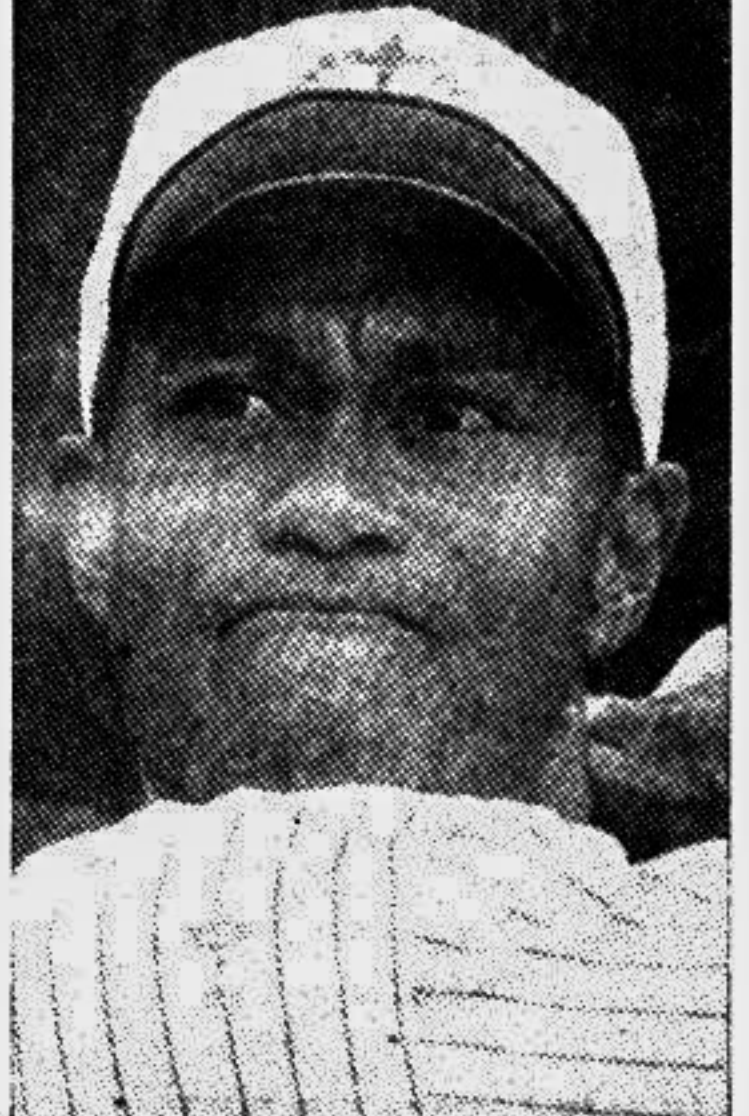

### ITF chief's greetings

GOTEBORG, Sweden, Dec 1: Brian Tobin, the Australian president of the International Tennis Federation (ITF), congratulated Sweden on their 1997 Davis Cup triumph here this weekend but admitted the competition was becoming difficult to manage, reports AFP.  
"We've not yet had the final figures for 1997 — but we are sure to break records. We will have had well in excess of 400,000 spectators and around 1,500 hours of television round the world," he said.  
"But the competition is growing — almost to the extent that it's becoming difficult to manage."  
"Next year we shall have 131 countries competing and there is no international team competition in any sport that has that type of depth."  
"This type of competition is unique and it's one of the greatest assets in tennis outside the Grand Slams. It is different and it has the national interest, enthusiasm and excitement."

# Pakistan thrive on twin tons

RAWALPINDI, Dec 1 (AP/AF): Dazzling centuries by Aamir Sohail and Inzamam-ul-Haq gave Pakistan an edge against wayward West Indies on a record-breaking third day of the second cricket Test at the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium.

Resting at the overnight total of 122 for two, Sohail and Inzamam combined in a best ever 323-run third wicket partnership against the Caribbeans as Pakistan finished the day at 403 for three, losing only one wicket.  
Stumps were drawn 12.3 overs early because of fading light. It gives Pakistan a useful lead of 100 runs to West Indies' first innings score of 303.  
Inzamam was undefeated on a marvelous 169 off 299 balls, hitting 19 fours and a six each

off Courtney Walsh and Franklin Rose. Mohammed Wasim was unbeaten on three.  
Sohail and Inzamam's enterprising stand lasted 372 minutes and bettered the previous best of a 303-run third wicket stand against West Indies, made by England's Michael Atherton and Robin Smith.

After a delayed start of 30 minutes because of an outfield damp with heavy overnight dew, the pair frustrated the tourists' four-man pace attack, spearheaded by Curtly Ambrose, for more than two sessions.  
Skipper Walsh brought the long awaited breakthrough shortly after tea. Sohail was spectacularly caught by substitute Phil Simmons, while running back from gully position and holding a two handed diving catch.  
Sohail's 160 was studded with 17 fours and a six. The left-handed opener faced 297 balls during his marathon 442 minutes stay at the wicket.  
Sohail, who last scored a Test hundred against Mark Taylor-led Australia in 1994 at Lahore, reached the three-figure mark when he lifted off-spinner Carl Hooper over mid-off for his 14th boundary just before lunch for his third Test hundred.

