Earlier, on Tuesday, the authorities demilitarised 25 sq km area in and around Dudukchhara, a tiny frontier hamlet in Khagrachhari district to facilitate arrival of the PCJSS 'high command' from their headquarters in Tripura

yesterday morning. But Hansadhaja Chakma re-

ceived an "urgent message" from Shantu Larma Friday night that he was 'indisposed' and would not be available for the meeting till November 25.

The dramatic developments took the authorities in Dhaka by surprise. They were all ready for the meeting scheduled at a state guest house in Dhaka which was expected to clinch an agreement to end the decadesold insurgency in the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT).

According to information received from the hills, Shantu declined to come to Dudukchhara until he received any communication from the authorities in Dhaka accepting his proposal for the meeting on November 25.

Some of his top 'lieutenants' had already arrived there, waiting for him. They included 'field commander' of the Shantibahini, Ushatan Talukder, Raktoutpal Chakma and Rupayan Dewan.

The sources said the authorities were preparing for an accord with the PCJSS, hoping to See Page 12 Col 3


