issues for a resumption of formal talks with the Australian

Cricketers' Association (ACA). When it walked out on initial talks 12 days ago, the ACB said the ACA's claims went well beyond the role it saw for the players' body.

ACB chief executive Malcolm Speed said the board's agenda for new talks would define the areas it considered relevant to its relationship with the ACA.

Speed gave no indication the ACA would be allowed to reintroduce its own document seeking a formal workplace agreement if talks resumed late this week or early next week as he hoped. Speed acknowledged the ACB was making plans in case of a player strike. It is believed a one-day international is a likely target for a strike if the ACA feels it must resort to that action and there was newspaper speculation today the ACB could look to field a second-string team if its stars stood down.

That is likely to exclude

some of the decision-sharing

demands the ACA has made and

'I don't think it will come to that (a strike). I think it will be very sad day for cricket if the senior cricketers were to strike. I think they are more sensible than that ... but we are formulating a contingency plan in the meantime." Speed said.

There was, however, acknowledgment that the ACB could not avoid the formal structure of workplace talks which could also involve ACA consultants James Erskine and Graham Halbish, the former ACB chief executive.

"We probably now have no alternative but to deal with it formally and we are prepared to go down that path and for that reason we have put forward an agenda of issues," said Speed.

An ACA spokesman declined to comment on the ACB's bid for a resumption in talks until seeing the details Monday.

However, Erskine, a former regional head of the International Management Group, today indicated the ACA's document remained crucial to any settlement. "I can't see that the ACA is

going to go away from this Australian workplace agreement because that is very much the line they have taken and of course it gives the players a lot of protection with regards to their rights," Erskine said. He listed pay, regulation of

the playing demands on players, provision for holidays, a pension plan and an insurance plan among priorities for the ACA but the decision-sharing demands were also there to be discussed.
