fers of the remaining two companies — Unocal and Midland were not "complete," the sources said. The two participants also expressed their surprise at the sudden withdrawal of their competitors, they added.

Officials of the Power Cell were depressed yesterday following the sudden development. The Power Cell was created two years ago to deal with private power generation in the coun-

The sources said that these withdrawals were consequences of "illogical" delay by the Energy Ministry and the Bangladesh Power Develop ment Board in finalising the bidding for the 350 mw Haripur plant and the 300 mw to 450 mw Meghnaghat Power Plant.

I turned down Maj Rashid's request, PW-41 tells court

Major Khandaker Abdur Rashid tried to involve the 16 East Bengal Regiment posted at Joydevpur in the August 15 incident, said a prosecution witness in Bangabandhu Murder Case yesterday, reports UNB.

The 41st prosecution witness of the case. Brig Shahjahan, told the court that Major Rashid requested and even insisted him to go to New Airport with his troops by road march for night training.

"We were in training at Joydevpur, but we didn't have any permission for road march so I turned down his request," said the PW who was then a Major and the acting Commanding Officer of the 16 East Bengal Regiment in the absence of CO Lt Col Chowdhury Khalequz-

He said Major Rashid, during the ambush demonstration of 16 East Bengal at Joydevpur. requested him first at 11 am on August 14 to go to New Airport by road march for night train-

The witness said as per directives of the 46 Brigade he organised an ambush demonstration near Joydevpur Machine Tools Factory on August 14 morning. The demonstration began at 8 am and continued till 11 am, he said.

Deputy Chief of Army Staff Major General Ziaur Rahman CGS Brig Khaled Mosharraf and officers and JCOs of 46 Brigade with its Commander Col Shafat Jamil were present to witness

After the demonstration, the witness said, Major Rashid, the then CO of 2 Field Artillery, requested him at a tea party to go to the New Airport. "As I refused. Rashid started insisting


