Pay scale revised with minimum 12 pc monetary benefit

The Cabinet yesterday decided that in case of fixation of salary under the new pay scale the government officials and employees will get a minimum 12 per cent monetary benefit over the salary drawn on June 30 this year.

An official handout said last night that the Cabinet in a meeting chaired by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at the cabinet room of the Jatiya Sangsad, partially modified its earlier decision and decided that the government employees and officials will be paid in cash instead of savings certificates their arrear salaries and

The parties will also hold demonstrations in divisional headquarters on the day. BNP Chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia who is also the Leader of Opposition in Parliament, announced the programme at a press conference at her Minto Road official residence in the city last night after

her return from Chittagong. Apprehending that the casu-alty from the incident might increase, she blamed the 'Awami League terrorists' for the attack on the rally held at the Chittagong outer stadium.

"Two persons were killed and over hundred people were injured", in the attack on the meeting convened under the auspices of All-Party Alliance on Chittagong Hill Tracts (APACHT), she claimed.

Ratio of girl/boy sex workers in city 3:2

The number of young boys as sex workers is not negligible in the city as a recent study found a girl/boy ratio of 3:2 among the child prostitutes.

Sponsored by Red Barnet. the Danish Save the Children. the study revealed that the boys aged around 13 were mainly working as the street-side commercial MSMs (male having sex with male) although their presence was not so prominent. Besides, the average age of entry in the sex market have been found around 13

years for girls and 12 for boys. Incidin, a private research organisation, conducted the study titled, 'Misplaced Childhood: A Short Study on the Street Child Prostitutes in Dhaka City.' The study was carried on 298 street child prostitutes in 11 areas of the city.

By Staff Correspondent sioned Incidin to carry out the study as it felt that the extent of child prostitution was quite alarming which represented the main features of child prostitu-

tion in the country. During a dissemination session held in the city yesterday. the three-member research team disclosed the objectives of the study that included problems of sexually abused children, sexual behaviour and attitude, and evaluation of the awareness level of the child prostitutes about STDs and AIDS as well as the concept of

According to the study. nearly 70 per cent of the children presently engaged in selling sex in the city streets migrated from different districts of the country.

Model National Law on Refugees proposed

The two-day Fourth Regional Consultation on Refugee and Migratory Movements in South Asia' concluded here yesterday with adoption of a Model National Law on Refugees'

The Model Law suggested appointment of a Commissioner for Refugees and a three-member 'Refugee Committee' in each country. The Refugee Committee would comprise a sitting or retired High Court judge designated by the government in


consultation with the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court as Chairperson and two independent members conversant with refugee matters. The conference was a follow-

up of similar programmes held in previous years in Geneva, Colombo and New Delhi under the aegis of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR). The Dhaka conference brought together distinguished former government officials, judges, aca-

demics, NGO directors and journalists to discuss large scale human displacement in the region and the sufferings it causes to the people concerned.
The Model Law was drafted

by a five-member team headed by a former chief justice of India, P N Bhagwati. Adopting the Model Law, the Dhaka conference expressed the hope that the model would serve to guide and assist lawmakers and be attuned, as necessary, to take ac-See Page 15
