

Revolver seized, 4 held in N'ganj

Police in a raid arrested four armed youths and recovered one revolver with four rounds of bullet from Nimtoli red light area of Narayanganj early yesterday, reports BSS.

Acting on a tip-off, the police raided the house of a prostitute and arrested Anwar Hossen, 25, Mizanur Rahman, 27, Shohel, 23, and Tipu Sultan, 28 and recovered the revolver from Anwar Hossen, police sources said. They were taken into custody for interrogation.

A case has been registered with Narayanganj police in this connection.

Call to free campuses from politicisation

National Professor M Innas Ali yesterday called upon the university authorities to take steps to free their campuses from politicisation of the faculty members and students as well as violence and lawlessness for enhancing the standard and quality of higher education, reports BSS.

The noted scientist observed that terrorism has gripped the campuses in such away that sometimes the universities become battlefields and the routine speeches and statements of political cadres against such incidents bear no fruit.

All vice-chancellors, national professor, eminent educationists and faculty members of different universities of the country are participating in the seminar.

Prof Innas Ali said, "The administration and management of the universities appear to be highly influenced by the political wings. The political parties use the student wings as musclemen in the political process."

"Violence and lawlessness have tarnished the glorious achievements of the students in the Language Movement and liberation struggle," he noted.

Recalling the appeals of President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed, Prof Ali said, "the president has made repeated appeals to the political parties to dismantle their student wings, cadres and maintain a conducive academic atmosphere on the campuses to save the posterity from ruination."


