WorldTel denies involvement

NEW DELHI, Oct 31: A television executive today dismissed allegations that he had agreed to pay a bribe to a senior Sri Lankan cricket official to secure match rights, reports AFP.

"We won a three-year deal from the Sri Lankan cricket authorities by guaranteeing the highest amount of money, not by paying bribes," Mark Mascaronhas, head of the US-based WorldTel Group, said.

Sri Lankan cricket chief Upali Dharmadasa last week charged an unnamed colleague of demanding 100,000 dollars from WorldTel to secure the TV rights for home matches.

Dharmadasa said he had taped evidence to show that 50,000 dollars had already been paid by WorldTel to the official. Mascaronhas, in a faxed message said: "I am shocked that my conversations with a man whom I consider my friend and business colleague were being recorded without my knowledge or consent."

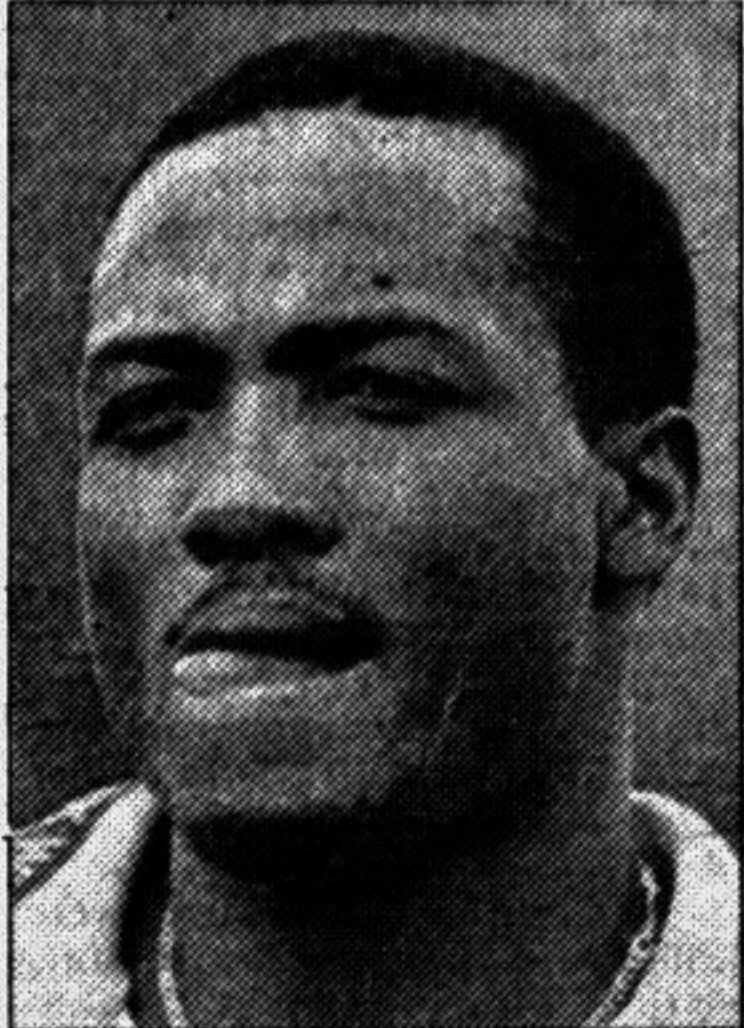

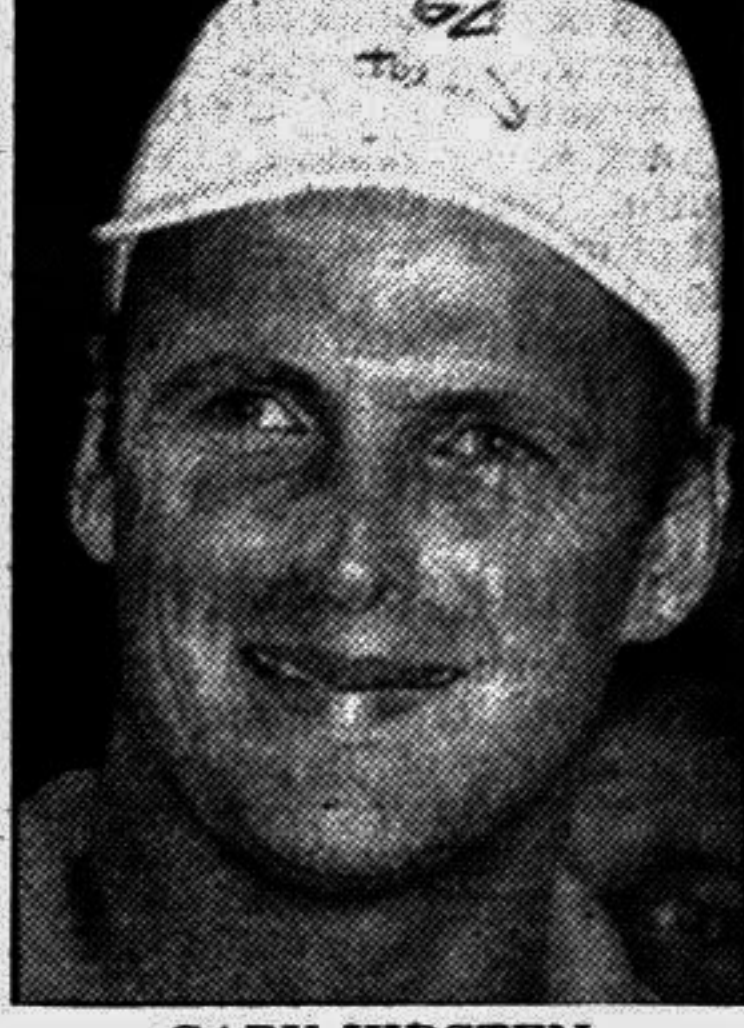

Slater hits century

NEWCASTLE, Australia, Oct 31: Former Australian Test opener Michael Slater batted out the first day for New South Wales state in a four-day cricket match against New Zealand on Friday, reports AP.

At stumps New South Wales were 281-3 with Slater unbeaten on 136, his first century of the season, and Michael Bevan on 48.

Earlier, Test captain Mark Taylor's bad luck continued when he was run out in a mixup with Slater for 17. Corey Richards was bowled by spinner Daniel Vettori for 21 and Mark Waugh was stumped for a hard-worked 44 just before the tea break.

Taylor, who won the toss and elected to bat, was run out after Slater played left-arm pacesman Shayne O'Connor to mid-on, called for a quick single, then sent his partner back.

Simon Doull's underarm throw hit the stumps from side on to leave New South Wales 281-1. Richards fell six minutes before lunch.

Slater had a life on 33 when he cut the last ball of Nathan Astle's first over straight to point where Chris Harris dropped an easy catch. He was dropped again on 88 when Craig McMillan put down a return catch.

