Mushtaq back in style

Tourists in thick soup



PESHAWAR, Pakistan, Nov 17: Pakistani leg-spinner Mushtaq Ahmed captured five wickets as West Indies were bowled out for a paltry 151 on the first day of the first cricket Test today, reports AFP.

Pakistan were 14 for one when light stopped play 17.3 overs before schedule. The tourists batted after winning the toss but had slumped to 29 for four at lunch. The last three wickets added 93 precious runs to restore a little credibility.

David Williams top-scored with 31 and Curtly Ambrose made 30. Leg-spinner Mushtaq Ahmed, who missed the four-nation-jubilee cup with leg injury, finished with five for 35, his eighth five-wicket haul in Test cricket.

The start was delayed by 30 minutes as overnight dew made the outfield wet. When play finally got going West Indies suffered a disastrous start, losing opener Stuart Williams and Shivnarine Chanderpaul in the

boundaries and a six. David Williams and Ian Bishop added 48 invaluable runs for the eighth wicket in the highest stand of the innings. David occupied the crease for 99 minutes.

Bishop then helped Ambrose add 23 for the ninth wicket, making 20 including two fours. Ambrose hit three fours and two towering sixes in his 45-ball innings.

But despite the bowlers' valiant efforts the innings was wrapped up in the 61st over. Azhar Mahmood and Shahid Nazir took two wickets apiece while Wasim Akram took one.

"We bowled well and now it's up to the batsmen to help us gain a good lead," said Pakistani coach Haroon Rasheed. Pakistan lost opener Amir Sohail in the fourth over, caught in the slips by Lara off Courtney Walsh for four. Saeed Anwar on 10 and Ijaz Ahmed, still to get off the mark, were at the crease at stumps.

Both Pakistan and West Indies played three seamers and two spinners.

Local boy off-spinner Arshad Khan earned his Pakistan cap while leg-spinner Rawi Lewis made his debut for West Indies.

Worse was to come when Brian Lara played an uppish shot off Wasim Akram and was caught in the gully by Mushtaq

for three, leaving the tourists reeling at three for 16. Sherwin Campbell and Carl Hooper survived some anxious moments but on the stroke of lunch Mushtaq trapped Campbell in front of the wicket for 15.

Mushtaq snapped up three more wickets with the addition of 29 runs after the break. He bowled Phil Simmons for one, deceived Carl Hooper (26) with a flipper and bowled debutant Rawi Lewis for four.

Hooper's 26 included four

Victoria knock Kiwis out

MELBOURNE, Nov 17: New Zealand slumped to another top defeat here today going down by five wickets to Victoria in a rain-shortened match just three days before the second cricket Test against Australia in Perth, reports AFP.

Victoria, playing without Test bowlers Shane Warne and Paul Reiffel, beat the Kiwis inside three days of the scheduled four-day match, after the entire opening day was lost to rain.

Chasing 83 to win in their second innings, Victoria were cruising at 69 for one before left-arm spinner Daniel Vettori claimed four wickets in 23 balls.

The Victorians got home on the back of an unbeaten 34 from veteran Dean Jones and a 34 from Test opener Matthew Elliott.

Earlier, Victoria bowled New Zealand out for 173 in their second innings, with David Saker finishing with 6-39 and match figures of 10-66.

New Zealand remain winless on their Australian tour, following on from their 186-run defeat in the first Brisbane Test last week and innings defeats to Queensland and New South Wales.

New Zealand resumed Monday at 147 for seven in their second innings, an overall lead of just 56, but the tail offered little resistance.

