

A furious Pakistan Cricket-Board (PCB) chief executive Majid Khan has demanded that the team improve after losing a series against South Africa and failing in a recent four-nation tournament to mark Pakistan's golden jubilee.

The pace spearhead of Akram and Wagar Younis have passed their prime, the PCB chief commented as Pakistan failed to reach the one-day final won by South Africa after thrashing the world champions Sri Lanka.

With Wagar dropped for the first Test, the 30-year-old

Akram's abilities will be tested. "I take it as challenge and am confident that we will have a winning start to the series,"

Akram said. Akram has happy memories of the ground as he took seven wickets to guide Pakistan to an innings win over Sri Lanka in the only Test played at this

Pakistan and West Indies teams are geared up for the Test after their poor show in the four-nation tournament held in Lahore.

Pakistan suffered a rare 1-0 Test series defeat by South Africa, only their second home series loss in 26 years.

They then failed to qualify for the final of the golden ju-bilee tournament, when West Indies lost all their three matches.

"Test match cricket is altogether different ball game and we are well tuned up for the Test series. It will be a tough contest," West Indian manager Clive Lloyd promised.

West Indies gained enough batting practice in the drawn four-day game at Rawalpindi, opener Philo Wallace and middle-order batsman Carl Hooper hit centuries in that match. "Every player has a good

run-up to the Test and we have a very good batting side. Our final line-up will depend on the surface," Lloyd said. But Brian Lara will again be the linchpin in the West Indies

side and will be under pressure to give West Indies a good total. Pakistan's batting revolves around Saeed Anwer, Ijaz Ahmed and Inzamamul Haq.

Opener Saeed had a poor series

against South Africa.


HANOVER, Nov 16: Pete Sampras captured the ATP Tour World Championship for the fourth time Sunday, outclassing Yevgeny Kafelnikov 6-3, 6-2, 6-2 in a

one-sided final, reports AP. Sampras had a shaky start after dropping his serve in the opening game but he quickly picked up his game and simply overpowered Kafelnikov with a

full range of shots. The American became the first player to defend the title in the season-ending event since Ivan Lendl in 1987.

Sampras also won in 1991. 1994 and 1996 and his four victories in the tournament that brings the top eight players in the world gave him a share of the second place on the all-time list with lie Nastase Lendl has five titles.

Like in the three previous years he won the elite tournament. Sampras had lost a

Sampras, 26, was already assured of finishing as No 1 in the world for the fifth year in a row, a record he shares with Jimmy Connors. He leads the tour with eight titles this year, including Wimbledon and the Australian Open. The first set began erratically as both players dropped serve twice. Sampras gained the upper hand when Kafelnikov sent a forehand into the net to put the American one break up. Sampras served out the set

with a backhand winner. Kafelnikov, the 1996 French Open champion, again had to fight off two break points in the opening game of the second set. But in the third Sampras

wrong-footed the Russian repeatedly, gaining a break with a forehand return winner, a cross-court forehand and a forehand passing shot that left Kafelnikov staring in frustra-

From then no. Sampras was all over Kafelnikov, hitting winners from all over the court. He finished off the set with an

Kafelnikov, 23, dropped his serve again at the start of the third set to seal his fate.

Sampras finished with 16 aces to Kafelnikov's two, hit 46 winners to Kafelnikov's 13, and won 81 per cent of his firstserve points, 30 of 37. The match lasted one hour and 28

minutes. The Russian was playing his first final in three appearances in the event. He only qualified one week ago when he won the Kremlin Cup, his third title of the year. Kafelnikov missed three months after breaking a finger on his right hand just before the Australian Open.

Sampras has qualified for every ATP championship since 1990, the only time he failed to reach at least the semifinals. This was his fifth appearance in the championship match.

The American has now won

his last nine tournament finals

following a loss to Boris Becker in Stuttgart in October 1996. Sampras, who was 10 Grand Slam titles, won the 52nd tournament of his career.

He has now beaten Kafelnikov five times in a row, all in straight sets, and holds a 9-2 career edge.