New Zealand are yet to record a win on tour after two losses to Queensland and a washout against a second-string New South Wales side on Wednesday.

The New South Wales match is New Zealand's last tour outing before the first of three tests against Australia begins in Brisbane on November 7.

"I don't know why, but as soon as I reach the finish line, I suck my coach's blood from his finger and I feel refreshed," the official Antara news agency quoted Ruwiyati as saying.

Pete's sweet revenge

PARIS, Oct 31: (AP) — Pete Sampras' third round victory at the Paris Open was especially sweet for the world's No. 1 player.

In beating Petr Korda, Sampras defeated the player who stopped Sampras at the US Open this year. The loss not only stopped Sampras' chance of winning a third Grand Slam title this year, it also stopped Sampras from winning a third straight US Open title.

The US Open is close to Sampras. That is where he first gained his first major championship in 1990.

Sampras came out ahead this time over Korda, 4-6, 7-6, 6-4 to advance to the quarterfinals against Thomas Muster.

Korda had beaten Sampras at the US Open in five sets, an epic battle that lasted more than five hours due to rain interruptions.

Now indoors in Paris, it was a series of backhand and cross-court winners that was good and enjoyable tennis.

"The tennis we played was outstanding, some of the best tennis I played all year," Sampras said. "It was fun to watch."

Korda agreed.

"I wish I could have sat in the first row and watched this match," Korda said.

"The difference between Petr and I right now are a couple of points and I got them today," Sampras said. "The US Open was a great match." Korda said. "Today was a tremendous match. And he was the better player."

The difference came down to the third set after the players split the first two.

In the third set, Sampras finally converted a break point after missing his first 11 chances.

