fielding has not been as good as it has been.'

Taylor's omission from Tuesday's side has been seen as a strong indication that his international one-day career may be over. Australian selectors an-

nounced recently that they would start choosing separate teams for Test and one-day competitions. Australia were runners-up to

Sri Lanka at the 1996 World Cup but has been disappointing in one-day matches since then. Their limited-overs decline has come at the same time as a surge in their Test match record.

Praiseful S Korean coach

SEOUL, Oct 27: South Korean coach Cha Bum-Kun said today his players' "sweat and blood" had assured the country's fourth consecutive appearance at the World Cup finals in France next year, reports AFP.

"We were able to win the guarantee for the finals next year because of the players' sweat and blood," Cha said on returning from watching the 1-1 draw between Japan and United Arab Emirates (UAE) in Tokyo on Sunday.

South Korea have won five and drawn one of their six matches so far. But Cha also praised South Korea's fans. "The players'

morale was greatly lifted from the immense support they re-ceived from the fans," Cha said. Angry Japanese fans hurled of cans, bottles, eggs and even a portable chair at players and the coach taking them away from the national stadium after Sunday's draw, which severely dented Japan's chances of reaching the finals.
