Cyclonic storm turns into deep depression

The remains of Typhoon Linda brewing into a cyclonic storm on Wednesday turned into a deep depression yesterday, bringing temporary relief to the weathermen wearily

and in Chittagong yesterday. The deep depression was far from posing a threat to Bangladesh but required close watch on its movement, he said.

The maximum sustained wind within 48-km of the depression centre is about 50 kph. rising to 60 kph in gusts squalls. The Bay will remain moderate, the Met Office said in a bulletin at 10:45 pm.

The cyclonic storm over the East Central Bay remained practically stationary and weakened into a deep depression, centred at 9 pm yesterday about 750 km south-southwest of Chittagong Port and 670-km south-southwest of Cox's Bazar port. It is likely to move slowly

in a north westerly direction. If it maintains its course and gain strength once again, it may lash the south-western coast of Bangladesh before heading towards India.