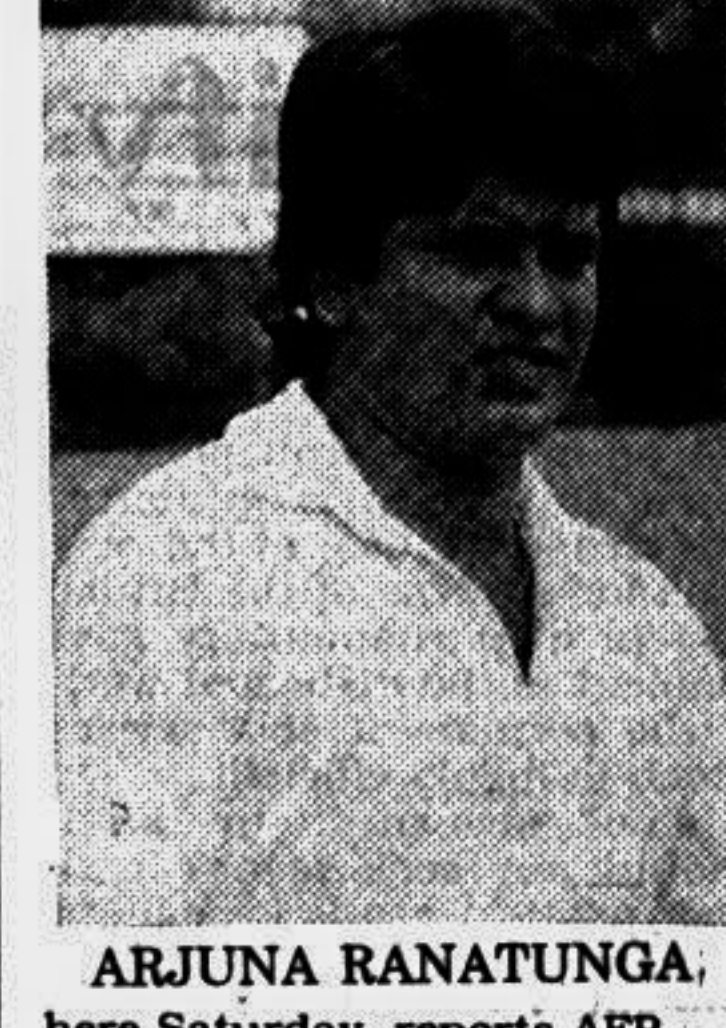

LAHORE, Oct 31: West Indies take on world champions Sri Lanka in the opening match of the quad-rangular cricket tournament here Saturday, reports AFP.

The tournament, being held to celebrate the 50 years of Pakistan's independence, will be played on league basis with the top two teams advancing to the November 8 final.

The hosts and South Africa are the other two contestants who will play each other on Sunday. All matches will be played under lights at the Gaddafi Stadium.

The Sri Lankans will be banking on their aggressive batsmen for a winning start. It was on this ground that they won the title of World Cup after beating Australia in last year's final.

West Indies forfeited their match against the islanders in the World Cup due to security fears in Colombo.

The two-time world champions will look to their pacers to not only put brakes on the stylish Lankans but to restrict them to a small total.

West Indies have a batting line-up that heavily depends on Brian Lara. The dapper Trinidadian has a reputation of being a match-winner with 4882 runs in 118 matches with 11 hundreds.

"We have a bit of everything,

some very good bowlers and exciting batsmen. It's a tough competition and we would like to have a winning start," West Indian manager Clive Lloyd said.

Both teams have met each other 28 times. The West Indies having a clear edge with 20 wins and the Lankans victorious on seven occasions.

Sri Lankan captain Arjuna Ranatunga is not bothered by these statistics.

"One-day cricket is all about how you play on the particular day. What has happened earlier is history and we will surely go for a winning start," he said on the eve of the encounter.

Three squares have been laid for the tournament and a full house crowd is expected to see the match.

Sri Lankans have a good record on the sub-continent's bat-favouring pitches. And with Sanath Jayasuriya and Aravinda de Silva in the lead they will look for a blazing start.

"We will try to put brakes on their aggressive batting and only through this we can seize the initiative," West Indian captain Courtney Walsh said.

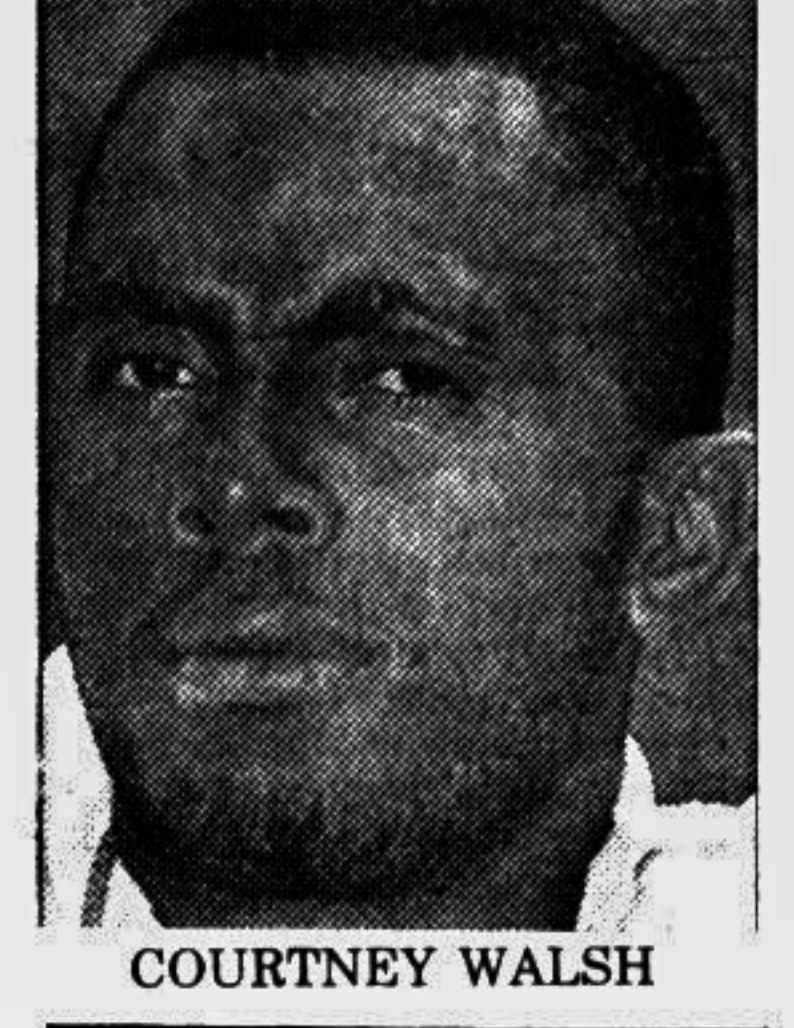