The West Indies were further frustrated when the batsmen thrashed their pace battery even with the second new ball in the second session. Ambrose bowled quite a few no-balls and Inzamam in particular played some delightful boundaries off him and balded Rose.

The 27-year-old Inzamam who until Monday had not scored a century at home despite achieving the three-figure mark five times abroad, finally got one when he steered Ian Bishop for a single to third man. He hit 10 fours during his maiden hundred in Pakistan off 210 balls and 277 minutes.

# David doing groundwork on Windies

KARACHI, Dec 1: England cricket coach David Lloyd arrived in Islamabad on November 28 to watch the second cricket Test between Pakistan and West Indies.

Lloyd's visit is a personal one with all expenses paid by the England Cricket Board (ECB). Lloyd is keen to watch the West Indies in action because England are to tour the Caribbean next year for a five-Test series. It is presumed that Lloyd would be making some notes about the West Indies which may help his team break the winning drought against the two-time former world champions.

The English team arrives in Lahore on Dec 2 on an eight-day practice tour before they leave for Sharjah for the Champions Trophy to be participated by Pakistan, India, West Indies.

Meanwhile, prior to the start of the Rawalpindi Test, Pakistan captain Wasim Akram had a short trip to London to consult with his surgeon who operated on his bowling shoulder earlier this summer.

"He told me it (shoulder) was progressing way ahead of time. He advised me about some exercise to be done for another two months which I will do with the assistance of Dr Dan Keisal (Pak physio). He said Akram on his arrival. He said the exercise were basically to further strengthen the muscles around the shoulder. "He has given me another appointment in April."

The star all-rounder said his specialist was very happy when he told him that at Peshawar he bowled for three hours. "He was delighted because he never anticipated that I would be able to do that so quickly. He has told me that I can continue bowling long spells without any fear."

### Krajicek lifts Real Masters

SAO PAULO, Brazil, Dec 1: Richard Krajicek defeated local favourite Gustavo Kuerten to win the 800,000 dollars Banco Real Masters title, the richest tennis tournament in South America, reports AP.  
Krajicek, No. 11 in the world, took 2 hours and 26 minutes, to beat the Brazilian 7-6, 6-7, 7-6.  
Kuerten, this year's French Open champion, appeared to be heading to victory, capturing the first three games of the final set, while the Dutchman appeared to give up.

"But Krajicek suddenly recovered his form and took the set to a tie break, which he won 7-1."

# Kiwis keep Aussies at bay

HOBART, Dec 1: New Zealand's last wicket pair of Simon Doull and Shane Waugh survived 64 balls to earn a draw and deprive Australia of a 3-0 clean sweep at Bellerive Oval on Monday, reports AP.

Cook dropped Doull off Shane Waugh with 39 balls remaining. New Zealand finished on 223 for nine, chasing 288 for victory, as the last pair batted out 38 minutes on a turning pitch.

The visitors made a flying start to their run chase, which started when Australia declared on 138 for two at lunch.  
Opener Matt Horne (31) and Nathan Aslie (40) raced to 72, including the first 50 off 31 balls, before the initial setback.

Once Horne was trapped leg before wicket by medium pacerman Paul Reiffel panic set in. From a well set 93 for one, the Kiwis lost their way losing 3-2 in 13 balls, two of them to Waugh, who finished with 5-88.

New Zealand, reduced to 152 for six soon after tea, recovered to 218 for six thanks to some energetic batting by Adam Parore and Roger Twose.  
Twose backed up too far at the bowler's end and was run out by Taylor-Steve Waugh combination.

Soon after he was followed by Parore who fell to a brilliant outfield catch by Matthew Elliott at backward square leg.  
Australia won the first Test in Brisbane by 186 runs and followed it with an innings and 70-run win in Perth.

It was Australia's eighth straight series win under Mark Taylor since he took over from Allan Border in 1994.  
Taylor, dumped from the one-day squad, has led his country to series win over West Indies and England (twice), Pakistan, South Africa, Sri Lanka and now New Zealand in 36 Tests.

Taylor, who scored a century in the first Test, was voted man-of-the-series while Blewett, who scored 56 in the second innings to add to the first innings 99, was named man-of-the-match.  
Australia have drawn only five Tests during this period while losing a one-off Test to India last year in the subcontinent.

It was Waugh's 12th five-wicket haul in 61 Tests and his first in the series. He finished with 19 wickets at an average of 25.05.  
Taylor said he made a conscious decision not to let New Zealand win easily.  
"It was never going to be 50-50. I always wanted it to be 70-30 in our favour," Taylor said.

"They haven't bowled us out twice in this series I couldn't see why we should let them win easily. I am still happy with the final result although we were just a wicket away from making it 3-0."

New Zealand skipper Stephen Fleming felt the target was "pretty steep."  
"Whatever the target was we were going to chase. But I am glad we didn't lose at the end," said Fleming, who was out for nought in both innings.

