Report on BNP's list of political cases to be ready today

The reports on the merit of 'political cases' against BNP lawmakers, leaders and workers will be ready today. Home Minister Rafigul Islam told

newsmen yesterday. The reports reached the home ministry yesterday. When contacted, Post and

Telecommunications Minister Mohammad Nasim told this correspondent last night that he would receive the report from the Home Minister today and contact BNP leaders for discussion.

BNP had sent the list of 'political cases' to Nasim on Sunday. Nasim handed it over to the Home Minister the following day for scruttiny.

The list include cases against 19 BNP legislators, 52 other cases and 20 general diaries lodged with 13 thanas in the city against BNP leaders and workers since September 1.

10346 Bangladeshis return home from S Arabia

State Minister for Labour and Manpower M A Mannan yesterday told the House that about 10,346 Bangladeshis have returned home from Saudi Arabia as the Saudi government re-cently expelled foreign nationals illegally working in that country, reports BSS.

Replying to a question from BNP member Sarwar Zamal Nizam (Chittagong), the State Minister said from 1976 to 1997 a total of 9.21,271 Bangladeshi workers went to Saudi Arabia and 2,51,359 went to the United Arab Emirates.

JS condemns BNP for Ctg incident

The Jatiya Sangsad yesterday adopted a resolution condemning the "acts of terrorism, anarchy and indiscipline by the armed goons of BNP" centring the public meeting of the Leader of the Opposition in Chittagong on Tuesday.

The resolution, moved by Sheikh Fazlul Karim Selim of the ruling Awami League, also blamed the major opposition party for "attempting to achieve political interests vested through well-planned Chittagong incidents."

Earlier, the Jatiya Sangsad witnessed a 75-minute stormy general discussion on Tuesday's incidents in Chittagong. Key leaders of the Treasury bench and two Jatiya Party lawmak-

ers participated in it. During the discussion, the speakers accused the BNP of unleashing terrorism in the port city in a "pre-planned way and with an ill motive to create a new issue to disrupt peace". They also alleged that the BNP was acting as the "local agent" of Inter-Service Intelligence (ISI) of Pakistan and was "conspiring to foil the government's

Mystery shrouds Tuesday's incident

From Staff Correspondent CHITTAGONG, Nov 12: Mystery still shrouds the violence that marred the grand rally organised by the BNP-led Combined Opposition at the Outer Stadium here yesterday as the trouble could not be averted despite tight security measures taken by police earlier.

Police force were deployed at all important points in the surrounding areas of the Outer Stadium and checking of transports including cars had stated from 1:30 pm yesterday to prevent carrying of illegal arms to the meeting venue by any troublemonger.

Co Ltd - at the Dhaka Export Processing Zone (DEPZ) at Savar was severely damaged in a fire yesterday.

Two persons suffered minor injuries while most of the around 150 workers of the factory escaped unhurt. The injured were given first aid at the DEPZ medical centre.

The cause of the fire and the loss caused by it were yet to be ascertained.

According to witnesses, the fire broke out at about 1:15 pm. When fire fighters from Tongi and Mohammadpur arrived at the spot, at around 2:30 pm, columns of thick black smoke rising upto about 300 metres

were visible from miles away. As the fire broke out, other factories in the DEPZ asked their thousands of workers, mostly female, to leave the



A devastating fire broke out at a factory at DEPZ in Savar yesterday.
