Chile's win before a 75,000 crowd in Santiago was greeted with wild celebrations, which included air force planes flying low over the stadium after the



hit by a firecracker thrown from the crowd. Soccer's governing body FIFA judged the firecracker did not hit the goalkeeper and that Rojas had leigned his injury.



England would be a major boost for the sport in Jamaica, whose team has four English-based players - Wimbledon's Robbie Earle, Derby's Deon Burton and Paul Hall and Fitzroy Simpson from Portsmouth.
