Cheques for Tk 3 cr given to 66 employees

Cheques for taka three crore have been given to 66 journalists, officials, employees and press workers of **Bainik, Bangla and The Bangladesh Times**, the two newspapers of Times-Bangla Trust, reports UNB.

State Minister for Information Prof Abu Sayeed yesterday handed over the cheques to the newspaper staff who tendered resignation voluntarily, said a PID handout.

Information Secretary M Akmal Hossain was present at the cheque handing over function, held at the Information Ministry conference room.

Steps underway to reorganise police deptt: IGP

Newly appointed Inspector General of Police (IGP) Mohammad Ismail Hussain has said effective steps are underway to reorganise the police department to turn it into a service-oriented institution.

"Police is not a force, but a service," he said in an interview with BSS at his office after taking over his new assignment.

Hussain said the police is an old organisation but it was developed by the colonial rulers to serve their own interest which framed the parochial mindset among the policemen. "To change the attitude of police towards the people and the mindset of people towards police, we have taken many effective measures to modernise the service and equip the department with weapons and vehicles," he said.

From now on, only SSC passed youths will be recruited as constables to attain the government objectives, the IGP said. Previously, only class-eight pass boys were recruited as constables.

Asked about the frequent allegations of human rights violation by policemen, he said, "Police is always conscious about human rights" under the charter of the United Nations as well as the country's constitution.

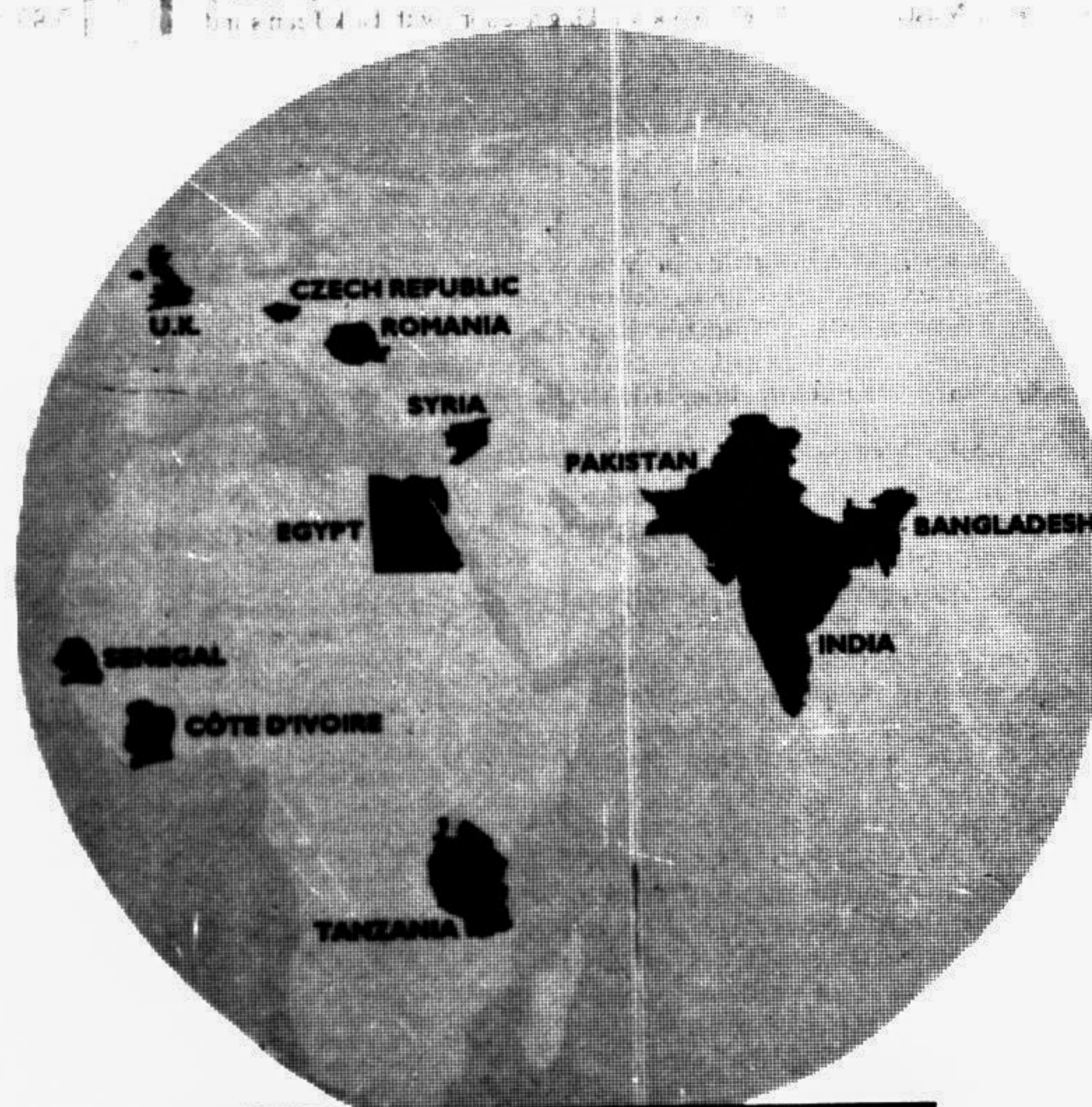
