26 dev projects for women's welfare being implemented

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that a massive development programme is be-ing implemented through 26 development projects under the Women Affairs Directorate and the Jatiya Mahila Sangstha, reports BSS.

Replying to a question from Prof Panna Kaiser during the Prime Minister's question hour, Sheikh Hasina said the programmes include vocational training, loan giving project, creating awareness among women, creation of women organisations and financial assistance to distressed women and children.

The Prime Minister said 14 programmes out of the total 26 were aimed at providing train-ing on raising poultry, cattle raising, pisciculture, sewing, handicrafts, computer training to the distressed women living in rural and urban areas and giving them loans so that they could become self-reliant.

Besides, she said, provision of hostel facilities for working women at a minimum cost, setting up day-care centre for the children of working women and setting up exhibition centre in different districts, including Dhaka, for marketing the items produced by women, are also in the government plan.

Dinajpur Wheat Research Centre to be upgraded.

Agriculture Minister Begum Motia Chowdhury yesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that Dinajpur Wheat Research Centre would be upgraded to an institute for innovating temperature and saline-tolerant new varieties of wheat to boost wheat production if adequate fund is allocated, reports BSS.

Responding to a call attention notice of Awami League whip Mizanur Rahman, she said the government was determined to raise wheat production.

Motia Chowdhury said because of the facilitators role of the government, farmers had produced 15 lakh tons of wheat last year. She said the government under the leadership of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina had set wheat procurement price at Taka 8.70 per kg last year when the farmers re-

Education Minister ASHK Sadique informed the House that the government had transferred a total of 73 high officials more than once in 16 months since July 1 last year. reports BSS.



BTV would be the first to release the fantasy and action oriented TV-series among the South Asian countries.




Shankar prize winners: Mayna, Deep and Shamma.

ation. Behind the birth of the alliance was the concept of maximising benefits from South-South collaboration, articulated in the 20-year Programme of Action which was endorsed by 180 countries in Cairo, a Partners statement said.

"This is the first time that an international alliance has been formed specifically to expand and improve South-South collaboration in the fields of family planning and reproductive health," said Balla Musa Silla, Acting Executive Director

of the Partners Initiative. Sharing experiences has been at the core of the Partners agenda, which has been clearly defined by the leaders of Partners and its supporters, officials here said.

"One of the main objectives of the Partners Initiative is to facilitate and to coordinate the sharing of knowledge and capabilities between the countries," according to Dr Nabiha Gueddana of Tunisia, the Partners Chairperson. "The Partners concentrate essentially on the sectors in which they have been successful," she said of the Initiative. "At the same time they respond to the needs of the participating countries, thus allowing a beneficial technical

cooperation to take place." Health and Family Welfare Minister Salahuddin Yusuf, who represents Bangladesh on the Board, spoke of an "indepth planning exercise" with an effective collaboration be-

tween government and NGOs. "This, among other things, will identify and evaluate the areas of comparative advantages of the partner countries, and then identify who can learn from whom in what areas," he said. "We envisage that this partnership will accelerate the process of national capacity building within an international South-South framework."

Dr Nafis Sadik, the UNFPA Executive Director, in a statement said the initiative "brings together valuable experiences, initially from 10 developing countries, in such aspects as community participation, programme management, information, education and communication, and family planning. "Now the challenge is to share these experiences as an important input to the implementation of the Programme of Action and, in particular, towards adopting a more holistic approach to reproductive

health. The Dhaka meeting of the Partners Board, which follows similar meetings in Harare in 1995 and in Mexico City.in 1996, will also review progress made so far by this South-South initiative, and discuss the Secretariat's operational plan for 1997-99.

"The meeting will also provide an opportunity to review the activities undertaken by the Partners to promote a greater NGO-government collaboration in the implementation of broadened reproductive health

programmes that are sensitive to the health needs of women," said Silla.

"Partners is also about communication. And there's so much that needs to be communicated," he said. "To this effect, the Partners Secretariat serves as a central point for networking among Partners and for identifying opportunities for South-South exchanges and sources of financial sup-The Partners Secretariat,

based in Dhaka, began operation in September last year and is housed in the ICDDR,B complex. The Secretariat will be formally inaugurated by Partners Chairperson Dr Nabiha Gueddana and Minister Salahuddin Yusuf during the Dhaka Board meeting.

While the government has provided its offices, financial support comes from the partner countries, the Rockefeller Foundation, the UN Population Fund (UNFPA) and the World

During the Board meeting,

the New York-based Earth

Times Foundation, which publishes The Earth Times, will organise a "dialogue" in Dhaka to discuss building partnerships in communications for population and development. A number of field visits have also been planned to see Bangladesh population programme activities in parts of the country, including Matlab, a global reference for population success story.