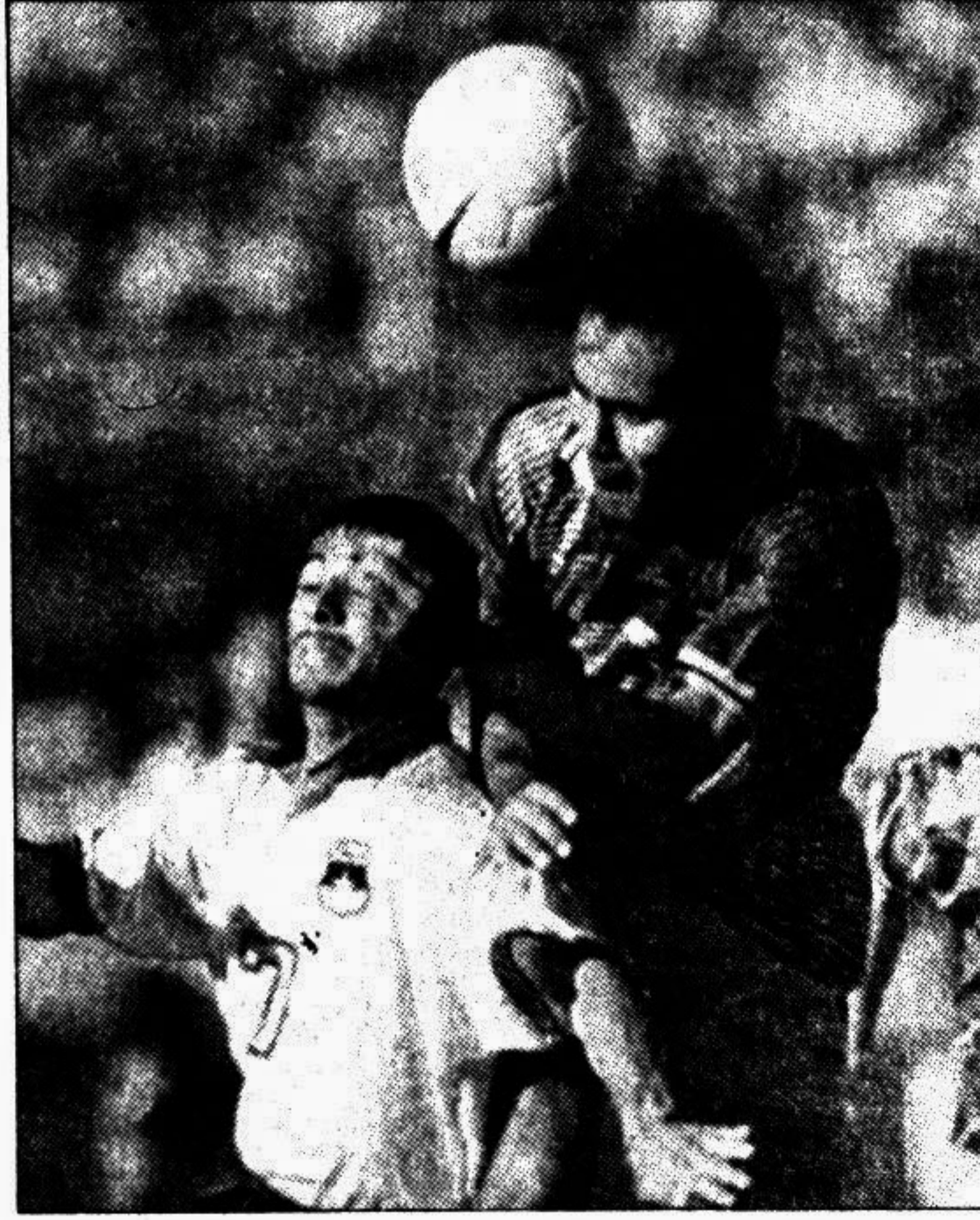
Chile pip Peru at the post

RIO DE JANEIRO, Nov 17: Chile overcame nine-man Bolivia 3-0 on Sunday to qualify for their first World Cup since 1982, edging out Peru on goal difference as they claimed South America's last place in France, reports Reuters.

Peru, who have also not qualified since 1982, finished

soccer humiliation. Argentina, who lost 5-0 at home to Colombia in a qualifying game four years ago, had hoped to win by a similar scoreline on Sunday to wipe out their painful memories but had to be satisfied with a 1-1 draw in Buenos Aires.

Chile's win before a 75,000 crowd in Santiago was greeted with wild celebrations, which included air force planes flying low over the stadium after the

injury — but progress was smooth compared to troubles in previous competitions.

Chile were banned from qualifiers for last World Cup following an incident when the team abandoned a 1989 game against Brazil in Rio de Janeiro, claiming that goalkeeper Roberto Rojas had been hit by a firecracker thrown from the crowd.

Soccer's governing body FIFA judged the firecracker did not hit the goalkeeper and that Rojas had leaped his injury.

In 1973, Chile benefitted from a controversy when the then Soviet Union refused to play in Santiago's National Stadium, claiming it had been used to torture political prisoners. Chile were awarded a walkover and qualified for the finals in West Germany.

The top four teams in the region's single group qualified for France and Argentina, Paraguay and Colombia had already guaranteed three of the places before Sunday's matches. Chile were hot favorites to take the last place because of their goal difference and Bolivia's poor away record, which diminished interest for Peru's meeting with Paraguay.

Only 25,000 people saw Peru overcome Paraguay with a first-half goal by Jorge Soto.

Argentine-born striker Ariel Graziani scored a hat-trick for Ecuador, who have never played in the qualifiers, but his efforts could not save his team from defeat against opponents, who, like Bolivia, had already been eliminated.

Marcelo Saralegui and Carlos Aguilera scored twice apiece for the once might Uruguayans, who will miss out for the fourth time in the last six competitions.

Reggae time in Jamaica

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Nov 17: Jamaica made soccer history on Sunday by drawing 0-0 with Mexico to become the first English-speaking Caribbean country ever to qualify for the World Cup finals, reports Reuters.

The government declared today a national holiday in celebration of the achievement.

Prime Minister P.J. Patterson made the announcement on national television after the match, saying government offices and schools would close to mark the team's triumph.

He promised a fitting national celebration would be held at a later date.

Team members have already been promised land and low-cost loans to build their own homes.

Patterson called the result, "undoubtedly the greatest day in Jamaica's sporting history."

The island needed only a draw to be sure of reaching the finals in France next year but in the end they could have lost to fellow finalists Mexico and still qualified.

Their only rivals were El Salvador and a 4-2 defeat in Boston by the United States who had already qualified as the CONCACAF runners-up, ended Central America's hopes.

The 33,000 capacity crowd at Kingston's National Stadium began chanting "France, France" some seven minutes before the final whistle, but the spontaneous celebrations afterwards were, at least initially

Jamaicans hope against hope?

LONDON, Nov 17: After clinching a World Cup place for the first time, Jamaica want to play England at Wembley but the English look like saying 'No', reports AP.

Jamaican Football Association president Horace Burrell asked British Sports Minister Tony Banks to try and set up a warm-up match before the June 10-July 12 finals in France.

England, who also qualified, plan five warm-up games but the English FA said Monday it so far has no room for Jamaica.

Coach Glenn Hoddge's team beat Cameroon 2-0 in an exhibition on Saturday, reportedly wants to arrange a game against Argentina in February and there is speculation in the United States that the US team, which also has qualified, may host England in Washington in March or April.

A first ever game against England would be a major boost for the sport in Jamaica, whose team has four English-based players — Wimbledon's Robbie Earle, Derby's Dean Burton and Paul Hall and Fitzroy Simpson from Portsmouth.

Only two Caribbean nations had previously qualified for the World Cup — Cuba in 1934 and Haiti 40 years later.
