

'Bill on offences against women, children politically motivated'

Human rights activists at a discussion on the Offences against Women, Children and Terrorism (Special Provisions) Bill, 1997 has said provisions in the proposed bill are self contradictory and politically motivated.

It is nothing more than the previous government's Anti-Terrorism Act, 1992, they observed.

The discussion was organised in the city recently by Ain-O-Salish Kendra, an NGO. Human rights activists from the Bangladesh National Women Association. Bangladesh Society for Enforcement of Human Rights. Bangladesh Legal Aid and Services Trust, Gano Shahajja Shangstha and the Odhikar participated in the discussion. The speakers included Advocate Zahirul Islam, Barrister Tania Amir and Dr Naila Khan.

The speakers expressed concern at the 'government's failure' to inform the people about the contents of the Bill.

They urged the government to hold public debates and consultations with human rights activists on any proposed law which is likely to have an impact on fundamental rights of citizens

They also demanded removal of certain provisions from the bill relating to terror-

EPB to formulate guidelines for issuing GSP certificates

The Export Promotion Bureau (EPB) has been asked to formulate the guidelines for issuing export certificates for readymade garments under the one and two stage transformations of the GSP, reports UNB.

The directive was given from a meeting of the Advisory Committee on Commerce and Industries, in the city yesterday with committee chairman and Commerce and Industries Minister Tofael Ahmed in the chair.

The meeting stressed the need for utilising the opportunities created from the relaxation of the rules of origin clause of the Generalised System of Preference (GSP) by the European Commission.

The meeting decided that the EPB would formulate the guidelines on the issuance of export certificates in consultation with the Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) and the Bangladesh Knitwear Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BKMEA). The EPB will issue the export

certificates as early as possible. Besides, the pervious provision of issuing certificates under the three-stage transformation system will remain effective. The meeting hoped that the

steps would result in substantial increase in the exports of readymade garments and knitwears to the European Union countries, the largest market for Bangladesh.

Fast unto death Nirmal Sen's

An ambulance has been kept ready to shift him to hospital Earlier the Civil Surgeon, Dhaka sent his personal physician and another doctor to attend Sen.

Yesterday, he was also personally checked by State Minister for Health Dr Amanullah. He issued a prescription for him. Later his blood pressure became abnormal and the doctors advised him to the shifted to hospital, which he declined.

Until early afternoon he talked with his colleagues squatting on a mat. But he could not rise from his makeshift bed complaining of weakness. A stream of visitors contin-

ued to visit the noted columnist and a left-wing politician. The visitors included BNP leader Abdus Salam Talukder, Gano Forum president Dr Kama Hossain, CPB leader Mujahidul Islam Selim, Dilip Barua of Sammyabadi Dal and poet Shamsur Rahman, also a former chief editor of the Dainik Bangla.

They all expressed concern on his fast and urged the government to accept his demands.

He went on a fast pressing demand for payment of dues to the journalists and employees of the Dainik Bangla, Bichitra, Anando Bichitra and the Bangladesh Times, shut down by the government on October for privatisation. The government also asked

the journalists and employees of the publications to take voluntary retirement by October 30 and announced a package of Tk 24 crore to pay their dues. It has also extended the deadline for opting for retirement until November 30 in an announcement coinciding with Sen's fasting. But most of the journalists

and employees of the publications have so far declined to resign and demanded full payment of termination benefit.