"I thought 260-270 would have been a reasonable target, but then probably we were too optimistic."  
This was the only first-class game New Zealand did well not to lose on their tour.  
"I thought we handled the chase well initially until we lost too many wickets," Fleming lamented.

McGrath, who bowled on Saturday for the first time in three weeks was cleared by his surgeon. A hernia complication forced him to rest a groin strain after the first Test in Brisbane.  
Victorian Ian Harvey gets a call up after an impressive two years with Australia A.

Tasmanian Michael Di Venuto, expected to open the batting with Mark Waugh, toured South Africa earlier this year as one of the three replacements for the seven one-dayers.  
"It is a time of experimentation," said Steve Waugh. "We'll know in 12 months time whether that philosophy is right or we've been proven wrong."  
"At this stage it is worth the try. It was time for bit of a change."

mind not to open against Pakistan at the SSC ground. That move, however, was to upset the game plans of Pakistan and not a regular arrangement of the tournament. The need, however, never arose, for India did not get to bat in that rain-ridden contest.

The reason why Tendulkar is being asked not to open is the fact that the team gets demoralised and the opposition gains an edge once he gets out cheaply. The captain, however, disagrees with this opinion because he quickly points out the talent available in the shape of Saurav Ganguly and Rahul Dravid and the experience of Mohammad Azharuddin.

The argument that the team tends to play below potential if Tendulkar gets out cheaply may not be accepted by many but then the selectors have almost reached a conclusion that he would be better off at number four.

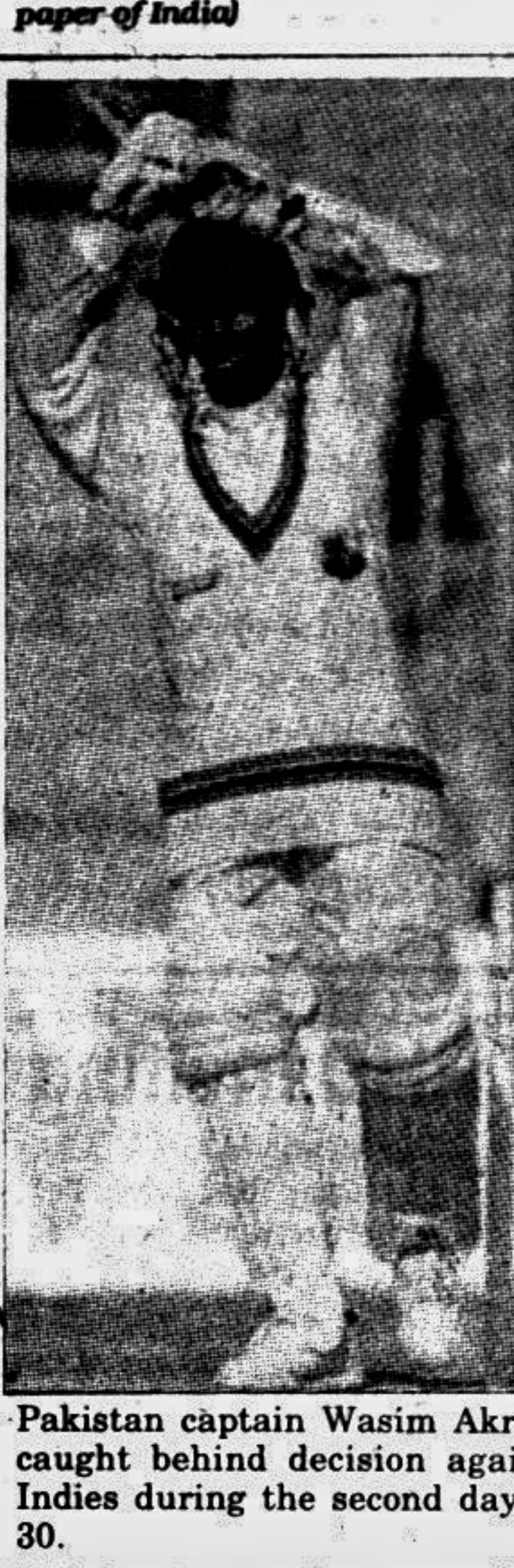
The selectors are concerned at the manner in which he had been getting out in the one-dayers, often playing some ill-advised strokes. Sometime back, Tendulkar had noted that the shots looked ill-advised only when he did not connect them. Whether he should play his strokes can be debated but for the present, the selectors would like him to concentrate on his batting in the middle.

The thinking is that even a subdued Tendulkar bats at a pace faster than an average international opener in a one-day match. It is this tendency of Tendulkar to play some indiscreet shots that has caused worry among the selectors. Who felt that the Indian captain, with the array of strokes at his disposal, is well-suited to take charge of the situation even when there are no fielding restrictions.

Among the alternatives for the opener's slot are Rahul

Dravid and Ajay Jadeja. Tendulkar's one-day record as opener after being appointed captain reads: 1556 runs in 48 matches at an average of 36.18 with four centuries and eight half centuries.
